



each week to adjust any complaints or differences that might  
arise.

carry on with, if such wages were paid. He did not think  
that the people should expect as much at such times as when  
times are good. Regarding the appointing of a Committee this  
Council had never refused to meet a committee of the workers  
at any time. He thought that some form of insurance should be  
created. He also pointed out that New Westminster was only  
paying single men .20¢ per day.

Councillor Douglas suggested that the Government be asked to  
relieve the taxpayer of School taxes, and was in favor if it  
could be arranged that the whole Council should go to Victoria  
to impress on the Government the needs of the Municipality.  
He said he thought the demands of the delegation were reasonable  
and that men who were not fit to work in the ditch should be  
put on direct relief, and suggested that His Worship take up  
with the Government the matter on non-contributory Unemployment  
Insurance.

Councillor Hart said that he thought that the whole Council was  
willing to pay a higher wage if it was possible to do so.

Councillor Clark said he thought the Government should take  
some action regarding the unemployed at once.

The Hon. Mr. Pooley replied that Senator Robertson was very ill and that he would be unable to carry on the work of his office, and that nothing could be done about contributing the original amount.

His Worship suggested that the demands for non-contributory Insurance be made contributory.

His Worship also explained to the delegation that the Municipality was unable to pay the wages demanded and that single men were supposed to be taken care of by the Government.

I believe that there is a feeling among the Cities in which Public Hospitals are situated, that a Municipality should pay more than .70¢ per day per patient. It must be remembered that not many years ago, Municipalities were only responsible for their indigent patients; then, apparently finding that that was not sufficient, an appeal was made to the Government for a direct contribution of .50¢ per day per patient. Later on, evidently, that did not meet the cost of the situation and on appeal again the Government gave the hospitals power to collect .70¢ and now it has been suggested that Municipal contribution should be between \$1.00 and \$1.25 per day per patient.

Regardless of the fact that hospital administration and maintenance should be less at the present time; the Union of B.C. Municipalities has asked its secretary, and I think its executive on more than one occasion, to prepare and present a general report as to the average cost per patient; speaking for one of the Municipalities, I may say that before any further increase of cost per patient is even suggested, I would demand a previous request to the Union, the mere fact that some hospitals showing a deficit every year without a proper statement of fact being presented to the contributing Municipalities is not sufficient argument for an increase of contribution at the present time.

If it is shown after proper investigation that an increase is justified, I for one would be in favor.
