T. SPRAGGS - PARKING DEMANDS 1000 BLOCK AUSTIN AVENUE

Mr. T. Spraggs, Barrister and Solicitor of 1046 Austin Avenue, presented a brief to Council on behalf of the Austin Avenue area businesses with regard to unreasonable parking demands in the 1000 block Austin Avenue area.

He stated that the problem exists for the people working in the area who require all day parking as well as for customers to the area who require parking for only short period of time. He suggested that a certain amount of relief could be obtained immediately by allowing parking in the lane behind Austin Avenue, between Austin and Charland; this would free up some parking spaces on Austin Avenue for customers.

Monday, February 10th, 1975, Regular Council Meeting, contid.

> He went on to state that further relief could be obtained if the Municipality would cover in theopen ditches in this lane which would allow parking on one side of the lane for the full length of the laneway.

Ald. Garrison stated that the Municipality is also concerned about the parking problems in this area. N. D. Lea & Associates are looking at the design of the road in this area with regard to parking.

The Municipal Engineer stated that they anticipated results of the report in the next few weeks. With regard to the lane, Mr. Phillips stated that it has been apparent to the District and it has been their intention for some time to include the provision of a storm sewer to eliminate the ditch in the lane and to pave this lane. What provisions will be made for parking on the lane will depend on the report of N. D. Lea and Associates. Nevertheless, it is the District's intention to take this matter into consideration and try to come up with the best solution to the matter.

The Municipal Engineer reported that the No Parking signs were erected in October on the receipt of complaints from property owners in the area. The signs were installed on the south side of the lane.

Ald. Sekora suggested that the Fire Marshal's regulations would probably also preclude parking on the lane.

The Municipal Engineer stated that the problem is that if parking is allowed on one side of the lane, commercial vehicles can still stop in the lane and if they do and there are cars parked on the side, these vehicles cannot get through the lane.

Mayor Tonn reported that the Board of Variance allowed relaxation of the parking requirements originally and that is why there is such a problem at the present time.

Mr. Spraggs reported that at the present time there is approximately 100 feet of ditch that is covered and this could be used for parking in this area and the No Parking signs could be moved to each side of it.

Ald. Filiatrault suggested that the lane be made a One Way lane to facilitate the parking of vehicles on one side and the movement of traffic through the laneway.

Mr. Phillips stated that they are considering this matter now and are awaiting the report from the consultants.

Ald, Bewley stated that there is also a precedent for this Municipality working in co-operation with the merchants to provide parking such as happened on Clarke Road. Before we undertake anything we should have alternatives before us from our consultants and we should await their report and at that time possibly in co-operation with the merchants in the area we can solve this problem.

Alderman Filiatrault stated that during the course of his study on library service he spoke to several Coquitlam residents who have paid a \$5.00 fee to join the Port Moody Library because they feel the service is superior to that of Centennial Library in the areas of children's books, senior citizen's books and reference books for business people.

Alderman Gilmore expressed dissatisfaction with the manner in which Alderman Filiatrault had prepared and presented a report as a member of the Council Committee for School Board Liaison without first consulting with the rest of the Committee. Alderman Gilmore then announced that he found it impossible to work with Alderman Filiatrault for this reason and would like to tender his resignation as Chairman of the Committee.

Mayor Tonn suggested that Council be given an opportunity to discuss the question of Library Service and possibly reach the decision that the Committee had been unable to reach.

Alderman Gilmore reviewed and enlarged upon portions of his report entitled "First Report to Council by Chairman of the Council Committee for School Board Liaison with Respect to Municipal Arrangements for Library Service". He pointed out that Council must make a decision as soon as possible between two alternatives:

- 1. Pursue the provision on a permanent basis of a library service primarily housed within school facilities while improving municipal participation, and
- 2. Split away from the School Board and establish a Municipal Public Library.

Alderman Gilmore spoke in favour of the first alternative.

