Mayor Tonn made reference to a letter from Grace M. McCarthy, dated February 1, 1979 in which she made reference to a saving being realized by Coquitlam in the amount of \$226,293.12, as a result of the Provincial Government's decision to limit the increase in per capita charges for social service costs to an increase of 5 cents per capita instead of 40 cents an increase of 5 cents per capita instead of 40 cents per capita to assist the Municipality in achieving the five per cent guideline for budget increases.

Mayor Tonn stated that the welfare per capital charges for 1978 to the District of Coquitlam amounted to \$672,223.00 and with the increased charges will mean a contribution of \$697,182.48 in 1979. The Mayor stated that to advise that by increasing the rate by only 5% means a saving to the Municipality does not make sense as you cannot save on something which has shown an increase instead of a decrease.

The Mayor further suggested that as the Municipality does not have any say in the distribution of welfare funds, the total cost of welfare should be removed from property taxes and this would then mean a true saving to Municipal taxpayers.

ALDERMAN W.A. CAMPBELL JACK CEWE LTD. - GRAVEL PIT "M"

Ald. Campbell advised Council that he had received reports of discharges of sedimentation reaching watercourses from "Pit M" operated by Jack Cewe Ltd. and had visited the site to determine the extent of the reported problem. He advised that he had observed the operation and the discharge personally and was of the opinion that Council should take action to suspend operations until such time as the problems relative to discharge could be rectified.

MOVED BY ALD. CAMPBELL SECONDED BY ALD. PARKS

That the permit issued to Jack Cewe Ltd. by the Nes District of Coquitlam to remove gravel from Municipal property, commonly referred to as "Pit M", be suspended until such time as the Firm cleans up the operation and is prepared to meet the standards relative to suspended solids discharged into a watercourse as set

Alderman Parks thanked the Engineering Department for their weekly tabled report regarding frost and damage repair to roadways in the District and advised that he has received a flood of calls from concerned residents with regard to the "state of road conditions". He felt residents should be made aware that the Engineering Department are constantly keeping under surveillance the conditions of our roadways. Alderman Bewley also indicated that he has received a number of calls in the same regard. Mr. Phillips, Municipal Engineer, stated that we have not yet seen the end of the frost and hopefully in a week, the Engineering Department should be in a position to determine the extent of damage to our roads.

ALDERMAN GARRISON COQUITLAM TOWN CENTRE

Ald. Garrison asked that the Mayor request from the firm of Torresan/Rose a commitment as to which staff person would be assigned to the Coquitlam Town Centre Project and it should be made clear to the firm of Torresan/Rose that the District of Coquitlam is expecting a senior staff person to be assigned to this account.

ALDERMAN GARRISON NOTICE OF MOTION - COQUITLAM TOWN CENTRE

Ald. Garrison presented the following "Notice of Motion" to be discussed at the next meeting of Council.

"Whereas the Coquitlam Town Centre will involve hundreds of millions of dollars in investments;

And Whereas, the Coquitlam Town Centre will provide a sound economic base, not just to this Municipality, but as well, to the entire Province of British Columbia;

And Whereas the Coquitlam Town Centre will have a profound impact on the future development of the Fraser Valley, especially the North Shore;

Therefore, be it resolved that the District of Coquitlam make adequate provision in its forth-coming budget for the retention of a person who would have suitable qualifications to act as an Industrial Development Officer and that a report be prepared on the availability and probably cost of hiring an Industrial Development Officer."

Alderman Garrison, as well, requested that Mayor Tonn determine from Dick Mann and from the firm Torresan/Rose any information they can provide with regards to the qualifications required of an industrial Development Officer and the probable availability and cost of hiring such an Officer.

A special service would be held on Tuesday, February 27th, 1979 at 3.00 p.m. at Christchurch Cathedral on Burrard and Georgia in Vancouver.

DELEGATION - GRAVEL REMOVAL OPERATIONS -PIT M - RESOLUTION 190,1979

Mayor Tonn advised that he, together with Mr. Castillou and Mr. Thomas visited "Pit M" on Tuesday, February 13th, 1979 and met with Mr. Cewe and representatives of Jack Cewe Ltd on site; As a result of this inspection Mayor Tonn felt it advisable that prior to action being taken on resolution 190, 1979 members of Council should discuss the situation directly with

Jack Cewe, representatives from Crippen Engineering and representatives from the Department of Fisheries.

