



He advised that in June of 1990 when they were deliberating the viability of committing \$85 million to locate business in Coquitlam, they came to the District and got information on water and sewer rates. At that time, the rate for their business was 9 1/2 cents per cubic metre for water and 7 1/2 cents per cubic metre for sewer system. He advised that they are a significant water user and they expected a bill of around \$260,000 per year for these services. They were very discouraged to learn late last year that they had been subjected to increases in excess of 100%, 21¢ per cubic metre for water and 17¢ per cubic metre for sewer.

Mr. Belkin stated that he employs approximately 75 people in his operation. These increases will make it very difficult for his business to succeed. In retrospect he felt that if he had advised Coquitlam originally that some stability with regard to the water and sewer rates was needed, Coquitlam would probably have agreed that was a reasonable expectation.

> He explained to Council that he never dreamt their Company would experience such an increase in water and sewer rates. He asked Council to give consideration to some sort of reduction in these rates for Newstech.

SHIRLEY JONES - 2005 HILLSIDE AVE. -CLOSURE OF DAWES HILL ROAD

Shirley Jones, 2005 Hillside Avenue, appeared before Council on behalf of the residents of the area opposed to the closure of Dawes Hill Road. She advised Council that they had taken up a petition and over 300 residents had signed same in opposition to this closure.

She explained to Council that the residents of the area had understood there would be no closure of Dawes Hill without community input and advanced warning. She stated they were disappointed with the decision of this magnitude without discussion, warning or any reasons given to the residents of the area.

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MS. JUDY DONAGHEY -FRIENDS OF MUNDY PARK

Mrs. Judy Donaghey, on behalf of Friends of Mundy Park, appeared before Council to request improvements to Mundy Park and to report on the Mundy Park Fitness Festival and Fun Run/Walk which took place on April 5th, 1992.

She explained to Council that Mundy Park is the second largest park in the Lower Mainland, second only to Stanley Park. She observed that the upcoming Submission Bylaw to go to the electors on May 23rd will ask the electors to approve a sum up to \$500,000 for improvements to Como Lake Park, but there is nothing in the Submission Bylaw for improvements to Mundy Park. She advised Council that their group would like to see the Parks and Recreation Department replace and improve a trail signage in the park and also consider improvements such as washrooms.

A copy of Ms. Donaghey's presentation is on file in the Clerk's Department.

Ms. Donaghey was invited to attend a Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting to discuss her concerns.

MR. H. HURTUBISE - 121 WARRICK ST. RE: CAPE HORN AVENUE

Mr. H. Hurtubise appeared before Council to express concerns of the residents of the area regarding serious traffic problems. He advised that the closure of Dawes Hill Road will magnify the traffic problems on Cape Horn Avenue. Residents of the area are concerned about speeding, blind corners, lack of sidewalks in the area and a generally hazardous situation for children walking back and forth to He explained to Council that when there is a school. traffic accident on the Lougheed Highway or 401, traffic diverts on to Cape Horn Avenue. Due to the grade of Cape Horn Avenue in one spot, the large trucks have difficulty making it up the hill and on occasion, tow trucks have had to come in and remove them. The last time this happened, traffic was blocked on their street for several hours.

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He advised they have a letter from the Principal, Mr. G. Sieben, of Cape Horn School, in which he states he felt there was a risk to the children walking to and from school with the existing traffic pattern. Mr. Hurtubise advised there should be construction of sidewalks and widening of Cape Horn to the full width. He explained to Council that residents of the area have difficulty backing out of their driveways during peak traffic hours and Cape Horn is only one lane in width in some sections.

1992 BUDGET SPEECH - MAYOR SEKORA

In my opinion, the 1992 Municipal Budget we have approved tonight reflects very closely the Mission Statement Council drafted in January of this year.

And I can tell you our Mission Statement was not something we put together in a few minutes.

Let me read you our Mission Statement:

"Our mission is to provide open and accessible government and to deliver services so taxpayers and residents from all walks of life can enjoy a quality lifestyle in a safe and clean environment in Coquitlam."

I believe our 1992 Budget reflects our Mission Statement.

Council has worked very hard to limit the 1992 Budget increase to 5.8 per cent. This represents an increase of \$44.60 for the average homeowner.

