

The Inaugural Meeting of the Municipal Council of the District of Coquitlam was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Hall, 1111 Brunette Avenue, Coquitlam, B.C. at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, December 4, 1978 with his Honour I.J. Bruhaug, Provincial Court Judge officiating at the Swearing In Ceremony of the Municipal Council Members Elect.

#### INAUGURAL SPEECH OF MAYOR JAMES L. TONN

Your Honour Judge Bruhaug, Reverend Mandich, Members of Council, Honoured Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen.

The year 1979, which is almost upon us, appears to be a most exciting one for this Municipality.

I will firstly touch upon the financial aspects and then proceed to outline development plans and major works for the upcoming year.

In the area of Assessments......with the initial year of the Assessment changes behind us, the impact of the Assessment Equalisation Act will be substantially softened for 1979. However, it is important to note that there are still some taxpayers in this Municipality who, as a result of being grossly under assessed, will continue to feel major adjustments in the upcoming year, but by far the majority will see stabilization of Assessments.

It is my hope that this Council will endeavour, during our budget deliberations, to limit increases in Municipal expenditures to the neighbourhood of 3 to 4 percent, and that we will still be able to provide this same level of service that our taxpayers have enjoyed during the past year.

Substantial major works will continue during 1979 in the areas of street improvements. The plans of Como Lake Avenue, which were started during 1978 will be completed and the major Phase 1 improvements to Brunette Avenue, from Woolridge to Marmont will proceed this year. A variety of other streets will also be reconstructed during 1979 and they are:

Ranchpark Way from Spuraway to Norman Avenue;
Norman Avenue from Ranchpark Way to Dewdney Trunk Road;
Foster Avenue from Linton Street to Poirier Avenue;
Cottonwood Avenue from Fairview Street to Robinson Street;
Foster Avenue from Blue Mountain Street to Porter Street;
Foster Avenue from Gatensbury Street to Schoolhouse Street;
Dewdney Trunk Road from Scott Creek to Irvine Street;
Cape Horn Avenue from Brunette Avenue to Mundy Street.

#### INAUGURAL MEETING - 7:30 p.m.

Sanitary sewers can now be provided in the Glen Drive to Walton Avenue Area but must coincide with proper staged planning for this area.

The Municipality will be providing further water extensions, north of Victoria Drive and east of Coast Meridian Road in the upcoming year.

Council early in 1979 will have to make a decision on the back-bone of the Westwood Plateau and Town Centre drainage area and storm drainage works. The result of these works and the system proposed will ensure the environmental security of Hoy Creek and substantially includes the Fisheries Department's concerns regarding the preservation of this important waterway. This program is the most recent method used in North America and will have lasting benefits to all residents of the Municipality.

Substantial developments have been underway, and the Coquitlam Centre is progressing on schedule and from last report is still scheduled to open in August 1979.

In the Mayfair Industrial Park servicing for Phases 1 and 11 are complete and development is starting in this much needed area. It should also be noted that the park building adjacent to the Fraser River is now complete and the pump station adjacent to the Fraser River is also complete and it is anticipated that accelerated development will take place in the Mayfair Industrial Park during 1979.

Major residential subdivision is proceeding and specifically the area east of Pipeline Road in the Dunkirk and Ozada area is substantially complete and service lots are on the market now.

Stage II of Eagle Ridge is also substantially underway and will see a continuation of major residential development in that area.

Council have expressed a very strong desire to see the Crown Zellerbach lands between the freeway and the Fraser River opened up to industrial development and I will be requesting Council to give consideration to authorizing discussions with the principals of Crown Zellerbach to see whether the company would be willing to enter in an agreement with the Municipality that would see the company lands turned over to the Municipality with a cost sharing agreement as construction takes place that would be mutually acceptable to both the company and the municipality.

There has been continued discussion during the past year with regard to the reinstatement of the Committee System of Council. I can only remind Members of Council that in the mid 1960's the citizens of this Municipality exercised their democratic right in establishing the Managerial System of Government and with the exception of two minor changes, it is my intention to see that the wishes of the public are carried out.

