The Statutory Meeting of the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District of Coquitlam was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Hall, 1111 Brunette Avenue, New Westminster, B.C., on Monday, January 3rd, 1966, at 8:00 p.m., with all members of the Council present save Co. Clarke due to the weather conditions.

The Oath of Office and Allegiance having been completed, the Reeve instructed the members of the Council to their seating at the Council Board and then distributed the appointment of Committees and Representatives for 1966, as shown on the last page of these Minutes.

His Worship's remarks centered around co-operation requested for 1966 in the trial of a third meeting per month consolidating Sanitation, Public Works, Production, Equipment and Utilities (water) at one evening sitting.

His Worship mentioned the fact that the Municipal Hall Development Committee would put every effort into the construction of the new municipal hall this coming year for completion in 1967.

Questions around the table relative to the functions of administration and of government touched upon school board representation and Co. Butler considered the Reeve should review the enlargement of the Committee dealing with the School Board and their problems. This the Reeve promised to take under advisement.

Co. Hogarth asked how the other committees would meet and was advised that the call of the Chairman was considered sufficient.

Co. Gamache asked for clarification of the term "Council as a Whole" as referred to the committees listed. His Worship advised that he considered the entire Council would attend so that there would not have to be a debate on the minutes.

Do you realize how many taxpayers of this municipality have inquired of their insurance companies as to why they have to pay a premium rate of \$5.00 per \$1000 (based on residential rates over a 3 year period) as compared to our neighbouring New Westminster, Richmond, North Vancouver, West Vancouver and Burnaby whose home owners are only paying \$3.50 for the same coverage, and have been given the answer "because you have no fire department".

2. Why did this Municipality have to purchase land sites for these fire stations when we are offering larger parcels of municipal lands in as suitable locations for this purpose for less money?

3. On a comparable basis of population and insured values (not assessed values) why do we in Coquitlam require six fire halls when our neighbouring municipalites can give coverage in their areas on a fewer number of halls and enjoy 30% less premium rates?

4. Were the recommendations of the 1960 and 1965 surveys of the Underwriters made known to the taxpayers? If not, why not?

5. Why have our insurance rates not been effectively reduced?

6. Was any other fire protection authority consulted on our development program? If not, why not?

Our Association has conducted a study of the fire protection in this Municipality and will make available a presentation of our findings on request.

### FIRE COMMITTEE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF COQUITLA

Mr. Chairman:

We the taxpayers of this Municipality wish to inquire of your Comm-. ittee concerning the expenditure of our taxation monies alloted for fire protection purposes.

Since a period of five years has elapsed between the surveys conducted in 1960 and 1965 by the Canadian Underwriters Association, it would appear by their recommendations that the principal deficiencies in our fire protection still exist.

During this period the Municipality has spent well in excess of \$400,000 to purchase properties for #1, #4 and #6 fire stations, to building #1, #4 and #5 fire halls, to purchase additional pumpers and auxiliary equipment, to instal - continue more hydrants and to operate this department. This amount being separate from that spent on providing an improved water system.

In 1963, a money by-law No. 1155 for \$155,000 was presented to the taxpayers and represented as being necessary to develop our fire protection facilities in accordance with the recommendations of the Canadian Underwriters Association with the view in mind that we would enjoy reduced fire insurance rates as a result.

Sec. 115 of the Municipal Act, to seek a judicial ruling on the validity of the ballot in the Dist. 43 School Board election of December 11th, 1965.

I requested the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Hon. Dan Campbell, to request the legislation, under the Municipalities Enabling and Validating Act, Amendment Act 1966, re-instating the ten-day period allowed for presentation of a petition to have the election of school trustees declared invalid.

This special Bill was passed April 1st, 1966.

I feel that with these two actions of confidence, one on the part of the Municipal Council of Coquitlam, and one by the Legislature of B.C., that my point has been made.

I do not at this time wish to, nor do I see any need to, pursue the issue of the "validity of the ballot" further.

I do not, inspite of the willingness of this Council, wish to put this Municipality to any un-necessary expense by taking court action.

I have not, at any time, concerned myself with the result of the election. I do not have any desire to cause a by-election to be held, and should one have been held, I had no intention of becoming a candidate.

Through no fault of my own, but through the admitted to error of Mr. Pobst, the Returning Officer, I have been put to, along with others, no end of condern, trouble and publicity over a four month period.

I feel that I have been "fed" a steady stream of misinformation right from Dec. 12/65 to April 4/66 by the Returning Officer. His misinformation and attitude caused the original ten day period to expire.

Right from Dec. 12/65, while in conversation with me, the Returning Officer in my opinion has welcomed a court decision. Right from the beginning I have been most reluctant to take this action. I have felt that the Returning Officer made the mistake, it was not a poll day mistake, and the correction of same rested with him.

However, our laws place the onous on the defeated candidates, or candidates concerned. Since the other candidates didn't concern themselves-the responsibility has rested on my shoulders. I feel every Canadian is entitled to a correct ballot. For this principle, and this alone, I have carried the legislation through the house.

Yesterday, I requested a photostatic copy of the Resolution #133 made Feb. 8/66. The Resolution, as it reads in the Council Minutes means nothing-this I discovered when presenting it to my lawyer. The Municipal Clerk has made another mistake. I feel as a taxpayer in this Municipality, that such motions, and especially where money is concerned should be entered into the minutes, 100% correct--word-for-word, as stated by the mover, and, as woted on.

I sincerely feel that the reputation of this Council, and each man on it, and of this Municipality should not be continuously under fire due to the inefficiency of one man.