Alderman Garrison suggested that we move to get a definite plan of service and invite members of the Board to join with this Council to establish an immediate long range plan for service. He suggested we inquire of the Provincial Government as to the changes necessary to legitimatize the service so that we may benefit from various provincial grants and services. He also stated he would like to see Council request the services of the proper resource people from the Board to meet with Council to immediately embark on nailing down a plan of service.

Alderman Bewley voiced agreement with the suggestions put forth by Alderman Garrison. He also believes we should use existing public buildings, particularly schools, to house branch libraries.

Alderman Howarth pointed out that the Joint Library Service has been a success up to this point but is in danger of becoming less successful in the future. He felt there should be separate and independent library administration.

MOVED BY ALD. FILIATRAULT SECONDED BY ALD. SEKORA:

That Coquitlam Council agree in principle to the establishment of a municipal public library.

MOTION DEFEATED

Alderman Howarth stated that during the meeting of the Council and Transit Bureau officials on February 17th, Mr. B. Sullivan of the Transit Bureau asked that the members consider three important aspects of trolley bus service versus diesel bus service. They are as follows:

- Capacity is more or less the same in both types of service.
 Operating costs of trolleys are much less than those of
 diesels, however Ald. Howarth felt the savings in operating
 costs should not be substantial enough to decide us in favour
 of trolleys.
- 2. Attractiveness trolleys make less noise and by pulling people away from passenger cars we should get less air pollution. Overhead wires are a drawback for Trolleys.
- 3. Economics trolley buses have a higher capital cost, but the operating and maintenance savings justify this cost once the level of use passes a certain threshold, i.e. where the frequency of service is to be every twelve minutes or less.

Alderman Howarth then pointed out that in his opinion the main negative points for trolley buses are the overhead wires and the inflexibility of the route structure. The biggest point in favour of trolleys is that they use electricity instead of petroleum.

Alderman Garrison voiced agreement of Alderman Howarth's comments.

Alderman Sekora circularized a petition from residents along Mariner Way. These residents are very much opposed to trolley buses along that street.

Alderman Gilmore pointed out that Seattle has done a study on trolley buses versus diesel buses and found trolleys to be the best of the two. He felt we should make a decision simply on how best to serve the Riverview development at this time. He also noted that if we eliminate the possibility of trolley buses in that area we are opting for a car oriented area because it cannot be served efficiently with diesel buses.

MOVED BY ALD, GARRISON SECONDED BY ALD, SEKORA:

274 That we suspend the rule of the mandatory adjournment time.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Alderman Bewley observed that the new wiring techniques are not as unsightly as the old ones. He felt the lack of noise and diesel fumes would be most advantageous and that the advantages of trolley buses outweigh the disadvantages.

Mayor Tonn did not agree with the concept of running trolleys throughout the Municipality but would not oppose Austin Avenue being used as a link-up with the new development area. He felt there are areas where trolleys can be utilized and they will assist in the future in tying in town centres.

Alderman Filiatrault felt the flexibility of the trolley bus service would not be adequate.

That this Council does not favour the concept of trolley buses for the developed area of Coquitlam, and requests the Bureau of Transit Services to consider alternative methods of improving transit in Coquitlam.



A Special Meeting of the Municipal Council convened in the Council Chambers, 1111 Brunette Avenue, Coquitlam, B.C. on Wednesday, March 26th, 1975 with all Members of Council present. Also present were the Municipal Manager, Municipal Engineer, Parks and Recreation Director, Municipal Treasurer, Planning Director, Assistant Planning Director and Municipal Clerk. Present from Dunhill and Provincial Government were Mr. W. Paulus, President of Dunhill Development Ltd.; Mr. J. Northey, Mr. Westwood, Mr. Bain, Mr. Dahlberg, Mr. G. Begg, Deputy Minister of Housing; Mr. W. Webb from Narod; and Mr. Graham from Cunliffe & Tait.

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

The Mayor advised that this was a Special Meeting of Council called in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Act to hear presentation to be made to Council, the Advisory Planning Commission and the Design Panel with respect to the development of the Riverview lands.