Our new rate of taxation is 4.579 per thousand dollars of assessed value. As I said, it works out to an increase of \$44.60.

Despite the increase, Coquitlam's taxation level is still the lowest in the surrounding area.

As a Council, we have done our best to keep taxes down.

However, I can tell you that without what I feel was a blatant tax grab by our new Provincial Government in bringing in its first budget, we would have been able to hold our tax increase to just over four per cent.

There was the elimination of the supplementary homeowners' grant. There was also the reduction in Provincial Government grants. We did not receive near the amount of government grants we received last year.

Council has decided to make up for a \$436,000 shortfall by taking the money out of last year's budget surplus. It was only in this way that we could hold the tax increase to 5.8 per cent!

Of course there are other factors for the 1992 tax increase.

We have undertaken a \$4 million computer program which accounts for 2.5 per cent of the increase.

This is a program we need, a program which will allow Coquitlam to better serve business and public.

We have identified 33 areas where service will be improved. The program will enable us to provide more detailed and technical information as well as to improve document service and inventory control.

A new contract with our CUPE workers and increased public safety costs have also contributed to the budget increase.

But having allowed for these items, it is my hope that we will be able to improve our budget picture a year from now.

Managing a Municipality the size of Coquitlam is not easy.

Coquitlam is the third fastest growing Municipality in all of British Columbia. Canada census figures show Coquitlam's population grew 21.3 per cent between 1986 and 1991.

Our greatest need is for assistance in coping with the transportation problems we face because of this growth.

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But all we seem to be hearing from Victoria is talk. A few more buses here and there is not the answer.

As a Municipality we can only do so much.

I'm tired of waiting for the Provincial Government to meet its promises - past and present. Two years ago, I was appointed by the government to the Committee which was to study the proposed routes for the Coquitlam skytrain extension.

The Committee may have met all of four times. And now I am told there should be another study.

Enough is enough. I am resigning from the Committee as of this moment. I would only ask that someone tell us when they either make a decision or the first train arrives.

In the meantime, we will continue to maintain and upgrade our roads as best we can. And we will be spending another \$2 million on ditch elimination this year, as we have each year since 1983.

By 1998, all open ditches in Coquitlam will have been eliminated. And the program has been expanded this year to include road widening, curbs and gutters by way of local initiatives.

Funding for this program has come from Land Sale Reserves.

A number of new and improvement projects have been undertaken in the last few years at no cost to taxpayers.

These include the new Como Lake and Mariner and Austin and Nelson Fire Stations, the new main library on Poirier, the redevelopment of Maillardville, the new Rose Garden and Lawn Bowling facility at Dogwood Pavilion.

Dogwood Pavilion was also upgraded. The Centennial Running Track was brought back into good condition and new seats were installed in the Coquitlam Sports Centre.

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Some of these projects were carried out in preparation for Coquitlam to host the 1991 B.C. Summer Games and the B.C. Seniors' Games. Hosting these events brought \$2 million in government grants to Coquitlam and in the case of the Summer Games a \$3.5 million economic benefit to Coquitlam.

As I say, we have been able to accomplish a lot for our community without having to go to taxpayers.

But the Leisure and Recreation Bylaw to be voted on Saturday, May 23rd does require taxpayer support and I hope the people of Coquitlam will endorse the bylaw.

The whole community will benefit from the new facilities.

I truly believe that the new facilities will allow us to meet our Leisure and Recreation needs into the 21st century.

Even if the bylaw is approved, there will not be a tax increase this year, and only \$3.00 for the average homeowner in 1993. By that time, our increased population should give us an even better tax base from which to help finance these facilities.

Our long-range outlook is very good.

He explained that if Dawes Hill Road is closed to through traffic, this action will only increase the traffic pressure on surrounding streets such as Cape Horn and Mundy Streets. He also pointed out to Council that Cape Horn and Brunette Ave. have deep open ditches, unsafe curves, blind spots and narrow road widths. A copy of Mr. Holder's presentation is on file in the Clerk's Department.