Section 179 of the Municipal Act provides power to the Mayor to establish Standing Committees for those areas which he feels the public can be better served, and it is my intention under that section of the Municipal Act to establish two Standing Committees of Council, each to be comprised of three Members of Council only, and is established for the purpose of making recommendations to Council and is without administrative or executive powers. The two Standing Committees are:

#### 1. PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

This will encompass areas of land use and development proposals and the Planning Department will provide secretariat for this committee.

Chairman - Ald. Parks
Deputy Chairman - Ald. Sekora
Ald. Campbell

#### 2. PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

This will encompass all areas and functions under the Parks and Recreation Director and the Parks and Recreation Department will provide secretariat for this committee.

> Chairman - Ald. Bewley Deputy Chairman - Ald. Robinson Ald. Garrison

The committee will formulate recommendations to Council and Council will consider matters related to it.

All matters coming before any committee must be included on a written agenda supported with background material attached to be delivered to committee members and to the Municipal Clerk at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the time of the meeting at which such matters are to be discussed: this to ensure that all Members of Council are clearly advised and aware of agenda items.

Other procedures governing Standing Committees and staff are as follows:

- To hold a regular meeting during the week in which there is to be no Regular Council Meeting.
- 2. Each Standing Committee will consist of three (3) Members.
- 3. A Quorum shall be two (2) Members of the Committee.
- 4. Special meetings of the Committee to be held at the call of the Chairman; but on forty-eight (48) hours notice following preparation and delivery of the agenda.
- 5. The Municipal Manager will have authority to append a report or recommendation to that of the Committee when same is perceived by him to have potential adverse effects on other areas of Municipal control or concern.
- 6. No report or recommendation will be accepted for inclusion in the Council's Regular Meeting Agenda after the time set in the procedure By-law (by 12 noon on the Thursday prior to the Regular Council Meeting).

As a result of this change, I will be placing a notice before Council at the meeting tomorrow evening to amend the Procedure By-law to delete any reference to a Policy and Planning Committee. Finances, of course, will be dealt with Council as a whole.

INAUGURAL MEETING - 7:30 p.m.

A number of vacancies need to be filled by representatives of the public appointed by Council in areas such as hospital boards, library boards, etc., and I would request any members of the public who wish to assist their community in this endeavour to communiate to my office, in writing, their desire and a brief outline of their background. These appointments will be coming forward during the month of January 1979 and I would encourage the public's participation.

In conclusion, as always, I would like to express my sincere thanks to Members of Staff for their efforts during the past year.

I would be remiss if I did not take this opportunity of expressing on behalf of Members of Council and myself a special thank you to Judge Bruhaug and to Reverend Mandich for participating in our Inaugural Meeting and taking time out of their busy schedule to be here.

MRS. M. MEEGAN - REZONING OF 1017 AUSTIN AVENUE, OUR FILE NO. Z-39-70

In attendance to discuss this matter with Council were Mrs. M. Meegan and Mr. Keith White.

Mr. K. White of 1120 Austin Avenue, and speaking for Mrs. Meegan, circulated to Council revised plans for some adjustments to the underground parking system for the four proposed lots. He explained that Austin access would occur on Lot 297, and that access on Ridgeway would occur on Lot 298. The original plan called for access to be on Lot 298 on to Ridgeway. As the plans now stand it calls for an elevation difference of 1'6" in height which means more than an 11' increase in the ramp length. The high point on Ridgeway will occur on Mrs. Meegan's property and causing any access off Ridgeway to be quite steep. He added that if the access is off Ridgeway, Mrs. Meegan will lose some parking spots. He pointed out that in the current Zoning By-law there is a requirement for a loading bay plus a handicapped parking space, without full access off Austin these spaces cannot be provided. He concluded by saying that Mrs. Meegan was ready to build and that by all accounts progress on the west lot had been stalled.

Mrs. Meegan commented briefly that she would like access from Austin and felt that the investor should have some say in the matter. She pointed out that the address is 1017 Austin Avenue, and as such, access should be from Austin Avenue. She concluded by reiterating the loss of four parking spaces if the Ridgeway access is required.

Mayor Tonn thanked Mrs. Meegan and Mr. White for attending the Council meeting. Mrs Meegan and Mr. White left the meeting.