The Mayor introduced Mr. V. Paulus, the President of the Dunhill Corporation and turned the meeting over to him.

Mr. Paulus stated the purpose of his appearance before Council was to introduce the results of the Planning efforts of the Riverview lands together with the adjoining municipal lands in the area.

Mr. Paulus stated that the scheme being presented this evening provides for all the recreational needs of the residents of the new community. He advised, however, that there may be a need to co-ordinate the recreational expenditures with municipal plans, both within the confines of this development and other areas of the Municipality that more and better facilities might result for all.

Mr. J. Northey, Vice President of Dunhill Development Corporation for Special Projects introduced representatives of the consultants involved with the project and with Dunhill Development Corporation, these being:

Walter Webb - Narod - Project Manager;

Mr. Graham - Graham and Associates;

Mr. J. Cunliffe - Cunliffe and Tait;

Mr. R. Cunliffe - " ";

Mr. M. Haisley - Dunhill Developments;

Mr. J. Westwood - Dunhill Developments;

Mr. Bain - "

Mr. Dahlberg - "

Mr. Begg - Deputy Minister of Housing.

A slide presentation of the proposed development was made to Council by Mr. Webb. Mr. Webb stated that about 2,074 units are proposed for provincial lands and 1,100 units for municipal lands.

Mr. Webb advised that the schools to service the project would be built along with the first stage of housing units.

Mr. William Graham dealt with the actual development of the site as related to the location of housing units, pedestrian routes, roads and schools.

Wednesday, March 26th, 1975, Special Council Meeting, cont'd.

Mr. Graham advised that the internal residential streets and roads cover only 12% of the site as compared to 25% to 30% with a conventional development. The road system, he stated, was designed to allow transit to play a very important part in carrying the people from the area and the scheme has therefore been heavily oriented towards public transit.

Mr. Graham stated that the gross density over the whole project is 6.5 units per acre, however if the central area is removed, then the gross density over the rest of the site of 5.6 units per acre. The total number of homes proposed on the site is now 2,044, 90% of which are family oriented.

Mr. Graham advised that there is no actual connection to Ranch Park area other than possibly some foot paths.

Mr. Graham stated that in proceeding with this project they are suggesting the following procedure:

- 1. Establish a development area for the entire site.
- Negotiate a Land Use Contract for the entire site.
- Define Details to be negotiated and approved by the various appointed agencies of Council or Council themselves.

The staging Mr. Graham advised would be as follows:

- 1. First stage would be at the south end of the site.
- 2. The second stage would be one or two additional neighbourhoods.
- 3. The third stage would be towards the Ranch Park area.
- 4. The central area would be fitted in between stages 1 and 2.

QUESTION PERIOD - COUNCIL

- Ald. Filiatrault requested further information on type of water storage tank?
- Mr. Cunliffe stated that this subject was open for negotiation, however, elevated storage near the Pinnacle area would be required at an elevation of about 80 feet.
- Ald. Filiatrault any commitment on a four lane Lougheed Highway?

Wednesday, March 26th, 1975, Special Council Meeting, cont'd.

- Mr. Northey stated they are prepared to construct a four lane arterial through the site from Mariner to the bottom of the site, and to widen Mathewson from that point to an intersection with Dawes Hill Road. Also prepared to connect Austin Avenue to the site and prepared to connect the site northward to the relocated Lougheed Highway. Mr. Northey read the release made by the Premier on the upgrading of Lougheed Highway with construction to begin in 1976.
- Ald. Filiatrault No outlet to Riverview Hopsital, has there been any input on employers purchasing on a co-op basis or roadway through the area.
- Mr. Northey stated that the answer to this question is yes.
- Mr. Webb stated that discussion with hospital officials was held on advantages of connecting with the walkway system giving access to the housing and to transportation facilities
- Ald. Filiatrault What is meant by heavily oriented transit scheme?
- Mr. Northey stated that transit is made so convenient that there is a real incentive to use public transit. Hoping for up to 20% of residents using transit facilities.
- Ald. Garrison Coquitlam has been waiting approval for access to Lougheed Highway for industrial areas and wondered if interim access could be forthcoming prior to the complete redesign of Lougheed Highway.
- Mr. Northey stated that the proposed redesign would look after access with 3 or 4 years. Design available in 3 or 4 months.
- Ald. Garrison Joint Committee on Recreational Development.
- Mr. Northey stated they would like the community to have a say in what the recreational facilities should or could be. There own ideas, if planned in isolation, would include an arena, an open swimming pool and a library of about 4,500 square feet. They would prefer to have community input, using the same amount of money, to establish the type of facilities.
- Mr. Northey further stated that negotiations will be ongoing with the School Board on the matter of joint facilities being included in the construction of schools.
- Mr. Northey went on to advise that a private developer who has an interest in property in this area for a shopping area, this being H. A. Roberts Ltd., and Dunhill, is now in a position to say that they now have an agreement with that firm to enable the Crown to acquire the land which will put them in the position of having a proper single community shopping centre.

Wednesday, March 26th, 1975, Special Council Meeting, contid.

- The School Board, Mr. Northey stated, have agreed to a construction management procedure which will see the first schools designed and built along with the housing.
- Ald. Garrison What about ongoing costs of operation of recreational facilities as well as other facilities?
- Mr. Northey stated that a lot will depend on the progress of development and this could be part of the Land Use Contract negotiations.
- Ald. Filiatrault Is the Housing Department prepared to go into a joint venture relative to the development of Mundy Park and possibly the establishment of an 18 hole golf course?
- Mr. Northey stated that they had decided to keep development of facilities on site but are prepared to negotiate.
- Ald: Bewley Have any discussions taken place with our Engineering Department or the Department of Fisheries as to the effects on the environment or the fish from the discharge of storm sewers into the Coquitlam River?
- Mr. Webb stated the discharge into the River would always be there except now it would be a quicker runoff and the rate of discharge would have to be controlled.
- Mr. Cunliffe informed the meeting that existing water courses would be left as is and not enclosed and no discharge of storm drains would be made to existing creeks. Storm water from within the site would be conveyed directly to the Coquitlam River.
- Mr. Webb stated that as of yet the Department of Fisheries have not yet been satisfied as the specific issue has not yet been discussed fully with them.
- Mr. Phillips stated that it was his understanding that the discharge of water will be into Scott Creek.
- Ald. Sekora: Will this project be a land lease or a land purchase project?
- Mr. Northey stated that the policy of the Government is that this project will be completely leasehold with about 50% of the homes being held by individuals with long term leases with the remainder being co-op type ownership.
- Ald. Sekora What about resale of the units?
- Mr. Paulus stated there would be no control of resale with the term of the lease to be in excess of 60 years and most likely will be 99 year leases.

Wednesday, March 26th, 1975, Special Council Meeting, contid.

Ald. Sekora - What would be the cost of a single family unit?

- Mr. Northey advised that a prepaid lease would be from \$30,000 to \$50,000.

Ald. Sekora - What type of walkways are planned?

- Ald. Sekora was advised that walkways would have some sort of an all weather surface, the cycle surface would be hard surfaced. No sidewalks would be provided along the streets as pedestrian routes would be separate from the streets.
- Mr. Northey stated that it is proposed to dedicate all public lands to the Municipality.

Ald. Garrison - What is the breakdown of the 2,044 units?

- Mr. Northey stated that in the report the breakdown of units is given on plate 2.
- Mr. Webb stated that about 600 to 700 units would be of a single family detached dwelling nature.
- Mayor Tonn Inquired of Mr. Begg that if negotiations are carried out with Dunhill as far as recreational dollars are concerned and the type of use would the Municipality still be able to make application for Community Recreation Facilities Fund Grants of up to 1/3 and expect to receive that from the Province.
- Mr. Begg stated that the Municipality would be able to make application for the 1/3 grant.
- Ald. Bewiey The Land Use Contract for the Meadowbrook subdivision took two years and will this one be done more quickly and do we have the mechanism to gain the input from various groups such as the Design Panel, A.P.C. and staff?
- Mr. Northey advised that as of Monday formally applied for rezoning and subdivision and would like at this time is to request:
 - The preparation of a Development Area By-law.
 - Request Council to instruct the staff to enter negotiations for a land use contract for a report back as soon as possible.

