To install a system which will discharge into the City of Port Coquitlam system will cost \$285,000 exclusive of any costs agreed upon between the Municipality and the City for the use of their system. To install a system including secondary treatment for discharge into the Coquitlam River utilizing a portion of the existing outfall, will cost \$390,000. This proposal is in conflict with the Greater Vancouver Sewerage & Drainage District's master plan and it is unlikely that the proposal would be favourably considered by the Department of Health, Pollution Control Board nor the general public. To install a system utilizing the existing spiragestor in Ranch Park would cost \$275,000. The Engineering Supervisor recommended two courses of action to be pursued simultaneously:

- (a) Negotiate with the City of Port Coquitlam to discharge into their system (assuming they are willing to consider such a proposal).
- (b) Endeavour to secure Health Branch and Pollution Control Board approvals to pump into the existing spiragestor and discharge to the Coquitlam River via the existing outfall.

The Manager calculated the annual cost per lot, if the minimum total cost for approximately 150 lots was \$275,000, at about \$190 per lot. The Manager circulated to Council members maps showing various areas throughout the municipality which are not sewered and are experiencing difficulties with septic tanks. The annual cost per lot to sewer approximately 450 lots would be about \$170 per lot.

The Provincial Government will provide a maximum of \$15,000 towards the construction with the Federal Government matching the Provincial grant. The total cost of the building is now contemplated to be \$65,000. Assuming that the total cost will be \$65,000 with the Senior Governments' participation being \$30,000., Coquitlam's share based on the Simon Fraser Health Unit sharing formula, if Coquitlam appropriates 50% of the cost in 1969 and in 1970, will be \$12,000 for 1969 and \$12,000 for 1970. MOVED BY ALD. MCKENZIE, SECONDED BY ALD. BUTLER:

418. That approval of the proposal in principle on a two year basis and a final decision on the \$12,000 be made in the Final Budget.

MANAGER'S REPORT

1. Columbia Stage Lines

Columbia Stage Lines has filed an application with the Public Utilities Commission to discontinue their bus service. On April 8th, 1969 Columbia is to be requested by the P.U.C. to give a 30 day notice. At a meeting on April 2nd between the Municipal Manager and the Administrator for the City of Port Moody it was felt that the Councils of Port Moody and Coquitlam might consider publishing a notice inviting motor carriers to submit proposals to replace Columbia's service. The Manager discussed this suggestion with the Superintendent of Motor Carriers and Mr. DeVitt felt that with the publicity required for discontinuance there was little need for the municipalities to invite proposals and it would come as no surprise if no response was received.

On April 3rd a meeting was held with Mr. J.J. Joyce, Motor Carrier Transpc Consultant. Mr. Joyce wanted the name of the firm which had approached the municipality with a proposal to replace Columbia's service. He offere his assistance and advised that the Cities of Nanaimo, Prince George and Port Alberni are supporting transit systems. After Mr. Joyce left it was agreed that a record of positive action should be established and invitation of proposals would provide such positive action. Mayor Christmas had been contacted by Mayor Evers of New Westminster, who wishes to be kept advised as to the developments over the transit system. The businessmen in New Westminster and Sapperton are concerned that the cancel lation of the bus service will affect their businesses.

419. That once the Public Utilities Commission authorizes Columbia Stage Lines to give 30 days notice that we proceed with the City of Port Moody to call for proposals in the press in general as outlined in this report. CARRIED

2. Ornamental Street Lighting

Resolution 1081 of August 6th, 1968 resolved:

"That the added maintenance cost of street lighting in an ornamental street lighting programme be at the cost of the ratepayers benefitting on the basis recommended in the Manager's Report of July 19th, 1968."

Because of the heavy administration expense required to recover excess street lighting costs for works installed at a subdivider's expense and because of the doubtful practice of recovery where work is installed on a local improvement basis the Manager recommends that Council reverse the policy enunciated in Resolution 1081. Mrs. Hamilton explained that in addition to building apartments for public housing, a municipality could provide public housing by purchasing private apartment buildings or by purchasing some suites in a private apartment building and renting the remainder of the suites. By purchasing some suites and renting the others there would be a mixture of low income tenants and higher income tenants living in the same building. She also advised that it was better to scatter public housing projects throughout the municipality rather than to confine them to specific areas of the municipality.

MRS. BECK - APPEAL ROW OF TREES VIOLATING ZONING BY-LAW

In her letter of April 5th Mrs. Beck asks Council to reconsider the order contained in the Assistant Clerk's letter of March 19th, 1969. In that letter Mrs. Beck was informed that the row of poplar tress, which are over 8 ft. high, is in violation of our Zoning By-Laws and the trees would have to be brought into conformity with the provisions of the by-laws. The Planning Director advised Council that when By-Law 1629 was adopted the definition of a fence, contained in By-Law 1298, was not amended. A fence as defined under By-Law No. 1298 includes hedges, trellis, louvres, rows of trees and walls.



A Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District of Coquitlam was held in the Social Recreation Centre, 630 Poirier Street, Coquitlam, B. C. on Monday, September 15, 1969 at 6:30 p.m. Present at the meeting were Acting Mayor Butler, Ald. Boileau, Ald. Bewley, Mr. R. A. LeClair, Municipal Manager, Mr. D. M. Buchanan, Municipal Planner, T. Klassen, Acting Municipal Clerk and Mr. F. Harris, Deputy Treasurer.

Present from the Parks and Recreation Commission were Commission Chairman Mr. Doyle, Comm. Morgan, Comm. Spani, Comm. Miles, Comm. Filippelli, Mr. D. Cunnings, Mr. M. Powley, Mr. A. Saenger, Mr. Beazley, Architect. Also present were Fire Chief Falcon and Mr. Poul Hansen, Architect.

As there was not a quorum of Council present, it was decided to hear the group from the Parks and Recreation Commission with regard to the Financing of the Mundy Park Swimming Pool and to make a decision at a later Council Meeting.

Mr. Doyle addressed Council and presented a report prepared by Mr. Cunnings dealing with the awarding of a contract for the Mundy Park Pool and the financing of the Pool.

Mr. Doyle explained that tenders had been called and the lowest one returned was some \$20,000.00 over the monies available for the project.

Mr. Doyle further advised that the contract had been designed in such a manner that a portion of the contract could go forward pending the approval of the additional monies needed. Also, if a provisional contract is signed for \$123,000.00 an option to complete the project could be incorporated without incurring any liability beyond the \$123,000.00.

The contractor must know by November 15, 1969 if the Municipality will proceed on the full contract otherwise they would still complete the project at the \$145,000.00 bid price providing an escalation clause is included in the contract for any increase in the cost of materials and labour after this date.

It was further explained to Council that a total of some \$50,000.00 would be required to bring the pool into operation under minimum standards or \$60,000.00 tender maximum standards over and above the \$123,000.00 now available.

Council tacitly agreed that the contract be signed for \$123,000.00 with an option to complete the pool with Council advising the Commission prior to November 15, 1969 if the additional \$20,000.00 would be made availble in 1969.

The Parks & Recreation Commission left the meeting at this point.

Council then considered the proposed plans for an extension to #3

AND WHEREAS in the opinion of Council the ideal of one unit of local government encompassing the area of School District #43 will be achieved most quickly in the present circumstances by Coquitlam moving to promote the interest of citizens of both Coquitlam and said Area 13:

AND WHEREAS to this end dialogue between Council and representatives of organizations in Area 13 were initiated and were bound to continue without pressure on the part of Coquitlam Council;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Port Moody has moved to set legal proceedings in motion to take Area 13 within its boundaries without giving citizens of Area 13 an opportunity to review fully the several alternatives open to them;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT COUNCIL:

1. Petition the Minister of Municipal Affairs for extension of Coquitlam boundaries to include the lands within Community Planning Area 13, and;

2. That the Minister be urged to allow the residents of Coquitlam and Area 13 a period of three months in which to consider their relative positions as regard alternatives open to them, and;

> 3. That the Greater Vancouver Water District and the Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District be commissioned by this Municipality to prepare reports indicating the feasibility of Coquitlam providing the required water and sewer services to Area 13.

They state that it has been recommended that a road extension of Laurentian Crescent from Austin to Linton be built by 1975 and feel there is no incentive to improve their properties as these are the parcels of land that will have to be acquired for the extension.



Council on April 1st., 1969 be way of Resolution # 402 requested the Advisory Planning Commission to review the statement of policy with the intention of issuing a further statement. The procedure suggested by the Planner at this point is as follows :

1) Council consideration of Advisory Planning Commission recommendations on November 4th., 1969 including listening to delegates on each proposed change.

2) Council authorizing the Planning Department to prepare a draft pamphlet.

3) Council review of the draft in mid to late November.

4) Council taking action on rezoning applications in areas added to designated areas.

5) Printing of pamphlet and circulation to all Coquitlam residents through Post Office in mid-December.

6) No further changes until the <u>Community Plan Study</u> recently approved by Council is completed.

The one major exception to this procedure is the proposed 1440 unit development south of Lougheed Highway at Alderson Avenue. The Advisory Planning Commission will presumably be recommending to Council on this development at their meeting of November 5th., 1969. Council review on November 18th., 1969 and inclusion in the draft pamphlet is thus possible if Council declares its policy on the matter at that time.

PROPOSED CHANGES - BURQUITLAM AREA 1 (SOUTH) ADVISORY PLANNING COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2094

The Commission recommend that Council designate E.1/2 and W.1/2 of 10, D.L.7, Plan 4352 for future apartment development subject to:
