- * acting as the regions arts advocate by actively participating in community cultural development initiatives
- * offering informed commentary and developing public awareness of cultural issues, needs and services
- * providing a resource centre for its members and the regional community

As a community resource, the Council is the first point of contact at the local level for information on the arts. We play a vital role in creating opportunities for the participation and involvement of individuals in the creative life of their community.

Our service to the regional arts community provides direct support to our member groups, by creating a focal point for networking, joint promotions and initiatives.

These services are made available through the organization and delivery of a range of activities and ongoing programs. From exhibition and presentation opportunities to professional development for artists, the promotion of local cultural activities and the dissemination of arts event information, as well as the sponsorship of special events, community festivals and arts training and education programs.

An HISTORICAL RESOURCE

The Community Arts Council of Coquittam, Port Moody, Port Coquittam, Anmore and Belcarra was first established in 1969 as the Coquittam Area Fine Arts Council. It was renamed the ARC Arts Council in 1992 to reflect the Councils role as an Arts Resource Centre working to promote arts and cultural activities that fulfill the needs of the communities constituting School District 43. As a registered charitable non-profit organization, the work of the Arts Council Is performed by its members on a volunteer basis through a Board of Directors and managed by an Executive Director. Funding is provided by the Government of British Columbia, municipal grants, fundraising, memberships and donations.