Mr. Thomas of Crippen Engineering addressed Council and read from a report which he is drafting and which will be forwarded to the Municipal Engineer which explains the conditions existing in the location of "Pit M".

Mr. Thomas advised that in his opinion to suspend operation of Jack Cewe Ltd within "Pit M" would not cause the silting problem to disappear as the water would still flow through the gravel pit and there would be no one available to correct any problems which would again occur as a result of further rains.

Mr. Thomas advised that at the time the problem occurred the Pit was not in operation and had been closed for some time due to frozen ground, thus indicating that the problem would re-occur even if operations did not again commence.

Dr. A. Tamburi, Head of the River Section of Western Canada Hydraulic Laboratories, addressed Council and advised of the problems which occur when a Pit is cut into a side hill interupting the flow of a stream. He advised that erosion progresses up a stream as a result and thus to correct the problem of erosion the stream must be intercepted above the point of erosion and either diverted or enclosed. Dr. Tamburi also discussed some technical aspects relative to silt carrying capacity of rivers. The Doctor advised that the situation in this area is basically an engineering problem, engineering solutions exist. However, unless a thorough study is done any solution is piecemeal and shotgun and it is very unlikely to be the optimum solution.

Mr. Jack Cewe addressed Council and advised that he requires one year to solve the problems existing at the present time, which time will allow the construction of a proper catchment basin to contain water which flows through the Pit. Mr. Cewe also read to Council a letter dated February 26th, 1979 outlining the history of his operations on Pipeline Road and the contributions made to the community by his company.

Mr. B. Graham, a Biologist with Habitat Protection of Fisheries and Marine Services also addressed Council and advised that in general, with respect to the silt problems, on the Coquitlam River, they concur directly with the Coquitlam River Water Management Report and feel the proper responsibility for the gravel mining operations lies with the Department of Mines and Petroleum Resources especially related to Sections 10 and 11 of the Mines Reclamation Act.

Mr. Graham advised that at the present time the Ministry has verbally agreed to assume responsibility for the gravel mining operations in the Valley and has subsequently been reviewing with some of the Operators detailed engineering plans for the gravel operations which his Department will be viewing in co-operation with the Department of Mines.

Council were also advised by Mr. Graham that his Department agreed wholeheartedly with the concept of separation of the natural drainage courses from the existing pit operations and it is their understanding that this does appear technically feasible.

Mr. Graham further advised that there appears to be some confusion as to whether the Ministry of Mines can proceed under Section 11 of the Mines Reclamation Act because of action supposedly taken in 1969 by the Municipality requesting the opportunity to take over the reclamation section as they related to the gravel mining operations. Until this request is rescinded by the Municipality the Ministry cannot take over and proceed to institute Section 11 of the Mines Reclamation Act.

The Mayor then advised that Resolution 190, 1979 was being returned to Council pursuant to Section 180 of the Municipal Act for reconsideration.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN PARKS SECONDED BY ALDERMAN ROBINSON

That Council table the reconsideration of Resolution 190, 1979 until such time as Mr. Thomas of Crippen Engineering, in concert with Dr. Tamburi of Western Canada Hydraulics Laboratories, representatives of the Department of Fisheries and Department of Mines meet with Jack Cewe Ltd. to discuss and place before Council immediate steps which can be taken to assist the situation at "Pit M" and as well provide long term solutions which will be acceptable, not only to the Municipality, but as well, to the Departments of Fisheries and Mines and to Jack Cewe Ltd. and further that a report in this matter be placed before Council on March 12th, 1979 regardless of whether a complete report is available at that time.

Mr. Ewen explained that the practise of aerial spraying is allowed in Richmond, Pitt Meadows and Port Coquitlam and his property border Port Coquitlam. Each year his neighbours aerial spray their crops, using the same airspace that would be required if Coquitlam allowed aerial spraying of his crops.

Mr. Ewen continued by saying that the berries should be sprayed twice a year and the time is fast approaching when the berries should be sprayed. He pointed out that if aerial spraying was not allowed, then hand spraying would be carried out, and that the use of the fungicide, Funginex, would still be used. Aerial spraying of the blueberry crop would be a far more efficient way than hand spraying as it covers a larger area and more accurately sprays, thus reducing the possibility of the Mummy-berry disease. Mr. Ewen added that the Funginex was not harmful. Alderman Campbell drew Mr. Ewen's attention to the registration data for funginess and quoted various precautions when using this fungicide, such as:- harmful if swallowed; do not inhale spray mist; avoid contact with skin and eyes, etc.

