



Ranger, Candlelight Social Club, appeared on behalf of the 350 members of the Candlelight Social Club, to express concern regarding the Attorney General's plan to revoke gaming licences of B.C. social clubs. He said that the Attorney General's decision was made without consultation and with no avenue for appeal. Mr. Ranger outlined the benefits of the social club to its members and the community. Mr. Ranger asked that Council write to the Attorney General requesting that the Attorney General meet with the Candlelight Social Club to discuss plans to revoke gaming licences.

Mr. Little said that the Coquitlam Task Force accepts the regional indoor smoking bylaw with the proviso that restaurants and hotels with restaurants are not in agreement with the 100% smoking ban on The Task Force recommends the following with respect to restaurants. restaurant and food service operations: increase current 50-50 smoking/nonsmoking seating ratio in restaurants to 70% non-smoking; non-smoking sections to be adjusted in accordance with changing consumer demand; no minors permitted in smoking sections; employees not permitted to smoke on premises; air quality in restaurants to meet ASHRAE Standard 62-89 within 18 months of adoption of regional bylaws; sale of cigarettes not permitted on premises; appropriate warning signage regarding harmful effects of smoking posted at entrances and in washrooms; public notice decals on restaurant doors - "non-smoking section provided" or "100% non-smoking"; work with Health Board to ensure compliance; and having a consumer hotline to deal with complaints concerning smoking regulations. The Task Force asked that Canadian Legions be included and identified in Section 3 of the proposed bylaw. A written copy of Mr. Little's presentation is on file at the Clerk's Office.

#### DELEGATION - DR. R. PARKER - PRESENTATION OF GVRD'S PROPOSED 100% SMOKE-FREE INDOOR AIR BYLAW

Dr. R. Parker, Deputy Medical Health Officer, Simon Fraser Health Board, appeared to present information on the proposed 100% smoke-free indoor air bylaw. Dr. Parker said that it is a fact that tobacco smoke poses a health risk and that the best way to implement smoke-free bylaws is on a regional basis. Mr. E. Higham, 625 Thompson Avenue, appeared to speak in favour of the DVP application. He said that when Nicola Avenue is complete, there will be 4.9 metres for two-way traffic with vehicles parked on both sides of the street. Mr. Higham submitted a written brief, a copy of which is on file at the Clerk's Office. Mr. Higham suggested that the variance would not result in any traffic difficulties and that there would be sufficient road width for safety.

Mr. Willis, 631 Thompson Avenue, said that the new road is lower than the surrounding properties. He said that the different elevations would require the road to be narrower to ensure that properties do not slump or erode toward the road.

Mr. C. Demitri, 629 Thompson Avenue, said that Mr. Totovic's earlier statement about him going to City Hall to authorize a portion of his property to be used for road purposes was incorrect and that he was simply seeking further information on the issue.



- 6. That old growth stumps, snagged trees and similar natural artifacts be retained wherever possible for their landscape amenity value.
- 7. That all cleared areas be hydroseeded and work be undertaken at such time as to allow for quick establishment of hydroseeded grasses and minimum possible soil disturbance and erosion.

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#### MAYOR'S 1996 BUDGET SPEECH

Coquitlam residents should be pleased that City Council has been able to lower the 1996 tax increase from a provisional budget of 3.95 per cent to just 3.45 per cent residential and 3.0 per cent for business and industry.

For the owner of a home with an assessed value of \$250,000, this would mean a tax increase of \$25.47.

Such an increase will allow us to maintain a higher level of services than last year.

While a zero increase is great in theory, it is very difficult to achieve given today's economic uncertainties.

I honestly believe that for a city our size, we have done well to keep this year's increase below the 4.75 per cent of 1994 and the 4.9 per cent of 1995.

This year's small tax increase reflects Coquitlam's strong financial picture.

That we were able to apply \$900,000 from the \$3 million surplus our 1995 budget produced and an increased amount of grants from the provincial government helped us keep taxes down.

We realized \$1.2 million saving on Police items and also had a Fire Department saving.

Also, we will receive \$800,000 a year in grants starting next year for the Riverview Forensic Unit where previously the annual grant in lieu of taxes was only \$48,000.

Good management has lowered Greater Vancouver Regional District solid waste rates by \$4 a ton, which gave Coquitlam a \$32,000 saving between this July 1 and December 31. We will have a \$65,000 saving next year which will bring our solid waste costs down \$5 per home.

