 - e) That the City agrees generally to the arrangements proposed to implement the Strategy, provided that:
 - the arrangements are seen as an interim phase, pending evolution of more effective arrangements;
 - the proposed partnership agreements include agreements with the relevant Provincial agencies; and
 - mechanisms are provided for Strategy adoption by the Board, voting thereon, and for the resolution of disputes between the Strategy and municipal plans;
 - f) That the City believes the province must make a reliable commitment to those municipalities asked to bear the burden of high growth, that Provincial finding for education, health and other services will be delivered in a predictable and timely fashion.

The results showed that the residents felt that Phase II of the study should have happened first or both phases should have been combined, and further that the terms of reference were too narrow. They also requested that the Alderson entrance from 666 Lougheed Hwy. be closed to traffic and any traffic egress and access to 666 Lougheed Hwy. be by way of the Lougheed Hwy. She advised Council that the parking results show a best case scenario and the real impact would be even worse as residents parking on the streets in front of their homes was not taken into account. She noted that a hotel-restaurant use would also have a great impact on the neighbourhood.

Ms. Reagh requested that zoning be examined along with designated uses in the zones. She further stated that the residents felt this was a study for Triple C Bingo and not a study for the residents of the area. On behalf of the Residents' Association, she expressed the hope that the issue of a Bingo Parlour at this location has been finally laid to rest. She informed Council that the residents of the area have a lot of input to give. Their area is very unique and any increase in traffic will have a great impact on the neighbourhood.

MAYOR SEKORA - 1994 BUDGET ADDRESS

In finalizing Coquitlam's 1994 Budget, Council decided to hold the necessary increase to 4.75 per cent.

This is somewhat lower than the six per cent increase contained in our Provisional Budget and compares favourably with the 4.9 per cent increase in 1993.

For the owner of the average residential property, the 4.75 per cent increase represents a 1994 tax increase of \$33.

But even with the increase, Coquitlam residents continue to enjoy one of the lowest taxation rates in Greater Vancouver. (1993 Property Tax Survey Slide)

As you can see, in 1993 Coquitlam had the second lowest average assessment - \$681 compared to \$1,866 for West Vancouver. Council and I have worked hard to keep our taxes down and it's obviously paid off because our rates are much lower than surrounding municipalities.

In general, population growth resulting in an increase in Coquitlam's taxation base and the use of budget surpluses has enabled us to maintain a low tax rate.

Today, residential taxation accounts for 57 per cent of Coquitlam's revenue. It wasn't that long ago that our tax base was more like 70 per cent residential and 30 per cent commercial and industrial.

I'd like to see the tax burden on our residents ease even more in the next year or so.

But in the meantime we must maintain services at current levels while also meeting the demands and needs of a growing community.

Police and Fire Protection and Leisure and Parks Services and Facilities are extremely important to our residents.

Not surprisingly, Fire and Police Protection will account for a combined 38 per cent of the City's 1994 operating expenditures.

The day to day activities of our Leisure and Parks Services have increased greatly in recent years and will account for an additional 13 per cent of total expenditures. General government will account for 12 per cent and engineering services a further 10 per cent.

We will be continuing our Ditch Elimination Program this year with the stated objective of completing the program by the end of 1995. Since the program began in 1983, we've eliminated more than 45,000 metres of ditches with the work financed from municipal land sales.

Coquitlam is in sound financial shape.

Our debt load is less than half of what it was 10 years ago. Our municipality has a net worth far in excess of what it had in 1985.

In recent years, we have provided many of the things people wanted, but we can only do so much.

We need to provide more ice time for our residents and I expect to see a start on a new arena this year. Down the road we need a new Municipal Hall, but like some of our other needs, this is not a priority.

Two new golf courses, both of which will be open to the public are in place as part of the development of Westwood Plateau. Our new City Centre Aquatic Complex is proving to be very popular.

And I am pleased to announce that Council has decided to put \$500,000 from our budget surplus into phases two and three of our Heritage Square Maillardville Redevelopment Project. Phase one was the restoration of Mackin House.

While some concern has been expressed over increases in our utility rates, we are reviewing our garbage collection and recycling services with the objective being to make these services as cost effective as possible.

We anticipate going to referendum this Fall to seek approval to borrow funds for a road improvement program and a new public safety building.

In addition, we have made a submission to the Canada/B.C. Infrastructure works program and are hopeful of receiving federal and provincial funds to help pay for needed local projects.

And I meet regularly with the Mayors of Port Moody and Port Coquitlam with a view to our cost sharing needed regional services and facilities.

With regard to fire services, we are looking to implementing a central dispatch system for the Tri-City area. And we are looking to sharing the cost of a needed new public safety building with Port Coquitlam as well as a performing arts centre for the region.

This shared approach just makes good sense.

Particularly when you consider that the Greater Vancouver Regional District is proposing to increase our local assessment by 34 per cent.

The GVRD just doesn't get it. More spending is not better these days - less spending is better!!!

As Chair of the GVRD Housing Committee, I am appalled that the GVRD's Housing Division which administers 3,204 units - of which one third are subsidized - lost \$600,000 in 1993. I am looking for ways to turn this situation around.

On Saturday, April 23rd, the City of Coquitlam hosted a public meeting to provide residents with an opportunity to discuss and critique the 1994 Provisional Budget.

Like Members of Council, I was disappointed that the turnout was so low. Even those who continually criticize the Mayor and Council and usually have so much to say about municipal matters did not appear.

But we did provide residents with the opportunity to discuss the budget, and we will do it again next year.

As Mayor, I believe in letting the people have their say. This is why I initiated the process of having Council meeting in each area of the community throughout the year.

In Coquitlam, we have no fat to cut. And we want to make sure our residents know this.

My door is always open to discuss this or any other matter. Thank you.