DELEGATION - CLOSURE OF DAWES HILL RD., WILTSHIRE AVE., PETERSON AVE., MRS. CSUKA

If the blockade had been at the top of the hill that truck would have been delayed. By the time the second fire truck arrived from the east, the fire would have been well established.

Mrs. Ferguson advised that her third point was to question whether Dawes Hill was safe or not. The Engineer's report stated it can be negotiated safely if speed limits and traffic signs are observed. Seventy-two percent (72%) of the people who attended the public meeting were in favour of leaving the Mrs. Ferguson advised she felt there roads open. were other ways of solving this matter, such as making traffic signs more visible at the top of Dawes Hill warning of turn restrictions. She advised there has been a reduction in the left turns at Dawes Hill and Cape Horn since restrictions were put in place. By closing Dawes Hill, she advised this will just push traffic onto Cape Horn Avenue and compound the problem.

Coquitlam Council has decided to issue a tender call for construction of an indoor recreation complex on municipal property in the Coquitlam Town Centre area, it was announced Monday.

At the same time, Council announced it intends to issue a call for proposals to construct a private "Four Rinks-style" arena complex on land in the Mayfair Industrial Park adjacent to Highway 401.

And in a further announcement, Council spelled out plans for the restoration and preservation of historic Mackin House, which is part of the imaginative Heritage Square project in Maillardville.

"Council has examined and carefully analysed the long term results of the recent Leisure and Recreation Facilities Financing Bylaw," said a statement issued Monday.

"While disappointed that it did not receive the authority to borrow the funds required to proceed with the building program as proposed. Council has decided to proceed to a tender call for construction of an indoor recreation complex on municipal property at Guildford and Pinetree way."

•, •

Scaled down from the recreation complex which was the major item in the earlier building program, the revamped recreation centre will feature an eight lane, 50-metre pool with moveable floor and bulkheads along with a leisure wave pool, restaurant, physiotherapy clinic, fitness centre and public meeting rooms.

"The 50-metre pool will meet all of the concerns expressed earlier by individuals and user groups, said the Council statement. "Project components were carefully selected because they represent the community's greatest leisure needs in terms of serving the broadest possible number of people. Present facilities are booked to capacity."

Estimated cost of the indoor recreation complex is \$10 million. It is hoped construction can begin this fall.

Meanwhile, the arena complex proposal call will include a requirement to make ice time available to the municipality to ensure adequate, affordable ice facilities are available to Coquitlam residents.

"This complex will meet our immediate needs to provide recreational ice in a revenue positive manner", said the Council statement.

The restoration of Mackin House will ensure "this important historical building is preserved and ultimately available for community use".

Council's intention at this time is to house municipal staff in Mackin House rather than adding more portable units to the present Municipal Hall site.

The Heritage Square project was recently awarded an \$11,800 B. C. Heritage Trust grant. More grant funding may be available.

"Funding for the projects announced today will come from land sale reserves, general revenue, other funds deemed surplus to the municipality's current needs, and possibly from the private sector", Council said.

"The anticipated net effect is that the projects should have little or no direct cost to taxpayers. Any additional funds required for operating costs will be provided from new growth in the municipality.

"Council is considering allocating most of the anticipated \$350,000 Mackin House restoration costs from general revenue since even more monies would have to be budgeted for additional portables.

In addition, Council intends to seek any available federal and provincial government grants to help defray costs of these projects."

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



MAYOR'S ANNUAL ADDRESS

Before I list my 1993 Committee Appointments, I have some comments to make about our preliminary budget and issues currently facing Coquitlam.

As 1992 draws to a close, we can look back on a year of record growth and development.

It seems that each year, more and more people decide to make Coquitlam their home. And more and more businesses decide to locate in Coquitlam.

The construction value of all types of building permits issued in Coquitlam this year will likely total three hundred million dollars!

Three hundred million dollars is almost double the highest one year building permit total Coquitlam has ever had -- \$151 million in 1989.

Our population is growing just as fast. It now stands at 85,000 plus, an increase of more than 21 per cent since 1986.

But with growth such as we are experiencing comes a need for improved public services.

A development such as Westwood Plateau puts tremendous pressure on our already overused services. Think of what it will be like when all of the planned 4,500 units are in place!