But sewer and water rates have gone up from 5 to 7 per cent because of improvements to the Iona Sewage Treatment Plant.

With regard to our water rates, I cannot defend Council's decision to eliminate the discount on water for seniors. My feeling is that seniors who live by themselves or as a couple do not use nearly as much water as a family.

In fairness, I would like to see the seniors' water discount put back in place.

I also look to the user fee applied to seniors' slow pitch and wonder where we are going with this policy.

Imposing new user fees on services or facilities if your municipality is in financial difficulty is one thing, but given our budget surplus I think we have gone too far in this direction. In fact, I'd like to see us revert to our old user fee policy.

I would also like to see Dogwood Pavilion appoint a Board of Directors and operate in the same manner as our library rather than be operated by Leisure and Parks Services. Dogwood has many skilled members who could provide a more efficient operation.

With regard to services, I am proud of our new Planet Ice facility. This four rinks-type facility fills a need for more ice time in our community and is a very positive addition to our recreation services.

In fact, based on the success of Planet Ice, I would like to see Coquitlam enter into more joint ventures with private developers.

The undeniable benefit of such arrangements is that we not only obtain needed facilities at no cost to our taxpayers but we also receive full taxes on the property.

We will also benefit from a public golf course and driving range being built by private interests on the old landfill site in Southwest Coquitlam this year.

I said in December that my number one priority is making sure Coquitlam remains a safe community in which to live and work.

Council has approved the hiring of five additional police officers for our RCMP Detachment, one civilian staff member and three additional firefighters.

While I would have preferred adding the six officers requested for our Detachment, it is not my decision alone. I feel we must provide our Police and Fire Departments with a high level of staffing for them to do their jobs.

On policing, our new community police office on Ridgeway Avenue is working well and we will open another such office on Poirier Street later this year.

The new Public Safety Building we are sharing with Port Coquitlam will open in October or November at Guildford and Pinetree Way. The police move to the new building, which will provide needed space and facilities, is included in this budget.

And we must make sure our police force is paid properly. They do a great job and should be paid accordingly.

But we cannot have a cost of living allowance in our agreement - it just won't work. I was one of a group of Mayors who went to Ottawa last fall and addressed this matter with the RCMP and the federal government.

In the same vein, I'm pleased to have been appointed to a Federation of Canadian Mayors Committee on Parole Systems. I intend to take an active role on this committee.

Frankly, I am in favor of whatever we can do to make our community a safer place in which to live.

Our Community Safety Committee, chaired by Councillor Jon Kingsbury, has achieved some very positive results.

The committee was appointed last December to review public safety provisions and is to report back to Council later this year.

Mayors from the northeast sector have met regularly to discuss transportation and other matters of common concern.

> It was unfortunate that the Broadway-Lougheed mall line was chosen over the new Westminster-Coquitlam line as the first phase of rapid transit expansion.

> I find it totally unacceptable that it will take 13 years for rapid transit to reach Coquitlam. We will be discussing this matter with Premier Clark in the near future.

One of the items we are looking at is extending United Boulevard. This would open more land in Pacific Reach Business Park and create more jobs. It would also be a major step toward taking traffic off the Lougheed Highway and the Freeway.

I have talked to the Highways Ministry and the office of MLA John Cashore about United Boulevard and will continue to do so.

With regard to City roads, we have five new road construction projects scheduled this year with the largest being the rebuilding of Dewdney Trunk Road from Lougheed to Hull Court at a cost of \$2.4 million.

District 43 Mayors are also working to see how we can effect savings through joint purchasing activities and the sharing of some services. While there has been some recent talk of amalgamation for the Tri-Cities, I agree with Mayors Traboulay and Northey that we would require far more input as to the benefits to be obtained and a clear indication of our residents' wishes.

I will also be following the Riverview Lands Study closely. I feel most of the land should be set aside as a park and that four empty buildings on the site should be preserved for use by community groups.

Meanwhile, our new arts centre is rapidly taking shape across from the new police building and will open in September or October. While it will open with a 250 seat theatre, I am committed to a 600 seat theatre and will be discussing this with other area Mayors.

The new building is two-thirds funded by federal, provincial and municipal infrastructure grants.

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And across the street from the Evergreen Cultural Centre, the new Coquitlam campus of Douglas College is scheduled to open in October. Aside from the economic benefits of having a full-fledged college in our community, it will be great for our students to be able to undertake their post-secondary studies right here at home.

