I. MINUTES OF OCTOBER 15TH MEETING

The Minutes were approved as distributed.

II. FUNDING REQUESTS -- ADVENTURE PLAYGROUNDS

For the benefit of new Committee reps from Council an overview was given on the background to the tripartite adventure playground funding agreement. This agreement had been instituted to ensure that funding was coordinated between the school district and municipality with the maximum contribution of each party of \$3500. Total budget amount of \$15,000 for each budget year for the school district and municipality. In this way parent groups would not lobby and whipsaw between councils and the school district for funding requests. The parent group's contribution in many cases far exceeds their required contribution of \$3500.

Funding requests had been received from three elementary schools -- Mundy Road, Miller Park, and Panorama Heights.

ROBINSON/WILSON moved that a recommendation be made to Council and Board of School Trustees for contributions towards the development of adventure playgrounds at Mundy Road and Miller Park elementary schools and that funding for Panorama Heights be deferred until staff has reviewed the site for an appropriate location.

III. GLEN PARK/SCHOOL PARKING LOT

The Glen School parking lot is now operational and is functioning well. Concern was expressed that the parking lot may be used for permanent parking by residents living in the townhouses adjoining school property.

COUNCIL ACTION REQUIRED ALS. 243 REID/ROBINSON moved that appropriate signage be installed immediately at the parking lot prohibiting overnight parking and providing adequate restrictions so that the parking lot is only available for school and park users.

The Glen parent group requested that the development of Glen Park occur in conjunction with the school district. The Committee felt that this request is somewhat premature as a master plan has to be refined. It was agreed that a round table discussion with the public was required, but without creating an expectation. Public involvement in some aspects of the work in the park may be desirable. It was agreed that a round table discussion on the development of Glen Park take place with the public and Liaison Committee this spring and it be so recommended to both Council and Board of School Trustees.

CENTENNIAL SCHOOL PARKING UPDATE

Centennial students have been assigned the use of the east end of the ice arena parking lot and it appears to be working reasonably well.

V. POTENTIAL JOINT DEVELOPMENTS

5.1 Plateau Elementary sites

Panorama Heights elementary has been completed and the school district is proceeding with the development of the east plateau elementary site, hoping that construction will take place this fall with occupancy being 1993/94.

Concern was expressed that under the option agreement the highest and best use will determine the value when the Board acquires the property. In many areas rezoning is being sought by the developer from residential to multi-family. This could cause an escalation in price to the school district in acquiring the next portion of land if the zoning requirements have been up-graded.

5.2 North East Coquitlam Elementary Sites

The school district is in the process of acquiring.

5.3 Plateau Middle

A request for funding has been submitted to the Ministry for the 1992/93 capital budget. We are hoping to acquire this site so that architects can be assigned for the development of a middle school.

5.4 Eagle Ridge Middle

The school district is hoping for funding to design and construct a school in the 1992/93 capital budget.

5.5 Plateau/Town Centre Secondary

Two separate secondary schools for grades 9 to 12 are needed. One property is already owned by the district located at Guildford and Lansdowne. For the second property the Board hopes to acquire some land in the Town Centre area for the potential joint development and use by the school district, Recreation Department, and Douglas College.

ITEM II - BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

1. Panorama Heights Home and School Association Capital Playground Equipment Financial Assistance Request

The meeting reviewed the undated letter from the Panorama Heights Home and School Association received by the District of Coquitlam's Park and Recreation Office on September 18, 1992, together with its attachment, and the Park and Recreation Director drew the Committee's attention to the attached photograph (II-I) that portrays the School District staff installing the base for one of the basketball backboards within the area where the adventure playground for the older students would be positioned.

EQUIRED:

That the Board of School Trustees and the Council of the District of Coquitlam each authorize a contribution in the amount of \$3,500 to facilitate the development of a joint school/park adventure playground on the Panorama Heights elementary school in concert with the sketch plan provided by the Panorama Heights Home and School Association and date stamp received by the Parks and Recreation Department on September 18, 1992.

2. Glen School/Park Public Meeting

The meeting was advised that the District of Coquitlam Council did not wish to hold a public meeting—at this time—on the future of the Glen School/Park site due to the difficulty in managing public expectations after such meetings; and, particularly, when a funding vehicle was not in place. After all is said and done, in such circumstances, more would be said than done.

ITEM III - NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Update on Westwood Plateau School Site Public Meeting held on September 29, 1992
 - Trustees Becker and Wilson informed the meeting that the residents who attended the Westwood Plateau School Site Public Meeting were extremely pleased with the results of joint Panorama School/Park project, and the citizens encouraged the Board to continue to strengthen such partnerlike ties with the Municipality. The Trustees also expressed their undisguised delight with Mr. Eric Tiessen's contribution to the meeting pertaining to the polemical question of school site purchases within the Westwood Plateau development.
- 2. Miller Park Parent Group Tot Lot Opening A Tripartite Funding Project

Councillor B. Robinson reported that on Wednesday, September 30, 1992, that he, in the presence of Mayor Sekora and Trustee Wilson, had turned over a District of Coquitlam cheque in the amount of \$3,500 to Mrs. Susan Morrison of the Miller Park Parent Group. Councillor Robinson further advised the meeting that this was a one-time outright grant to the Miller Park Parent Group to assist in funding a joint community/school play space for tiny tots of the school and the adjoining neighbourhood.