Various questions were posed to Mr. Ewen with regard to the safety of this fungicide, and Mr. Ewen reiterated that it was safe to spray the blueberry bushes with Funginex.

<u>Parking Facilities</u> - Residents do not want student or staff parking on shoulder of road in front of homes. This can present a hazard to home-owners getting in and out of their driveways. Douglas College should provide ample free campus parking with overflow area.

Entrance and Exits - We feel the main "Entrance" should be from King Albert Street. This street has angle parking and is a much wider street than Winslow. Another factor, King Albert does not have the flow of traffic that Winslow has. Exits should lead to both Gatensbury and Winslow. In summation we hope that these anticipated problems will be properly dealt with."

Mrs. Budde elaborated on the contents of the petition and advised that in a conversation with Mr. Smith, Secretary Treasurer of the School Board, she had been advised that the imposition of parking regulations on streets was the responsibility of the Municipality. The main area of concern Mrs. Budde advised, was the north side of Winslow Avenue and the restricted vision caused by cars parking in this area.

Members of Council also expressed some concern relative to parking on other adjacent streets, such as Porter Street and were of the opinion that the Traffic Section of the Engineering Department should investigate the flow of traffic in the vicinity of Winslow School and provide a report to Council on the matter.

The proposed Court House will consist of a four-court room building of approximately 40,000 sq. ft. It will house the criminal courts and it will be open in about two years. The B.C. Buildings Corporation has entered into negotiations with the District of Coquitlam for the acquisition of a court house site. It is within the region of the Coquitlam Town Centre and subject to final negotiations with the District and with the hope that the negotiations will be completed in the very near future, construction could start as early as 1980 with occupancy late in 1981. McCarter, Nairne & Partners have been named as the project architects and upon finalization of the site agreement and related particulars, work will start on the preliminary drawparticulars, work will start on the preliminary drawings as soon as possible. In a little more detail, Mr. Gardom announced the program calls for the building to contain the four court rooms, plus one hearing room, ancilary space, including accommodation for judges, court administrator, law library, sheriffs' services and probation offices. It will house about 75 permanent staff when completed and it will employ about 100 people staff when completed and it will employ about 100 people during the two year construction period. Mr. Gardom expressed his appreciation to Mr. G. Kerster, M.L.A., for his continued interest and continued efforts and for his strong support of this proposal. He also expressed his thanks to the community and his cabinet colleages in agreeing with the determination of priority to get this matter off the ground. He commented on the present facilities, located in the two buildings, on Christmas Way and Westwood St., that they no longer were adequate to serve our rapidly expanding community. The construction to serve our rapidly expanding community. The constitution of this new court complex will eliminate the present crowding problem and will provide the community with excellent court room facilities now and for many years to come. Mr. Gardom said it was a pleasure, an honour and a delight to be present to make this announcement and he thanked Mayor Tonn and Members of Council for their courtesy.

of the Gas Site on Como Lake Road and Spuraway by B.C.
Hydro.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MAYOR J.L. TONN MOTORIZED RECREATION IN GREATER VANCOUVER AREA

Mayor Tonn advised Council that he had just received a copy of the "Motorized Task Force Report" prepared by the Simon Fraser University Geography Department, which dealt with desirable sites for motorized recreation consisting of four wheel drive vehicles and trail bikes. Council were informed that two sites recommended highly by the study were:

Priority No. 1

Eagle Ridge North

Priority No. 7

Eagle Ridge South

Also mentioned as a site was the Jack Cewe Gravel Pit which was given Priority No. 16.

Alderman Robinson brought up the matter of the provision of handicap parking at the new Coquitlam Shopping Centre Complex and requested that the Developers be reminded of this provision. Mayor Tonn advised Council that the Developers, by way of letter, had indicated to the District that they were prepared to make provision for handicap parking spaces and for the necessary ancilliary ramps to allow access itself.

Alderman Robinson indicated that he has received a number of telephone calls from concerned parents regarding the question of safety of children attending school, while the landfill operation is to take place on 796 Adiron Street. He requested that supervision be provided by the Engineering Department and that the school in this vicinity be notified of the landfill operation to take place, and in turn, the school notify the parents. Mayor Tonn advised that he would look into the matter of providing supervision for the students during this operation.

