With members of Council seated at the Council table the Mayor called upon Reverend M. Mandich to give the invocation.

Judge Giles then proceeded with the swearing-in of the Mayor and Aldermen-elect as follows:

Mayor James L. Tonn then addressed the meeting as follows:

INAUGURAL SPEECH OF MAYOR JAMES L. TONN

Your Honour Judge Giles, Members of Council, Honoured Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen:

At Inaugural Meetings throughout the province tonight municipal leaders will be expressing their opinions as to what 1976 holds in store for their respective municipalities.

As I endeavour at this time to gaze into the crystal ball and look to the year ahead, I am indeed concerned with what the future may hold in store for us.

The financial outlook for 1976 is indeed a gloomy one. Even with the attempt by the federal government to place guidelines upon us as individuals, inflation continues to snowball. It will be extremely difficult at this time to predict directions in which taxes for our Municipality will go but I think it is extremely safe to say that they will increase and undoubtedly increase substantially. We are, at this point in time, still dealing with a fixed assessment and, as such, the deterioration of our ability to raise funds for the operation of the Municipality continues.

It is sincerely hoped that the senior levels of government will recognize the plight of the municipalities and stop treating us as unwanted children and explore and find methods of assisting municipalities in developing sources of additional revenue other than through the property tax.

In the area of growth, many uncertainties also occur and I will be endeavouring to meet with the new Minister of Municipal Affairs in Victoria as early as possible to find out the status of the Essondale and Burke Mountain projects. However, as I see it, during 1976 our growth rate will continue to skyrocket and the problem of providing affordable housing will still be a concern to all urban areas of the province.

Monday, January 5, 1976, Inaugural Meeting, cont'd.

I think it is important to note that people must also accept the challenge and recognize that our society is changing and we must review our priorities not only as a municipality but on an individual basis. More than ever, we must endeavour to provide for our needs and not necessarily our wants. Council, in their deliberations during budget meetings, which will be held early this year, are going to have to come to grips with priorities and the elimination of some of the frills that we provide and have the courage and ability to say no to pressure groups within the community on any items other than those which are extremely high on the priority list.

I would not suggest at this point in time that there will be a reduction in any services to the taxpayers of our Municipality but if this Council is to maintain financial responsibility we must indeed show restraint everywhere possible and things that we have accepted in the past as being assumed will be questioned and challenged more than ever before.

One of the other areas of concern is the rapidly expanding police costs to the Municipality and the limitations placed on manpower allocations by Ottawa. If we are going to continue to grow at the rapid rate which we have been, some type of recognition must be afforded us in increasing our detachment strength and also in assisting in paying these contract costs.

It is my hope that early in 1976 our senior citizens' centre will be under construction and with the acquisition of the parkland in the Maillardville area and development funds which have been approved by the electorate in referendum, that these much needed facilities will come on stream during the 1976-77 time frame, but even in the area of recreational service, which this community, in my opinion, is second to none, we must tighten up and live within our means and this will call for sacrifices from all citizens of the Municipality and recreational groups.

In conclusion, I would like to express my sincere thanks to the members of staff for their efforts during the past and their continued support and efforts for the future. We have, in my opinion, a staff which is second to none in the Province and their efforts are greatly appreciated.

I would also like to express, on behalf of the members of Council and myself, a very special thank you to Judge Giles and Reverend Mandich for taking time out to participate in our swearing in ceremonies.

I would also like to pay a special welcome to the new members of Council and to congratulate them on their elections and to wish them much success in their deliberations during their terms of office. I look forward to working with each and every one of them during the coming year.

GUIDELINES FOR COMMITTEES

The Mayor at this point informed Council that a new policy was being established in 1976 in that the Committee system would be instituted and he read to the meeting the terms of reference of the Committees which are as follows:

- 1. All committees will have two aldermen acting; one to act as chairman and one to act as deputy chairman. It is expected that these aldermen shall add to their committees by selecting appropriate staff to act as resource people.
- 2. In some cases, in addition to staff, there may be representation from ratepayers groups or athletic groups, etc. The committee chairman is free to add whatever persons he feels would contribute, with the exception of the Advisory Planning Commission and the Design Panel, who are appointed by Council.
- 3. The committees will organize their regular meeting days and subjects will be referred to the committees either by staff, who are processing an item that requires the setting of policy or clarification of policy, or from Council to have the committee recommend on policy.
- 4. Each committee is free to involve the press or not as it sees fit but items dealing with legal opinions, staff, negotiations or any involvement regarding land purchase or land sale will be dealt with in camera.
- 5. Once the committees, through their deliberations, have formulated a recommendation on policy or a specific action, it shall be transmitted to Council in the form of written communication either by minutes or reports and the report will be given by the chairman of that committee to Council. The appropriate staff members, however, will be expected to attend Council meetings and act as back-up for the committee.
- 6. The committee chairmen only may submit reports on behalf of their committees and, in their absence, the deputy chairmen.

Garrison. Members of staff present were the Municipal Manager, Municipal Engineer, Municipal Treasurer, Municipal Cle and Mr. Larry Wolfeof the Planning Department.

PROPOSAL FOR DEVELOPMENT OF A MUNICIPAL DRAINAGE SYSTEM

Res. No. 337 The Municipal Engineer explained in detail to the Members of Council the report which he had submitted in December 1975 dealing with a proposal for development of a municipal drainage system. During his explanation he emphasized the following points:

- 1. Do we want to eliminate ditches?
 - (a) Must be done in order to provide other amenities.
- Why eliminate ditches?
 - (a) Underwrite cost of all future surface improvements.
 - (b) Provide greater useable surface area.
 - (c) Better traffic operations and on-street parking.
 - (d) Better ground water drainage to help eliminate flooded and damp basements.
 - (e) Faster surface water runoff.
- Ditch elimination costs money. 3.
 - (a) To provide a drainage system for southwestern Coquitlam will cost approximately \$17,000,000 based on 1975 dollars.
 - (b) To borrow the funds over a period of 20 years at a 10% interest rate will mean a repayment of \$43,000,000 based on 1975 dollars.
- Present methods of financing.
 - (a) Capital from mill rate tax generally borrowed.
 - (b) Local improvements 67% of funds from properties benefitted and 33% from general mill rate tax.
 - (c) Land development 100% from Land Sale Revenues.

The Engineer explained that about 20% of the southwest area of Coquitlam is served by the above three methods, however, these are local systems only and downstream works are still required.

- 5. Defects in localized systems.
 - (a) Not all properties served.
 - (b) Downstream works required.
 - (c) Lowlands cost more than uplands.
 - (d) Greater maintenance of more intakes and outlets.
- 6. Total systems within catchment areas.
 - (a) Maximize economy.
 - (b) Maximize system efficiency.
 - (c) Maximize fair distribution of costs.
- 7. Municipal Drainage System.
 - (a) A municipal sanitary sewer system and water supply system have been successfully provided under a similar method.
 - (b) Establishes separate charge distinct from mill rate tax.
 - (c) Equitably distributes cost.
 - (d) Is legally provided for in Municipal Act.
 - (e) Provides machinery for systematic program.
- 8. Report provides example of how system might work based on assumed variables.
 - (a) Chargeable lots within the area equal approximately 10,000.
 - (b) Construction costs are estimated to increase at 10% annually.
 - (c) Costs of borrowing estimated to be 10% annual interest based over a 20 year period.
 - (d) The report is based on annual programs being undertaken.
- 9. Report recommendations.
 - (a) A municipal drainage system be instituted.
 - (b) Initial parcel tax to be \$150 to all connected properties.
 - (c) Additional drainage use charge to be instituted in the amount of 1¢ per square foot for any parcel of land over ½ acre in size.
 - (d) Council proceed with the enactment of the necessary by-laws as submitted and attached to the report of the Engineering Department of December 1975.

- 10. Other considerations.
 - (a) Burden on borrowing capacity.
 - (b) Cost recovery by single payment is too onerous.
 - (c) Cost recovery from all properties inequitable.
- 11. Programs recommended in report.

The Engineer explained that five programs are recommended within the report which, when completed, would serve 60% of the parcels within the southwest Coquitlam area and the remaining 40% should be completed within a five year period.