As a Municipality, we've done our best to maintain and upgrade our facilities and services to a level meeting the increased needs of our residents.

And we will continue to do so in 1993.

At the same time, it would be nice to say the provincial government has lived up to its commitments to do something about the northeast sector traffic mess. But I don't want to lie.

The northeast sector is in gridlock. It is without doubt the worst traffic mess in the entire province.

And what does our provincial government do?

Nothing! Absolutely nothing!

Promises without action are worse than no promises at all.

Our previous government found this out the hard way, and it appears the new government is no smarter.

The widening of the Barnet Highway, the Broadway Connector and the Johnson-Mariner overpass are classic examples of our provincial government's "pass the buck as many times as you can" mentality.

Our local M.L.A.'s pass the buck to the Highways Minister. He passes the buck to the Finance Minister. The Finance Minister pleads poverty and passes the buck to the Premier.

The trouble with all this is that the buck stops there. No bucks are being spent in this area. The Barnet Highway project is now up to \$145 million... the Broadway Connector is now between two and seven million dollars while the Johnson-Mariner overpass we've been hearing about forever is up to \$40 million.

They tell me there is no money. Yet they find money to widen the highway between Kelowna and Vernon. What a joke!

A traffic jam on that road is three or four cars stopped for a light.

And now they're trying to make us pay for the transit deficit.

Talk about adding insult to injury.

Not only are the residents of this area being short changed on transit services, but now the Transit Commission is trying to hit us with a surcharge to pay for B.C. Transit's inefficient operation.

I, for one, am going to keep on fighting the provincial government until we get some action on our transportation problems.

It begins to look like that the closest we will get to skytrain is the picture of a skytrain car hanging in City Hall. Maybe we should send it back. Collect!

On one hand you have the provincial government saying it has no money to spend on essentials, yet on the other hand we have the Greater Vancouver Regional District spending over \$200,000 on a series of commercial television programs.

Someone has to put a stop to this kind of spending!

I think it's time we returned to the practice of electing GVRD Directors. It's pretty obvious that when they are appointed, most Directors just rubber stamp whatever recommendations come along.

I consider the GVRD's television expenditure to be totally unnecessary.

As a Director, I voted against spending this money. But I was the only Director to oppose the motion.

I think the time has come to take a good look at how GVRD operates, and make whatever changes are necessary.

Council and I are committed to keeping Coquitlam's expenditures in line and to holding a necessary 1993 taxation increase to less than five per cent.

While we would prefer to have no tax increase at all, this simply is not possible due to increased costs of running our Municipality. So we have tried to keep the increase as low as possible.

Last year we had a 5.8 per cent tax increase.

The 1993 increase will be 4.9 per cent, so we have more than held the line for 1993. Hopefully, we can come in under 4.9 when the budget is finalized.

It's one thing to talk restraint and quite another to practice restraint.

We all have to do what we can. And as Mayor, I can lead by example.

This is why I have turned down my two per cent salary increase approved for 1992 and have instructed the Treasurer that I do not intend to accept the further two per cent scheduled to kick in next month for 1993.

I should also point out that despite the 1993 tax increase, our tax level remains the lowest in the surrounding area.

Not surprisingly, our Municipal budget has increased. But increased revenue from all the new development helps the City keep costs down.

And while "City of Coquitlam" has a nice ring to it, Coquitlam has more than earned its new status as a City.

In the area of community improvements, our new community partners program has been well received by residents who want to improve the appearance of their neighbourhood.

This program normally works in conjunction with our Ditch Elimination Program.

Since 1988, we have spent approximately \$2 million a year on Ditch Elimination.

Our current program calls for all open ditches in Coquitlam to be eliminated by 1998. But I am not happy with this time frame and neither are those on the waiting list.

With this in mind, I intend to appoint a special committee which I hope can bring about the elimination of all open ditches by the end of 1994.

I also intend to appoint a Social Development Committee which will address Coquitlam's need for a Teen Centre, and also look at how we can provide more space for seniors in the Town Centre area.

Whether we consider eliminating a couple of meeting rooms in the new indoor recreation centre and replacing them with a Teen Centre will be up to the Committee, which will represent a cross-section of interests.

