I appreciate that this must be paid, but how can I obtain this information from your department at the time of the transaction so that I may inform both parties of the complete costs concerning the property.

I have for reply your memo of January 11th, 1966 pertaining to your file 1491 and enquiries made by Mrs. B.M. Fry.

I have spoken to Mrs. Fry over the telephone and she advised that she took from a tax certificate that had been issued by the Tax Department that there could be no further charges which remained unpaid on a given property. I advised Mrs. Fry that a tax certificate was issued in respect of tax arrears only and that if she required additional information, she should make this known at the time she makes an enquiry.

There are standing instructions issued to the Tax Office that when an enquiry is made suggesting that they want to be apprized of any outstanding charges that there may be against a property, that such enquiries should be directed to the Engineering Department who can apprize them of same. You are no doubt aware that a great many enquiries are for tax certificates which have nothing to do with the exchange of properties, but may be for other things such as the registration of a mortgage or charge. Unless the enquirer makes clear what it is that he is asking for, the clerks cannot assume what he has in mind.