Ald. Howarth - How many units in the central core?

- Mr. Northey stated 400 units.

Ald. Howarth - How is the redesign of access to the Lougheed Highway going to be handled?

Wednesday, March 26th, 1975, Special Council Meeting, cont'd.

- Mr. Northey advised that he could not say other than it would be built.
- Ald. Howarth How does the Municipality in negotiating with the Housing Department apply pressure to the Provincial Government to get the Highways Department to do what is acceptable to Coquitlam?
- Mr. Paulus stated that the Department of Housing would assist as much as possible.
- Ald. Howarth stated this still does not lead to direct negotiations between the Municipality and the Department of Highways.
- Ald. Howarth What is the staging of road access to the development?
- Mr. Webb advised that in the first instance temporary roads would be used with access probably to Austin and Mathewson and probably construct the bottom collector. No detail plan yet available.
- Ald. Howarth The buffer zones have now been reduced to narrow strips from that shown on the original concept and comment was requested on this point.
- Mr. Graham stated more space was needed for play areas, however, there is 2% more open space on this concept than on the original concept and as well, stretching out the green space has broadened its influence throughout the project.

PUBLIC QUESTION PERIOD

Mr. Morrison of Mathewson Avenue questioned the extra traffic which would be placed on Mathewson Avenue.

The Mayor questioned whether alternative routes, other than Mathewson, had been looked at and Mr. Graham stated that they had looked at other routes although Mathewson appeared to be the logical route because it had already been designated as a major arterial by the Municipality and, as well, it being an existing route.

Mr. Graham was questioned on total area of proposed parks and open spaces and replied -

90 acres - 28% is parks and open space;

26 acres - 8% for schools;

12 acres - 4% fields and central area.

The Mayor asked for clarification on the support expressed by the Minister of Housing for the Coquitlam Town Centre and whether this support was no longer forthcoming. Mr. Begg stated he hadn't discussed this matter with the Minister lately and cannot recall the Minister committing himself on the location of the Town Centre. Mr. Begg stated however he knows of no change in the Minister's commitment.

Wednesday, March 26th, 1975, Special Council Meeting, contid.

A gentleman inquired if the developers were aware of Council's opposition to trolley buses and the Mayor stated this fact had been conveyed to Dunhill.

Mr. Graham advised that the grade in some areas was 12.5% which would make it unusable for diesel buses.

A question was asked on the total time of development and the answer given was a 3 year time period.

Ald. Sekora inquired as to what population and number of vehicles would be in the project and the estimate given was 7,400 people with no definite figure on number of vehicles.

That staff be authorized to prepare a Development Area By-law for presentation to Council for debate.


A Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of the District of Coquitlam convened in the CouncilChambers, 1111 Brunette Avenue, Coquitlam, B.C. on Tuesday, June 17th, 1975 at 7:30 p.m. with all members of Council present save Alderman Gilmore, Alderman Filiatrault and Mayor Tonn. Members of staff present were the Municipal Manager, Planning Director, Municipal Solicitor and the Municipal Clerk

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

At 7:45 p.m. the Clerk called the meeting to order.

MOVED BY ALD. SEKORA SECONDED BY ALD. GARRISON:

950 That Ald. Bewley act as Chairman of the meeting.



CARRIED

The Chairman then pointed out that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Model Noise By-Law as presented by the Regional District along with the brief of the S.P.E.C. and that the meeting would be privileged to receive the opinions of Dr. John Bladerwich, Medical Health Officer for the District. The Manager stated that he had expressed the thanks of the Council to the G.V.R.D. for the Model Noise By-Law as well as principles and objectives which formed the guidelines used by the G.V.R.D. Technical Subcommittee which had been circulated to Dr. Bladerwich and Members of Council, but as to the number of municipalities in the Lower Mainland who have adopted such a by-law he was not able to state.