That the Principal of Miller Park Elementary School be advised of the date when landfill operations will commence at 796 Adiron Avenue in order that he may be able to advise parents of students of the hazardous conditions that can prevail during landfill operations.

ALDERMAN B.T.H. ROBINSON DOGWOOD PAVILION - BUS SHELTERS

Alderman Robinson requested that Seaboard Advertising expedite the erection of the bus shelter at Dogwood Pavilion for the senior citizens. Mayor Tonn advised that this request would be seen to as soon as the matter of insurance has been cleared up.

ALDERMAN W. CAMPBELL EDWARDS ROAD

Ald. Campbell informed Council that he has received calls from residents on Edwards Road requesting that our Engineering Department not proceed with the road repairs and paving, as they feel this work would in turn raise their taxes and it would invite more traffic. Mr. Phillips, Municipal Engineer, indicated he had been further advised by the concerned residents that they would withdraw their disapproval of the proposed road repairs in writing. As of this date, the Engineering Department had not received a letter from the citizens. Mr. Phillips stated that it would be necessary to repair the culverts crossing the road in any case and as well some work on the road bed would have to be done.

ALDERMAN W. CAMPBELL TENNIS PROGRAMME

Alderman Campbell informed council that had received a complaint from a resident of the east end of the Municipality advising that a tennis programme proposed by a school in the area, to give lessons to the youth of the area, had been refused by the Municipality, as there was no time available at the LaFarge tennis courts. As a result of this refusal, he advised the instructor had begun a programme in New Westminster and students from the east end wishing instruction were told they would have to come to the central sports complex.

Mr. Cunnings informed Council that the programme being proposed was not a community or school programme, but a programme for which students would be charged by a private instructor. The Municipality was not approached with respect to the programme, but that the Coquitlam Tennis Club was approached for some of their allotted time. General playing time is available for the residents of the area Mr. Cunnings advised.

ALDERMAN B.T.H. ROBINSON R.C.M.P. YOUTH REPORT

Alderman Robinson requested that Mr. R.W. Galbraith, Inspector, R.C.M.P., Coquitlam Detachment, provide a more detailed report on youth-related crimes. The Municipal Manager informed Council that he has requested such a detailed report and will again repeat his request.

MANUAL TRAFFIC LIGHT-BLUE MOUNTAIN STREET

Mayor Tonn requested that the Engineering Department and Fire Department report back to Council with a recommendation on the installation of a manually operated traffic light for fire vehicles at Blue Mountain Street and Alderson Avenue.

ALDERMAN L. GARRISON PARKING SPACES - DOUGLAS COLLEGE

Alderman Garrison made reference to the letter received from Mr. R.C. Smith, Secretary-Treasurer, S.D. No. 43 (Coquitlam) and requested clarification from the School District that the clause providing parking spaces read "that the College must provide 4/10ths of a parking space for each student enrolled and staff member assigned to Douglas College". Mayor Tonn reassured Alderman Garrison that there would be provision for 4/10ths of a parking space provided for each student enrolled and each staff member assigned.

Mayor Tonn welcomed Mr. Clements to the meeting. Mr. Clements demonstrated for the benefit of Council and persons in the Gallery the type of trap legally allowed to be used in the Province of B.C. He referred to this trap as a Leg Hold Trap. Mr. Clements asked Council to give consideration to the banning of the use of these traps within the District of Coquitlam. He added that other areas within the Province have banned the use of Leg Hold Traps, for example, the District of Powell River and North Vancouver. He indicated that the City of Nanaimo and Victoria are giving consideration to the banning of the Leg Hold Trap.

Persons wishing to trap fur bearing animals must obtain a licence, however, persons wishing to trap domestic animals do not require a licence, and can, in fact, obtain the traps from department stores. Unfortunately, within the Province of B.C. because there is no alternative to the Leg Hold Trap, this type of trapping is allowed.

Mr. Clements advised that fur bearing animals within this Province are the responsibility of the Fish and Wildlife Branch. Should the public encounter difficulties with fur bearing animals, then they should contact the Fish and Wildlife Branch to enable appropriate action to be taken.

Council members posed various questions to Mr. Clements, and in particular, they sought clarification with regard to who would enforce a by-law banning the use of leg hold traps within the District of Coquitlam if such a by-law was passed? Alderman Campbell commented that the onus to enforce such a by-law should be placed on the Fish and Wildlife Branch. Mr. Clements advised that the Fish and Wildlife Branch would only concern themselves with fur bearing animals and would not concern themselves with domestic animals.