The Committee will look at these and other social issues which affect this area.

I also want to see Council continue to attend one or more ratepayer meetings in areas throughout the community. Council has been well received at this year's meetings, which provide us with an opportunity to address issues and hear area concerns.

Because of the increasing number of environmental issues which come before us, I intend to appoint both an Environmental Committee and a Public Works Committee, rather than combine them.

The other Committee matter I want to address is that I believe we should have continuity in meeting times, dates and locations -- particularly those Committees which come in regular contact with the public.

There are exceptions, of course, but generally speaking the meetings should be mutually convenient to not only the Committee Members, but to the public as well.

DELEGATION - REQUEST FOR REFUND ON DEVELOPMENT COSTS AT 838 COTTONWOOD PAID IN 1990 - MARIE RENHOLM

Mrs. Renholm appeared before Council to request a refund of development costs for 838 Cottonwood which she paid in 1990. This amounted to \$10,206.00 to pay for future construction of services at 838 Cottonwood Avenue. She advised she had paid \$4,903.00 for future roadworks, \$4,625.00 for future installation of storm sewers and \$678.00 for future ornamental street lighting.

She told Council she felt this was unfair when her neighbours are paying a flat \$100.00 per year to a maximum of \$1,900.00 for Local Improvements to their street. She requested a refund of her deposit. She stated she could not understand why she should be treated any differently than any other Coquitlam residents.

The City Engineer advised Mrs. Renholm that under the Subdivision Control Bylaw, in all cases of subdivision, the necessary works are either constructed at the time of subdivision or cash value is contributed to a trust fund. Mr. Nyberg further advised Mrs. Renholm that Council has established a policy that in the case of a single family redevelopment or subdivision, she would be exempt from Local Improvement charges.

Mayor Sekora suggested that Mrs. Renholm meet with the City Engineer to discuss this matter.

Mrs. Renholm was thanked for her presentation and left the meeting at this time.

DELEGATION - FRASER-BURRARD HOSPITAL SOCIETY -STRATEGIC PLANNING PROGRAM - J.S. FAIR, PRES. & CEO

Mr. J.S. Fair, President and CEO of Fraser-Burrard Hospital Society, appeared before Council, along with Mr. Brian Woods, the Vice-President of Finance and Administration; Mrs. Carol Klassen, Vice-President, Direct Care Services and Site Administration, Eagle Ridge Hospital; and Mr. Keith Whitmore, Planning Co-ordinator.

Mr. Fair gave a brief history of the Society and their role in the operation of the Royal Columbian and Eagle Ridge Hospitals.

Mrs. Klassen briefly reviewed the services available at Eagle Ridge Hospital including the emergency department which had an expansion of visits from an original average of 45 per day to an average of 100 per day now. She also stated they are becoming well known for their Palliative Care Unit and Grief Program for Children. There is a new building that will be opening soon for long term care patients - Eagle Ridge Manor.

Mr. Keith Whitmore and Mr. Brian Woods gave a brief slide presentation on directional and strategic planning for the next five to ten years for the Royal Columbian Hospital and the Eagle Ridge Hospital.

Councillor Parker presented the following Notice of Motion for consideration at the January 4th, 1993 Council Meeting:

"Whereas the airline industry is in a state of upheaval and remote communities are in danger of losing a necessary service; and Whereas a national cross-Canada railway has been a service that united the country, coast to coast and this report recommends removal of limits on rail line abandonment by the rail companies and de-regulation of the bus industry; and

Whereas transportation links that are not profitable will put smaller communities into instant decline and seriously threaten any economic development opportunities; and

Whereas complete subsidy withdrawal from VIA Rail is a real possibility and would make Canada the only industrialized country in the entire world without a service supportive of national objectives; and

Whereas municipal governments are faced with higher costs for infrastructure repairs of roads, bridges, etc., due to more and heavier traffic and the Federal Government has withdrawn funds to assist municipalities with urban transit expenditures.

Therefore be it resolved that the City of Coquitlam supports the FCM in calling for the Federal Government to reject the Royal Commission recommendation against all transportation subsidies and to affirm a commitment to maintaining an adequate and affordable service and prevention of any further erosion of passenger transportation.