I also expect to see Phase Three of our Maillardville Heritage Square Project get underway this year. Our trustees support Phase Three so strongly that we have agreed to run a Charity Golf Tournament at Vancouver Golf Club this July with proceeds going to the Heritage Square Building Fund.

With regard to Heritage Square, the new building accommodating Place des Arts will be an asset to our community when it opens this June.

And now we have some of our major projects nearing completion, the time has come to get on with building a new City Hall. Our current City Hall can no longer accommodate our needs, nor can it meet today's safety standards.

Our new City Hall will be built opposite the new Public Safety Building and by including a new Town Centre Branch of the Public Library, we will save more than \$200,000 in annual rent. We need to have all our Departments working under one roof, something which has been impossible in recent years.

We will finance the new City Hall by borrowing from ourselves and through a short term loan.

Funds from the sale of the old police building on Christmas Way and the current City Hall will go to pay off the short term loan.

We anticipate the City Hall portion of our new civic complex will total 60,000 square feet.

In the area of Leisure and Parks Services, new parks to open this year are Bramble Park/School and the Blue Jay Tot Lot, both on Westwood Plateau and the Scott Creek Middle School and Sportsfields. Capital work in progress includes new and rebuilt tennis courts at Town Centre Park, extending the Hoy Creek Trail to Douglas College and Como Lake shoreline stabilization.

In addition, construction will begin on our new Pinetree Community Centre, with the building being visible by November.

We are also planning a new water spray park which I recommend be located in Glen Park.

I have three other items to mention before concluding my budget address.

With regard to Social Housing, I have sent the provincial government a list of 20 Coquitlam sites which could accommodate Social Housing. I support Social Housing in Coquitlam and will also work toward obtaining more seniors' housing.

The next item is about ditch elimination. We had hoped to complete our ditch elimination program last year, but it was simply too much too soon.

After this year, only 10 per cent of our open ditches will remain. The final phase of our Ditch Elimination Program will be carried out in 1997.

By the time we are finished we will have spent \$40 million from reserves to fill in the ditches, which most residents wanted.

The final item relates to the proposed privatization of our cemetery. I do not support this concept. I feel we should look after our own cemetery and not bring people in to provide a service we have provided for many years.

The 1996 budget will add another \$59 million in assets to the City's Capital Base with programs supporting all areas of the City's infrastructure.

In conclusion, I wish to thank City Manager Norm Cook, our department heads and all our staff for a job well done.





Members of staff present were the City Manager, Director of Corporate Services, Director of Human Resources, Director of Planning, City Engineer, Director of Permits and Licences, Director of Leisure and Parks Services, Fire Chief, Director of Finance, Inspector E. Moulton of the Coquitlam RCMP, and Deputy City Clerk.

Mayor Sekora welcomed everyone to Council's Inaugural Meeting.

#### **INVOCATION**

The Venerable Al Hosking delivered the invocation prior to the meeting.

#### OATH OF OFFICE

Mr. Barrie Lynch, Justice of the Peace, administered the Oath of Office to Mayor Sekora and Councillors Becker, Hollington, Kingsbury, Melville, Stangier and Thorne.

#### MAYOR'S 1997 ANNUAL ADDRESS

The Venerable Al Hosking, Justice of the Peace Barrie Lynch, honoured guests, Freemen Crosby Johnston, Rene Gamache, Leonora Peyton, Inspector Moulton of the Coquitlam R.C.M.P., ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls:

First, let me say that I am very proud to be starting my seventh term as Mayor of the City of Coquitlam. I sincerely thank the public for their support and will continue to work hard on behalf of our residents.

Before I commence my inaugural address, I want to pay tribute to outgoing Councillors Brian Robinson, Bill LeClair and Dave White.

They have served the City well and I commend them for their unselfish contribution to our community.

Councillor Robinson served 20 years on Council, including a period as Acting Mayor prior to my election as Mayor in 1983.

Councillor LeClair, whose late father was our Municipal Manager for many years, served twelve years on Council.

Councillor White served nine years on Council.

I also want to welcome our three new members of Council: Councillor Diane Thorne, Councillor Kent Becker and Councillor Jim Stangier.

Congratulations on being elected to Council. One thing I can assure you is that you'll have plenty to do and some tough decisions to make as Councillors.

A lot has been accomplished in the last three years.

We have an impressive list of new facilities:

- . the new Planet Ice four rinks complex;
- . the new David Lam Campus of Douglas College;
- . the new Evergreen Arts and Cultural Centre;
- . the new Public Safety Building;
- . the renovation of Mackin House;
- . the new Place des Arts building.