UPDATE ON FUTURE PLANS FOR MINNEKHADA FARM DELEGATION MR. G. GRAM, PROVINCIAL AGRICULTURAL LAND COMMISSION & MR. D. SANDS, MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

Mayor Tonn welcome Mr. Gram and Mr. Sands to the meeting. Mr. Gram advised Council that they wished to give Council a capsuled update on future plans for Minnekhada Farm lands.

Mr. Gram commented that the Commission struck to study these lands has worked closely with the Ministry of Agriculture to determine priorities and plans with respect to the farm land property. Mr. Gram explained that the total acreage of the Minnekhada Farm land amounted to 1028.04 acres; the acreage under agricultural lease amounted to 717.47 acres. He further advised that the Upland acreage with the Lieutenant Governor's Home constituted 310.57 acres.

He explained that the Commission gave the Ministry of Agriculture the task of looking at this property and establishing recommendations with respect to the best possible usage c° the acreage under the agricultural lease program.

Mr. Gram explained that with regard to the agricultural lease program there are four proposed lease units in the agricultural leasing program to be developed for the following:

(1) Blueberry and vegetable unit	222.86 acres
(2) Blueberry unit	181.61 acres
(3) Purebred beef unit	198.78 acres
(4) Standardbred horse breeding unit	114.22 acres

The leasing program will commence August 1st, 1979.

He commented that the Provincial Agricultural Land Commission has supplied \$75,000 for some basic drainage work on the farm. This will include clearing and dredging the major drainage canals and culvert installations. The individual lessees will be responsible for drainage of the land under their lease. The Constractors for the Commission drainage work commence July 3rd, 1979.

Council Members posed various questions, and in particular Alderman Robinson mentioned the recently passed By-Law in regard to the use of Pesticides and Herbicides in the District of Coquitlam. Mr. Gram commented that the Ministry of Agriculture would comply with these By-Laws.

Mayor Tonn commented that Council would like to be involved with regard to discussions on the Lieutenant Governor's Home and acreage. He suggested that any persons in the Gallery wishing to speak with Mr. Grand Mr. Sands with regard to the use of the Minnekhada Farm lands should feel free to do so, and suggested they use the adjacent Committe-Room for such a purpose.

He stated that the Police were notified and a number of tickets were issued but were then withdrawn under Section 8 of By-Law 424 which allows trucks to haul through a residential area if it is for local delivery. He requested that some action be taken to prevent the trucks that are not making local deliveries from going through this residential area.

Mayor Tonn reported that he felt the R.C.M.P. would be able to verify whether or not the trucks are making local deliveries and they could pick these truckers up very quickly. He stated that he would notify the R.C.M.P. of this problem immediately.

ALDERMAN ROBINSON - NIGHT LETTER TO PAULINE JEWETT

Alderman Robinson informed Council that he had expressed concern previously regarding the fact that Pauline Jewett had not replied to the night letter Council sent her regarding the Municipal Council's position on high mortgage rates. He went on to state that Mrs. Jewett's constituency office has now informed him that as far as they know, Mrs. Jewett did not receive this night letter.

INAUGURAL SPEECH OF MAYOR JAMES L. TONN

Your Honour Judge Husband, Reverend Mandich, members of Council, honoured guests, ladies and gentlemen,

I will firstly touch upon the developments which we have experienced during 1979 and will endeavour to gaze into 1980 on what is in store for our municipality.

The comparative building permits issued from 1978 of \$51,737,000.00 will be surpassed by approximately 18% for the full year of 1979 to a value of approximately \$60M. The primary source of that development is in the area of residential permits and the comparative figures there are, during 1978, a total of \$17,060,000.00 and for 1979 approximately \$40M; almost one and a half times greater than for the previous year.

Commercial building permits, although appearing to drop behind from 1978 still reflect a steady rate of commercial growth and also industrial growth for the past year.

What does all this mean to the taxpayer? It means additional revenues spread out over a larger tax base, so that the impact of taxation is, in essence, diminishing because of the numbers involved. With the economy in the apparent state that it is now, predictions for 1980 will be vague at the best, but if the economy continues at the same level and interest rates for mortgage purposes drop, we can anticipate a greater issuance of building permits for 1980.