QUESTIONS

Ald. Gregory inquired as to whether the \$150 per year would be a continual charge and it was explained that there would be a charge as long as there was a debt to be repaid and the period of debt would depend on the period of time to implement the programme and repay the debt and Council policy continue to cover only debt repayment and not a maintenance charge, however, the amount could vary from year to year.

Ald. Gregory also inquired as to whether those people who have already paid for the installation of storm sewers would be charged the same amount and Mr. Phillips stated that this would not be the case but they would pay one—third of the amount charged to other properties.

Mr. LeClair explained to Council that the program envisaged in the report of the Engineer dated December 1975 does not include provision for maintenance of the system.

Ald. Sekora asked if the annual charge could arise to as high as \$300 in five to ten years with inflation proceeding the way it is at the present time and Mr. Phillips stated that there was no way of accurately forecasting what the eventual rate would be, however, an appendix attached to the report attempts to show rate variations.

Ald. Parks inquired as to whether there were any other municipalities in B.C. proceeding with such a drainage system as envisaged within the report. Mr. Phillips advised that he knows of none in B.C.

Ald. Butler stated that he was concerned that those areas that presently do not need drainage and already have their ditches filled in would be required to pay additional charges.

Mayor Tonn mentioned the possibility of using an impost fee on new development in order to help with the financing of the proposed drainage system.

Ald. Gilmore stated that he was opposed to such an impost fee as this reflects directly in the initial cost of the homes and went on to state that in his opinion it is Council that has to make the decision on whether to proceed with this proposal, however, he is concerned about the uncertainty of the times we face.

Ald. Parks also expressed concern about the uncertainties of the future, however, he felt that it was Council that had to make a decision on this project. He stated that in his opinion it does provide an equitable fashion of doing this type of work and Ald. Sekora advised that he would like to see the ditches in Coquitlam closed but he is concerned greatly about rising costs, and especially the impact these rising costs could have on people who are on fixed incomes. He stated that no doubt other municipal taxes will be going up annually then this could actually force those people who are living on fixed incomes to sell their homes.

Ald. Gregory expressed concern as well about increasing taxes for years to come and she would like to see the proposal for municipal drainage system be placed before the electorate in referendum on an area by area basis.

Some residents in attendance at the meeting expressed the opinion that they too would like to see the ditches enclosed, however, they felt that the charge of \$150 per year would be too onerous for most people to pay and, as well, expressed extreme concern that there would be no definite limit on the amount to be charged from year to year.

Ald. Sekora asked whether it would not be possible to begin a saving program of charging residents immediately for such a service, possibly \$75 per year, and then actually start the program of ditch elimination within five years once a fair amount of capital had been saved up.

> Mr. Boname stated that the Coquitlam Centre had been designed in such a way as to provide a great deal of open space with facilities for a child day care centre and play area as well as facilities for senior citizens and those people in wheelchairs.

Mr. Boname also advised that flexibility of design is provided to allow for expansion vertically and there may be some need in future for the decking of parking facilities.

Council was advised that Coquitlam Centre could act as a catalyst for the proposed Coquitlam Town Centre.

In answer to a question from Mayor Tonn, Mr. Boname stated that site coverage would be between 33% to 40% and parking would be on a ratio of 5.5 spaces per 1,000 square feet of leasable floor area.

Ald. Garrison inquired as to the response from other firms with respect to leasing within the proposed centre and Mr. Boname advised that a great deal of interest has been expressed by various firms seeking lease space, however, no attempt would be made at leasing to other firms until 1977.

Ald. Gilmore asked Mr. Boname if the proposed centre would be feasible if the Burke Mountain or Riverview projects did not proceed and was advised that it would be as all studies had been undertaken prior to the announcement of those two proposals.

Ald. Parks inquired as to the feasibility of this proposed Centre if the Port Coquitlam centre was to be developed and Mr. Boname said that if the Coquitlam Centre was to be allowed to proceed forthwith, the possibility of the Port Coquitlam centre proceeding would be remote.

- 6. the waterworks section of the Engineering Department shall have no responsibility whatsoever beyond the terminal point of the connecting pipe on the property frontage as described in (2) above:
- 7. when a watermain is installed within the road upon which the property being serviced by a temporary connection is located, the waterworks section of the Engineering Department shall change the temporary water connection to a permanent water connection without further cost to the applicant;