Dr. John Bladerwich then addressed Council and stated that Burnaby has adopted the Model By-Law, Vancouver and New Westminster are considering. Upon questioning he was not able to state the attitude of the City of Port Moody and the City of Port Coquitlam in regard to the by-law.

During the discussion the Dr. stated that 90 decibels, which is considered high, has been reduced to 85 and that industry is interested for the dollar value as to the health of their employees and will go along with the 85 decibles.

The Dr. stated that the major points of the by-law were:

1. Enforcement, which he had found that the Provincial Government in Ontario did not consider of high priority, for like the Vector Control Officer, an officer would be hired to find the noise level and later pointed out that the whole of the area would be classified as activity zoned or quiet zoned and the Council would then determine what level would be permitted in the respective zones. The equipment could be on loan for the first few months from Burnaby so that the hiring of personnel and training would be the first consideration.

Discussions followed on the interpretation of Section 13 and 14 as well as 5 and 12 regarding distance that the measurement is taken and the 20 feet from highways as compared in residential area to the real property line.

Dr. Bladerwich stated that the inspector would be an employee, as in Burnaby the Health Inspector performs the duties.

Tuesday, June 17th, 1975 Special Council Meeting, cont'd.

The Solicitor discussed the question of evidence and the opinion of a further expert and the Dr. stated that in Burnaby when the by-law had been challenged the Inspector answered them and it was accepted by the judge.

The Manager again pointed out the activity zone and the quiet zone stating that the definition tied the matter to zoning and that the balance would be up to administration jurisdiction at which time the Dr. stated that that is why such survey is needed and carried out in advance to the finalizing of the by-law.

The representative of S.P.E.C. confirmed the question of quiet and activity zones and were concerned on the question of curfews and construction on Sunday. Alderman Garrison then asked the Solicitor if the enforcement of this proposed by-law regarding Sunday curfews may bridge the Provincial legislation and the Solicitor replied that in cases such as this he figured it could be enforced, and went on to point out that corroboration by measurement and the quiet of the neighbourhood was the two criteria.

The Doctor explained that the first step would be to have the survey carried out so that the Council could designate levels and zones and as in Burnaby the by-law was passed in February and enforcement was delayed until June of this year.

The Planning Director brought up the question of surveys and the one conducted two years ago which the Doctor stated would have to be updated to be more current in the noise pattern.

Alderman Howarth brought up the question of zoning levels and the permissible measurements up to a period of ten years and asked the Solicitor what would take place if the Municipality or the G.V.R.D. sought to speed up the timetable. The Solicitor answered by stating that the G.V.R.D. would co-ordinate while the Municipality would rescind and amend the by-law.

His Worship Mayor J.L. Tonn appeared at the meeting.

The representative from S.P.E.C. then made the appeal for curfew 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. or 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. so as to control construction and no construction on Sundays unless in emergency and referred to page 3 of Dr. Bonham's report to deal with this matter of noise on Sundays. Alderman Howarth then referred to the industrial noise which is a continuous situation as against the mower and power saw which is used only a portion of the year and sought a clear definition of the daytime Sections 3 and 4. He also stated that there was a difference between Dr. Bonham and the S.P.E.C. re penalties and what the Provincial Statutes allow. The Solicitor replied \$500.00 or six months by enforcement.

The Doctor then stated that the noise at property line was not considered great while 90% of the measurements was in connection with traffic on the highway.

The meeting then discussed in detail the budgetary considerations such as hiring of personnel, buying of equipment along with the length of time between the by-law survey and enforcement.

It was estimated by the Doctor that six months would elapse between the by-law and enforcement with a \$4,500.00 equipment cost.
