

and was later withdrawn.





Increase re relief Councillor Douglas reported that the matter had been laid before the convention of the U.B.C.M. and he had endeavoured to get some action in the matter, but one of the delegates had moved an amendment to his motion that the matter be referred to the incoming executive of the union to take up with the Government.

Councillor Clark said that he and the Clerk had taken the matter up with the Administrator of Unemployment Relief and he had informed him that the Government would not consider an increase until after March 31st when a new agreement would be made with the Federal Government.

H. Pritchett said the unemployed were unable to work under the present scale of relief and increase in commodities.

Councillor Douglas suggested that the Government be communicated with regarding the matter at once.

Telegram to Premier re Unemployed Councillor Clark suggested that the Council send a telegram to the Premier regarding the matter.

That the following telegram be forwarded:-
Relief situation serious, and becoming difficult to maintain law and order due to inadequate allowance and increased cost of living. Single men, married men and families in deep distress owing to undernourishment and lack of clothing. Council cannot provide increase account lack of funds and must ask Government to provide same. Reply urgent.

A. Gillis representing the Meridian Heights Homesteaders asked that all the taxes now in arrears against Homesteads in that area be cancelled so as to enable them to get their patents. He did not think that such land should be assessed and taxed until the Homesteader had received his patent.

His Worship read a number of sections from the Municipal Act which states that the Municipal Council has no authority to refund taxes and that Homestead lands must be assessed and taxed.

Councillor Douglas said that he thought it possible for the Council to make some arrangement to cancel the taxes and pointed out that the Inspector of Municipalities had said when speaking to the U.B.C.M. Convention that all Councils should make every effort to keep people on the land. He thought that some adjustment should be made in the Assessment and that they should be allowed to work off the taxes.

As far as money being paid back was concerned, we need not worry; that the Dominion is bankrupt and the Provincial Government is bankrupt and so were the Municipalities and the money would never be paid and that this Council was only carrying on at the expense of Unemployed. If the Dominion Government could advance money to a derelect like the Sun Life and Bank of Commerce which was already bankrupt for over 18 months and the C.P.R., they could advance it to the Municipality.

H. Pritchett addressed the meeting on behalf of the Unemployed Workers and asked what action the Council intended taking re Unemploy-regarding the increase in allowance for children. His Worship explained that the Provincial Government was not paying their share of the relief and that the bank would not advance a cent as the Municipality was overdrawn. He said the Clerk and he had phoned to Victoria in order to have money to pay the cheques last Saturday and they had not forwarded any until Monday.

Councillor Douglas suggested that we notify the parent Government that it is our intentions in the future; having due regard to the National financial position. If we are forced under any circumstances to default in our obligations we will feel compelled to endeavor to carry on our duties as a local authority. We may have to adopt ways and means as occasion warrant to control the entire finance of this Municipality, meeting all our current obligations without credit, even if we have to control our entire finances within our boundary. At the present time constitutional law forces us to go to the bank for credit. He suggested that all taxes could be paid in illegal tender and all expenses paid in cash.

Councillor Clark pointed out that a circular letter had been received from the Dept. of Labour notifying all municipalities that from Oct. 1st 1934 the monthly grant will be divided between the Municipalities and the Province on a proportionate basis, which meant that the Municipalities would have to pay about 50% instead of 1/3 of the relief costs and that the Circular had been mailed on the 16th inst., the day the delegation had met Mr. Pearson and that he must have known about the reduction at that time, but did not mention it.

Mr. Jackson said that he understood from the Minister that the money borrowed need never be paid back and the Government did not expect it.

Mr. Pritchett presented a petition which he claimed was ~~in~~ ~~accordance~~ signed by 300 ratepayers which he claimed was in accordance with the agreement arrived at with the relief committee of the Council.






