5. Mayfair Industrial Park

The staff members present outlined to the Committee the results of a meeting that staff had held earlier in the day with Mr. Birkett and Mr. Kennedy of Marathon. At that meeting, Marathon had stated that it was their intention to proceed this year with servicing of the portions of the proposed Mayfair Park south of the freeway and east of the Ministry of Highways north/south road. However, the Board of Directors of Marathon would not approve the arrangements negotiated with the Committee in late 1976, whereby Marathon was to provide bonding by letters of credit equal to the full value of services since this would be too great a burden on Marathon's lines of credit. Marathon would still be willing to provide such bonding on the areas proposed for servicing in the next year, but for the remainder of the park, Marathon requests either that the bond amount be reduced, or that there be some alternative arrangement not affecting their debt structure to the same extent. Staff felt that consideration of reduced bonding on the residual area should be such that the reduced bond amount would still be substantial enough to be an effective incentive toward completion of the servicing by 1983-84.

The second major item raised by Marathon was that the design review provision discussed in late 1976, i.e. a restrictive covenant in the form adopted for BACM's "Eagle Ridge" development, was unacceptable to Intermodal and CP Transport.

Staff also reviewed the status of the application. A draft agreement has been received from Marathon's solicitors, but this draft has some legal problems, as well as considerable content unacceptable to the Municipality.

Re: 1977 Grant Request

Place des Arts took \$31,129.60 in students' fees in 1976. I took a sampling of students' residences during the 77 winter enrollment period which is always the heaviest. During this period 18.6% of the students enrolled resided outside the Municipality of Coquitlam. (See attached breakdown).

On the average these 18.6% students would have paid \$5,790.10 in fees. A 5% levy would bring an added \$289.50 per year. However, this figure is based on the highest enrollment session and a 12 week course enrollment, which we have only in fall and winter. Spring enrollment is for 10 weeks only and summer varies between 6 - 8 weeks and enrollment drops considerably.

You may conclude therefore that \$289.50 is the maximum sum that a 5% levy on out of municipality residents would bring.