Next, I look forward to completion of the new Town Centre High School, Community Centre, City Hall and Library and completion of our Maillardville Heritage Square project which will see Maillardville redeveloped into an arts, entertainment and tourism centre.

One of my next major goals is to see a 600 seat theatre added to our Cultural Centre to make it a truly regional facility.

Public safety is a major concern in most areas these days and while Coquitlam is a relatively safe community, I believe we should do everything we can to make Coquitlam as safe as possible.

The Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety chaired by Councillor Jon Kingsbury found that 18 per cent of the residents surveyed did not feel safe.

> With this in mind, I would like to see a third community police office opened in the North Road-Burquitlam area.

> On another matter relating to safety, I look forward to the completion in 1997 of the final 10 per cent of the Ditch Elimination Program we began in 1983. The open ditches were a real safety threat.

Like other areas in the northeast sector, Coquitlam has experienced rapid growth in recent years.

We now have 104,000 residents, an increase of 3.5 per cent in the last year alone.

Growth has brought a need for the new and improved services and facilities I mentioned earlier. It has also increased our need for transportation improvements.

The provincial government has been agonizingly slow in providing promised transportation improvements.

I believe we should slow the rate of growth until we get some real commitments from Victoria, including getting light rapid transit to this area earlier than scheduled.

Just recently, I was told by Senior Cabinet Ministers that there is no money for transportation improvements.

We must learn from Westwood Plateau. The provincial government told us what we wanted to hear and then changed its priorities.

We're still waiting for light rapid transit and I'm afraid we will be for many more years.

We're going to be hard pressed to offset grants and services lost through offloading by senior governments. We're going to have to look more carefully at sharing purchases and services with surrounding municipalities, something we already do to some extent.

> And while we have yet to table our 1997 provisional budget, it is my hope we can keep any residential tax increase to a reasonable level. Our residents have enjoyed one of the lowest tax rates in the region, but recent cuts in government grants and rising costs present a real challenge in this area.

> One area in which I feel we need to improve is in communicating with the public. We need to develop a better flow of information, which should include the resumption of our newsletter so people know what is taking place in their community.

Council's practice of holding meetings in various areas of the community has worked well and we will continue this practice in the coming year.

This is of particular benefit in how Council communicates with areas such as Northeast Coquitlam.

While our new Northeast Coquitlam Community Plan will be of benefit as this area develops, we must pay attention to the area's immediate needs as well.

How we communicate has become even more important with the decision by Rogers Cable to close its Tri-City Production Centre.

Rogers has abandoned its commitment to producing community programming in this area and in the process thrown several people, including one with over 20 years of service, out of work.

The term good corporate citizen does not immediately come to mind when one thinks of Rogers Cable.

And now they expect us to travel to Metrotown to do community shows.

The people who run Rogers Cable just don't seem to get it.

They cut our service and then expect us to pay more for less.

Thank you all for attending our Inaugural Council Meeting.

### DELEGATION - DAVE SMITH - ROGERS COMMUNITY 4 -FRASER PROGRAMMING

Mr. D. Smith, Senior Community Program Coordinator with Rogers Community 4-Fraser, appeared before Council to address concerns related to the recent closing of Rogers Community 4-Fraser and the impact to the residents served by this station. Mr. Smith stated that area residents will no longer have access to community television as a result of this closure and that local programming has been reduced from 60 hours each week to only 5 hours last week. He further stated that Rogers has an obligation to the CRTC and residents of this community to provide local community programs and to encourage volunteers, but this was not being fulfilled as a result of the closure of Rogers Community 4-Fraser.

Mr. Ken Wood, #5-1140 Falcon Drive, stated that Rogers was not fulfilling its obligation to the CRTC to provide local programming and added that there would now be no local productions or producers. Mr. Wood added that he volunteered prior to the closing of the Fraser facility but would no longer be assisting as a result of this closure. Ms. M. Desantos of Pitt Meadows stated that she was a volunteer from the Fraser facility but would no longer volunteer.

He asked that Council amend City of Coquitlam Bylaws No. 1715, 1987 and No. 3037, 1996 to allow proprietors the opportunity to choose the ratio of smokers and non-smokers.