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I feel that if we all cast our minds back over the "brought-to-light" mistakes of just the past two years, honestly consider the cost of them, both money-wise and publicity-wise, that our sentiments and emotions must be cast aside immediately.

You all, I am certain read last evening's Vancouver Sun editorial.

Do you really want anymore of this?

Haven't you had enough?

Do you not think that this man's immediate retirement would not be of benefit to all?

For four months, I personally have been exposed to the inefficiency and continual mistakes of Mr. Pobst. They have not been "little errors" but expensive, time consuming errors.

As a taxpayer, I request of this Council his immediate resignation or removal.



The Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District of Coquitlam was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Hall, 1111 Brunette Avenue, New Westminster, B.C., on Tuesday, May 3rd, 1966, at 7:30 p.m., with all members of the Council present save Co, Rose.

## MOTORCYCLE CLUBS

A report was received dated May 3rd, 1966 from Staff Sgt. Howarth of the R. C. M. P. which pointed out that the detachment had received a fair number of nuisance complaints regarding the operations of motorcycles. The report suggested that if a club were to establish in a residential area, a flood of complaints would undoubtedly result.

Letters were read from the Earth Angels Motorcycle Club and the Rough Riders Moto**rcyc**le Club each asking to use a particular property in which to house their Club for meetings. The former wished to use the property located at 1208 Brunette Avenue while the latter proposed the use of property at 1144 Austin Avenue. Representations were heard by Council from each of the Clubs who had a delegation present at the meeting.

The Clubs were informed that both properties which were intended to be used as a club house were situated in a residential area and that the Zoning By-Law would not permit the use of land in a residential area for a club house.

OBJECTION TO REZONING LOT 86, D. L. 358 - BY-LAW NO. 1362

Council heard a representation by Mr. E. J. Johnson objecting to the passage of a by-law which rezoned Lot 86 of D.L. 358 from single family to duplex use.

Mr. Johnson was informed that Council had considered fully representations made by him and others at the council meeting held April 5th, 1966, and that the by-law had been passed despite the objections.





He explained that although the same was a general By-Law, that Council would not be precluded from amending such a By-Law in given circumstances in the future if Council sees the benefit of such amendments.

He further pointed out that the Corporation's costs would be restricted to that described in the By-Law adopted pursuant to Section 597A, notwithstanding the mechanics of the Frontage Tax Section of the Act.

The Treasurer reported that he had been telephoned by the solicitor, and that he was instructed to advise Council that amendments to Schedule "A" should be made. Details of the amendments suggested were given to members of Council.

In connection with Winter Works for the proposed Laurentian-Bel Aire Street Improvement project, Councillor Hogarth wished to emphasize that there is no guarantee of this work being approved as a Winter Works project, and further, that no policy as regards sharing with taxpayers the benefits of grants received under Winter Works should be at this time taken for granted. He wished to emphasize that the Municipality may be required to apply the benefits of grants received from Winter Works to the Corporation's portion of the cost only.

## LAURENTIAN BEL-AIRE CONTINUED.

The service actually went into operation on July 15th, 1966. Since that time, we have placed eight housekeepers. Their service has been from varying lengths of time. Some have stayed a relatively short interval, and others are still being used. It is too soon, yet, to determine the average length of time that a housekeeper stays. The service is designated as an emergency service, the intention being that employment should not last longer than one month.

You will probably be glad to know that we are employing housekeepers in marginal cases, marginal being defined as those people who are not in receipt of social allowance, but whose incomes do not permit them to employ a housekeeper. In these cases, the marginal client contributes what he can afford and this Department makes up the difference.

To my mind, this service is filling a vital need in the community and is doing the job efficiently and well.

Local Improvement Paving and Storm Drain Programme - 1966

REPORT PURSUANT TO SECTION 601 OF THE "MUNICIPAL ACT"

November 14th, 1966

It is desirous that The Corporation of the District of Coquitlam carry out the works hereinafter generally described, that is to say, the construction of storm drains, drainage connection from the property line, to the main for those parcels of land which on the 1st day of October, 1966, were connected to drainage ditches fronting the said parcels, grading of streets and boulevards as required including a spread of top soil on boulevards as required, the widening of existing asphalt pavement as required, and the construction of extruded concrete curbs on asphalt pavement, the said works shall be confined to the streets set out in Schedule "A", which said works have been recommended by the Public Works Committee and approved by Council.

1. The works are to be carried out under the initiative plan, Part XVI of the "Municipal Act", being Chapter 255 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1960 and amending Acts.

2. The life time of the works will be twenty-two (22) years.

3. The estimated cost of the work is \$593,000.00 excluding costs of borrowing.

4. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 597 (a) of the "Municipal Act", being Chapter 255 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, and amending Acts, the portion of the cost of the works constructed as a works of local improvement on streets more particularly described on Schedule "A" hereto to be borne by the Municipality and the owners of the parcels of land benefitting from or abutting the said works shall be calculated as follows:

(1) The Municipality shall pay the additional cost of storm drains requiring a diameter in excess of 10 inches;

(2) The Municipality shall pay the additional cost of increasing the width of asphalt pavement over 28 feet where required;

(3) The balance of the cost of the said works shall be paid in the ratio of one-third by the Municipality and twothirds by the owners of each parcel of land benefitting from or abutting to the said works.

5. A frontage tax is to be levied in the manner set forth in Part XVI of the "Municipal Act" against all lands benefitting from or abutting on the works, and shall be paid in twenty (20) instalments.