As Council is aware there has been much discussion over the past three years on the proposition of a drainage utility, and I will be asking Council to review the

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drainage utility program so that initial work can get underway on seeing the ditches eliminated in this municipality. This will definitely be a long term project, but I believe, we can begin in 1980, but with the clear understanding that this municipality will not take a position of being unreasonable in taxation for the utility, so that people on a fixed income are not placed in a position of being taxed out of their homes, and further that borrowing for major projects in the Municipality will be minimal during this period of high interest rates. I feel that this is in the best interests of the Municipality, and although our wants may be one thing, our commitment will be based on our ability to pay on a reasonable basis.

I am further asking the Planning and Development Committee to review immediately our bonding policies pertaining to cash deposits for bonding services and the utilization of clean irrevocable letters of credit. With interest rates as high as they are today, this must be reviewed, as the interest in securing this bonding is to the point where it is highly significant in the cost of both providing residential properties and also reflects in the price of commodities.

It is my hope that this Council will commit itself during our budget deliberations to an increase in municipal expenditures in the neighbourhood of 6-7%, recognizing again the financial constraints and interest rate level and will provide the same level of service that our citizens have enjoyed during the past year.

There will be a continuation of major road works during 1980 as our referendum funds for road construction will be expanded and during 1980 the replacement of the two lane portion of Como Lake Avenue and the removal of the impediment on Clarke Road will take place in preparation for a future referendum probably two to three years away, to see the completion of Como Lake Avenue to a full four lane facility to provide a safe and easy flow of traffic for our citizens.

It is anticipated that other major works will be proposed during the 1980 budget discussions and will, of course, be announced at that time.

Our main thrust for development has been in the town centre area and north of the Barnet Highway. It is envisaged that this will continue and the provision of Hoy Creek as a major spawning channel will be enhanced as a result of the diversion program which was approved this year by the Municipality.

I would now like to announce the committees established under Section 179 of the Municipal Act, and they are comprised as follows:

(1) PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Alderman L. Garrison, Chairman Alderman B. Robinson, Deputy Chairman Alderman J. Parks

(2) PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

Alderman L. Sekora, Chairman Alderman R. Mitchuk, Deputy Chairman Alderman L. Bewley

(3) PARKS AND RECREATION REFERENDUM PLANNING COMMITTEE

Alderman L Bewley, Chairman Alderman L. Sekora Alderman B. Robinson

(4) STADIUM COMMITTEE

Mayor J.L. Tonn, Chairman Alderman L. Garrison Alderman J. Parks Alderman L. Sekora

The terms of reference and procedures covering these standing committees will be exactly the same as for 1979. I have requested the Municipal Clerk to provide the terms of reference to each member of Council so that they can clearly understand the role of their committee.

It has been brought to my attention by a number of citizens in this municipality their concern over election procedures which see an annual election in this municipality for alternating members of Council and School Trustees, and I would advise Council that it is my intention to place before them in early January 1980 a by-law which will change our municipal election procedure to a biennial basis and as a result request the School Board to consider the same by-law so that municipal elections for both members of Council and School Trustees will take place every two years and hopefully stimulate interest in municipal government and in the operation of the School Board and make the electorate more aware of their responsibilities and duties within the community.

There are a number of vacancies and new appointments to be filled by representatives of the public. These appointments are made by Council and I would request any members of the public who wish to assist their community in this endeavour to communicate to Council before January 1st, 1980, expressing their interests and a brief outline of their background and early in January Council will then review the appointments of the public and will make new appointments and re-appointments where they are necessary.

In the past it has been extremely difficult to obtain the names of individuals to serve on these committees, and I can only state to the citizens of this community, that it is extremely important that members of this community become involved and serve their community in any way they can, so as to continue the status of this municipality as an outstanding place in which to live and raise our children.

In conclusion, I would be remiss if I did not express my sincere thanks to the members of staff for their co-operation and assistance during this past year and in particular to the Municipal Manager and Department Heads, who spend many hours preparing information and reports for Council so that reasonable decisions can be made.

I would also like to express my sincere thanks to Alderman Bill Campbell for his efforts during his two years on Council and to wish him well in his new endeavours. I would welcome our newly elected Alderman, Ray Mitchuk. I know he will enjoy his term of office and will be an asset to the Council.

Lastly, a very special thank you to Judge Husband and to Reverend Mandich for participating in our Inaugural Meeting and taking the time out of a very busy schedule to be here.
