At this point, the Council assembled for the general meeting.

The Finance Committee rose and reported on their deliberations at the meeting of their Committee immediately preceding.

#### Adoption of Minutes

750. Moved by Co. Clarke seconded by Co. Vallance:
That the Minutes of the Finance Committee of July 13th, 1965,
(Resolutions #749 - #749.B), be approved.

#### Carried.

As instructed by Council Minutes of July 5th, 1965, the Acting Clerk brought forth the bids received in the earlier part of the year for the Kelvin Street property. Mr. & Mrs. Stepp as well as W. J. Joyce were present at the meeting. The envelopes were circularized among Council members in order that the seals might be inspected. The bids were then opened and read as follows:-

W. J. Joyce - Tender \$276.00 - Cash & currency enclosed \$92.00

W. & G. Stepp - Tender \$1,050.00 - enclosed certified cheque. \$350.00

There followed the opening of bids, a series of statements made by each member of Council as to reasons why or why not the property should be sold at all, sold to Mr. Joyce or sold to Mr. & Mrs. Stepp.

Co. Filiatraulty registered opposition.

Mr. M. P. Stromgren appeared before Council on behalf of S & S Sand & Gravel Ltd. A letter dated July 12th, 1965, asking for permission to continue stockpiling on the west side of Pipeline Road in conjunction with the operation of S & S Gravel Ltd. to the end of May, 1966. Mr. Stromgren spoke on the question.

### S & S Gravel Co. Ltd. re Stockpiling

752. Moved by Co. Vallance seconded by Co. Butler:
That a letter be sent to S & S Gravel Ltd. informing that company that
they are to cease further stockpiling on the west side of Pipeline Road
as they are presently doing, and further stating that unless by October

Mr. D. Guggisberg appeared before Council to appeal the decision of Council denying him permission to move a house from Vancouver to 580 Harrison Avenue. Mr. Guggisberg stated that he had personally canvassed most of the owners in the neighbourhood of 580 Harrison Avenue, and out of those he had canvassed, none seemed violently opposed to his building being moved to that location.

Mr. A. Best attended the Council meeting to seek Council's support for Best Bros. Machinery Ltd. to acquire proper access to their property in D. L. 378 described as the former Miquelon-Chadwick property. A letter from Best Bros. Machinery Ltd. was read to Council The Acting Clerk presented a map to indicate the location of the property which showed that the only access available to the property was via a lane off the "ewdney Trunk Road. It was seen that the lane served as access to only a portion of the property that being and lying north of the B. C. Hydro Right-of-Way. It was pointed out, that the B. C. Hydro owned a strip of land dividing the two parcels now owned by Best Bros. Machinery.

### Best Bros. Machinery re Access to Property D. L. 378

754. Moved by Co. Clarke seconded by Co. Vallance:
That Best Bros. Machinery Ltd. be asked to negotiate with the City of
Port Coquitlam for access through their land, since there appeared to
be no way Council could assist them short of a level grade crossing
across the C. P. R. TRACKS.

#### Carried.

Mr. A. Best also appeared on behalf of Best Bros. Machinery Ltd. to state that it was the intention of the Company to conduct a sanitary land fill upon their land recently acquired in D. L. 378. He went on to state that his Company looked forward to discuss with the Municipality and the City of Port Coquitlam the possibility of being of service to them in regard to garbage disposal.

#### Best Bros. Machinery re Garbage Disposal

755. Moved by Co. Clarke seconded by Co. Filiatrault:

That Best Bros. Machinery Ltd. and any offer that they may have with respect to offering services to the Municipality for disposal of garbage, and the question of the use of any property in the Municipality as a garbage disposal site, be referred to the Sanitation Committee.

#### Carried.

A spokesman for Pacific Petroleums Ltd., present at the meeting, inquired of what the next requirements would be with regard to their application to have rezoned the property situated at the northeast corner of Poirier Street and Austin Avenue from residential low density to service station residential. It was pointed out, that the Advisory Planning Commission Minutes of July 8th, 1965, agreed in principle with the proposed rezoned. It was also pointed out, that the Commission required detailed plans of the proposed site development and the proposed structures to be presented to them, at which time the Commission would give further consideration to the application for rezoning.

#### Pacific Petroleum Ltd. Rezoning - N. E. Corner Poirier & Austin

756. Moved by Co. Butler seconded by Co. Clarke:

That the application by Pacific Petroleum Ltd. for the rezoning of the property situated at the northeast corner of Poirier Street and Austin Avenue from residential low density to service station residential, be left in the hands of the Advisory Planning Commission for treatment in accordance with their Resolution #636.

Mr. & Mrs. Throssell of Mathewson Road attended the meeting as a delegation to complain the decision of officials that they be required to pay for a culvert to their property. They stated that by reason of a recent subdivision of their land, a culvert servicing their home prior to subdivision was now situated as as to serve the lot which they had subdivided from the property and sold. When recently they had made application for a culvert to be installed on the property that remained in their name, they were advised that a payment would have to be made.

His Worship reported having received an inquiry which indicated an interest to locate a lumber yard on a municipally owned tract of land consisting of a number of 33' lots in D.L. 381.