 West Plateau Joint School/Park Site - Utilizing a Portion of the B.C. Hydro 500 kv Right of Way

The Park and Recreation Director drew to the Committee's attention the coniferous forest stand on the eastern edge of the 500 kv Hydro Right of Way immediately south of the joint West School/Park site within the Westwood Plateau lands. The meeting learned that this coniferous stand would have to be destroyed if a combined baseball/soccer playing field complex was to be constructed beneath the 500 kv lines.

It was the staff's recommendation that a joint Municipal/School District Staff Committee be struck to investigate the possibility of transferring the playing field improvements scheduled to be constructed on the B.C. Hydro Right-of-Way, south of the West School site, to the Westwood Plateau Middle School land just east of the Scott Creek ravine.

That Council and the School Board authorize the establishment of a joint staff group to investigate and report back to the Liaison Committee on the feasibility of transferring the planned athletic facilities on the B.C. 4. Surplus S.D. Property

<u>Committee Action:</u> That this item be placed on the next agenda of the Municipal/School Board Liaison Committee Meeting.

5. New Town Centre Aquatic Complex

The District of Coquitlam group gave--in brief compass--an overview on the combined 50 m swimming pool and wave pool complex, together with its ancillary facilities. (See attached plan.)

ITEM IV - OTHER BUSINESS

1. Parkland Elementary School Adventure Playground Redevelopment

The Superintendent of School presented the meeting with a memorandum from Mrs. Joan Beck, Ass't Superintendent of Schools, recommending that the Liaison Committee give favourable considerable to financially assisting the redevelopment of the ageing Parkland joint community/school playground equipment and, further advised, that the parent group had raised \$20,000 towards this \$27,000 Adventure Playground Redevelopment project.

The Parks and Recreation Director also drew to the Committee's attention that, to date, the following neighbourhood/school projects had been recommended to receive subventions from the two respective \$15,000 budgets.







PANORAMA JOINT SCHOOL/PARK


PLAY SPACE (For Tiny Tots)








MILLER PARK ELEMENTARY JOINT MUNICIPAL/SCHOOL BOARD PLAY SPACE

Re.: Portables for Panorama Heights Elementary School

Further to your written request of 1992 09 16 to place three portable classrooms at the Panorama Heights Elementary School, please accept this letter as your authorization to proceed with the placement of three classroom portables on the "joint-use" parking lot located on the School District property, east of the school gymnasium.

This authorization is made on the condition that during the 1993 Easter school vacation break and during the 1993 summer school vacation break that the primary school parking lot remain open and available to the public wishing to use the Panorama Park facilities. Additionally, as a condition of this approval, the writer requests that teaching staff at the Panorama Elementary School be precluded from parking on the 12 remaining stalls within the east parking lot but, in turn, be issued permit parking passes which would allow them to park in the "Permit Parking Only" zone on Johnson St., contiguous to the school site an arrangement that is being worked on with our Engineering Department.

Suffice it to say, this office looks forward to the Panorama School gymnasium being freed up to facilitate parks and recreation community-based programs once the aforementioned three classroom portables are on site.

I trust that these conditions will be viewed as acceptable by senior management within the School District, and that the said portables will not be on site as at September 1993.



Study of lines risk alarms residents

A new study on the health risks of living near high-voltage power lines is worrying some Vancouver families.

"It is quite alarming for us to hear what these power lines can do to your health," said Patti Gilbertson, 36, who has two small children.

She and other Boundary Road residents are fighting B.C. Hydro over its refusal to bury the lines outside their homes.

"These towers are far too close to homes," said resident Hollis Barrow.

The study by Sweden's Karolinska Institute found that families, especially children, living within 45 metres (150 feet) of high-voltage overhead lines run double the normal risk of developing leukemia and other cancers

The study looked at 500,000 Swedes who between 1960 and 1985 lived within 275 metres (900 feet) of overhead lines.

Biophysicist Dr. Andrew Marino at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge said the Swedish study backs up other research.

"The risk is real," Marino said. "But power companies aren't going to spend the money on underground lines unless they are forced to."

Marino was a witness three years ago in Courtenay, when residents opposed B.C. Hydro's routing of high-voltage power lines near their homes.

B.C. Hydro official Kelly Gibney said the Boundary Road power lines have a small magnetic field, and there is "a big grey area" over how dangerous such lines are.