### DELEGATION - IONA CAMPAGNOLO, FRASER BASIN MANAGEMENT BOARD - PROPOSAL FOR A SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION

Ms. Iona Campagnolo, representing the Fraser Basin Management Board, appeared before Council to seek support for a grant equalling \$0.20 per person in Coquitlam to assist with funding for 1997. She explained that funding from the federal and provincial governments was dropping from \$600,000 to \$350,000 and the Fraser Basin Management Board was hoping to increase funding from local governments from \$200,000 to \$220,000.

Ms. Campagnolo also outlined the 5 Year Program for the Fraser River, entitled "Charter for Sustainability," and some of the contributions that the Fraser Basin Management Board have made in the past year. At a local level, the Board hosted some sustainability workshops in Coquitlam that were well attended and received by residents.

#### MAYOR'S 1997 PROVISIONAL BUDGET ADDRESS

The 1997 Budget has been a challenging process because of severe Provincial funding cutbacks and an economic climate which has brought interest rates down and caused a sharp drop in housing starts. These two factors have cut deeply into the revenue stream on which Coquitlam depends to keep the tax rate at reasonable levels.

The cutback in Provincial Revenue sharing was implemented without consultation with local governments. Furthermore, cost sharing grants for highways maintenance and emergency programs were eliminated, and a further measure which probably has more extreme long term impact is the transfer of responsibility for a major portion of the Lougheed Highway. In 1997 Coquitlam will have to find an additional \$2 million which is equivalent to 4.6% on the tax rate to absorb these costs.

The New Council has worked hard together over the last three weeks to consider and bring forward a budget which maintains a level of service to which Coquitlam residents have been accustomed and to improve and add resources where they are most needed. To do this, in the face of declining revenues and Provincial cutbacks we propose to increase property taxes by 5.3% which is only 0.6% above the increase caused by the Province. Our budgeted expenditures will actually decrease in 1997 by \$220,000 compared to 1996.

Municipal taxes on an average single family residence will increase by \$41 to \$805 in 1997. This budget provides much needed additional personnel for our police and fire operations.

We propose to add five additional police officers to the RCMP detachment, in addition to the five added last year, an assistant Blockwatch Coordinator and a new community police station at Poirier Street. Additional clerical support is also provided. We also propose to add three additional fire fighters in 1997 to follow the recommendations of the community Fire Rescue Protection Plan.

In 1997 and 1998 major civic buildings will be completed in the Town Centre for the benefit of Coquitlam residents. The new Evergreen Cultural Centre recently completed will provide opportunities for Cultural events and for the establishment of an active artistic community in Coquitlam. The Pinetree Community Centre, the result of a financial and operating partnership with Douglas College and School District 43 will open its doors to the public in the fall of 1997. It will provide gymnasium space, recreational programs and activities for seniors. Also, in 1997 the Coquitlam RCMP detachment will move into its new building on Guildford to be followed a year later in early 1998 by a new City Hall which will be adjacent to the police building and overlook a civic square.

The Library will be approximately 12,000 square feet, an increase of 3,500 square feet over the present Lincoln Library.

Maillardville Heritage Square will continue to see progress in its development. The newly renovated Place des Arts will be in its first full year of operation, fundraising will continue spearheaded by the Heritage Trust and the City budget will fund design for the restoration of Ryan House and the balance of the Heritage Square site.

Other capital programs include a new spray park and playing field at the Town Centre and various improvements at Mackin Park, Hoy Creek and other City locations where new equipment and playground structures are required. I will work with the Leisure and Parks Services Committee and the Community to improve maintenance standards and the conditions of our playing fields.

> The ditch elimination program be will completed in 1997. In addition local work improvements will be constructed at the same time on a cost sharing basis with residents. Other major road and drainage improvements will be constructed including widening a portion of Como Lake Avenue. An ambitious road rehabilitation program is planned over the next five years. Full traffic light signalization will be installed at Mariner/Hickey and Alderson/Lougheed and a pedestrian signal constructed at Guildford and Eagle Ridge.

> Our water and sewer rates will rise by 6% mainly as a result of increased levies from the Greater Vancouver Water and Sewer District. The water rate for non-metered properties will increase to \$161 from \$152 in 1996 and the sewer rate to \$196 from \$185. Levy increases are caused by the costs of the secondary treatment capital upgrade at Annacis Island Sewer Treatment Plant and increased chlorine treatment and filtration programs for the water system.

Our solid waste levy will decrease by \$5 as a result of lower tipping fees to \$160 in 1997.

Overall, we consider this to be a fair and reasonable budget to allow basic services to continue and to provide additional police and fire manpower and expanded recreational and cultural opportunities for a growing population.
