Sol Jackson reported that Doug and Shirley Sullivan resigned from the Committee and that the Committee should elect a Chairman and Secretary in their places. At the same time, Sol suggested that this would be an appropriate time to retire as Co-Chairman, while retaining the duties and responsibilities of the N.I.P. Co-ordinator, since the Committee has been active long enough to be confident it can carry on without a dual Chairmanship. The resignations were accepted.

Art Perreault was unanimously elected Chairman of the Maillardville N.I.P. Planning Advisory Committee. Colleen Perreault was selected to act as Secretary of the Committee subject to confirmation that she will accept.

#### MINUTES:

Minutes of the December 8, 1976 meeting were read and it was:

#### REPORTS:

Sol Jackson reported on the status of land acquisition, noting that he was particularly concerned that we did not acquire Lots 8 and 9; that Shirley and Doug Sullivan had resigned from the Committee because they were so upset that the District of Coquitlam did not acquire the two lots. Sol further reported that Council in Executive Committee authorized the Mayor to negotiate the purchase of the properties, and that the Mayor expressed his disappointment that while he attempted to save \$5,000.00, the deal fell through because the seller's Solicitor did not respond in time to the Mayor's offer to purchase at \$95,000.00 before the option to purchase at \$100,000.00 expired. When the Municipal Solicitor contacted the seller's Solicitor on November 19, 1976 he was told there was another potential purchaser available. Subsequently, the District was told that the purchaser was Mr. John Purdy who acquired Lots 8 and 9.

# REPORTS (CONT'D):

Following discussion on the above matter and related background information, and after noting that four persons present were new to the Committee, three of whom live in the N.I.P. Area, the members present decided to set aside the agenda to review and discuss the background of the Committee's priorities. A general discussion carried on at some length, after which the meeting returned to the agenda item-Reports.

Hector Viens reported that he contacted Mr. C. J. Velay and Mrs. Ferrero, owners of Lot 2 (311 and 313 Laval Square) to see if they would consider selling their property for a Neighbourhood Centre and was told that they would only be interested in selling the property if the District of Coquitlam would use it for a Neighbourhood Centre. They noted they got R.R.A.P. funds and the loan would have to be included in the purchase price. The owners said they will get an appraisal. It was agreed that Sol Jackson will write a letter confirming the N.I.P. Planning Advisory Committee's interest in the property.

40 MOVED BY MR. HOUGH SECONDED BY MR. SITTER

That we should write to all property owners in the area around Laval Square, expressing the Committee's interest in purchasing property for a Neighbourhood Centre.

# CARRIED

George Hough volunteered to prepare a draft letter for mailing out. The Committee also asked Sol Jackson to contact Mr. Vandergulik to say that we are not interested at the present time in his offer to sell Lot 19 for \$64,900.00 and Lot B for \$46,900.00. These lots are located at the edge of the N.I.P. Area on the north-west corner of Begin Street and Brunette Avenue. If other potential purchases fall through, we may again contact Mr. Vandergulik.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The date for the Public Information Meeting on Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program (R.R.A.P.) was moved forward to Thursday, January 27, 1977 at 7:30 p.m. and the location changed to the basement of Our Lady of Lourdes Church. Hector Viens will confirm the availability of the meeting place; and Sol Jackson will advertise the meeting in LeSoleil, Coquitlam Herald, the Columbian and the Enterprise, and arrange to hire people at \$5.00 per hour to prepare a mailing to absentee property owners and distribute information material to residents regarding the meeting. George Hough offered to discuss R.R.A.P. policy with Amelia Gareau and Roger Loubert before they go out to canvass the proposed enlarged N.I.P. Area No. 1 in an effort to get a good turnout of property owners to the meeting.

Sol Jackson reported regarding the Distasio Rezoning Application (Z-70-76), Lot 6, 1420 Cartier Avenue, that Council on January 10, 1977 did not accept the Land Use Committee's recommendation to further study commercial space needs in the area. On January 11, 1977 the Land Use Committee recommended to Council that staff review the Community Plan designation in the 1400 block Brunette Avenue in view of Application Z-70-76 and therefore, the Committee should be prepared to give some consideration to the Distasio application at some later time.

That the NIP Committee recommends that Council approve the first stage of a Beautification Programme for Laval Square, with the installation of storm sewerage along Laval Street from Thomas Avenue southward to the south side of Brunette Avenue to a point where a proper outfall can be constructed, and a portion of storm sewerage along the north side of Laval Square to be connected to the existing storm sewer on Cartier Street east of the Laval Square for an estimated cost of \$135,000.00.

## CARRIED

Sol Jackson suggested that Resolution No. 43 may get to the Land Use Committee on January 25, 1977 and to Council on January 31, 1977. The representatives of the Engineering Department indicated that after they receive direction from Council, and after preliminary paperwork, it would take two to three months to begin work on sewer installation.

That a letter go to CMHC stating that our proposal of a storm sewer be presented as a social beautification of Laval Square, and should not be subject to funding restrictions of their municipal house-keeping policy.

# REPORTS con't

Sol Jackson reported on the letters going out to homeowners and absentee landlords on January 20, 1977. Amelie Gareau gave the Committee an update on the door to door canvass (re RRAP Public Information Meeting). She displayed a map outlining her efforts and explained the response was good.

Roger Loubert gave a brief description of his research work in connection with preparations for the RRAP information meeting and about the Neighbourhood Improvement Programme in general. Some graphs had been prepared, visually depicting resident owners and absentee owners in NIP Area No. 1, and another graph depicting the RRAP participants spread in the area.

Roger Loubert pointed out that out of 130 lots, there were 91 residents owners, an increase of four over Roberta Redfern's previous year finding. Emphasis was made that we were talking of lots and not necessarily dwelling units on the lots.

Discussion followed concerning the work load which an NIP programme created and the Committee reviewed the situation.

That the Committee request Mayor Tonn to hold a press conference as soon as possible giving the District's support to NIP and RRAP programmes encouraging residents of the NIP area to avail themselves of benefits, and that an announcement be made giving time and place of the public meeting set for January 27, 1977, provided that the Mayor be given all necessary details.

Sol Jackson mentioned that Helen Grodeland, Douglas College Instructor, will be sending information on effective brief writing and delegate presentations to Council which could enhance our communication with Committees and Council.

Roger Loubert reported that Bob Jackson of the Port Moody Historical Society and Port Moody Museum was giving a course on museums at the Port Moody Senior Secondary School for an eight to ten week period.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Frank McDonald shared with the Committee his vision of what could become of the area. His community concept of mixing the old with the new - a village concept of shopkeepers, boutiques, craftsman shops, integrated into the neighbourhood, and where solar energy could be developed and used as a very real and dependable source of energy.

The Committee discussed how one might blend community and industry, and Frank McDonald and Roger Loubert offered to compile information for future use of the Committee.

Mr. Bouvier suggested that the Committee pursue the idea of installing signs on lawns where property owners received RRAP funds, to publicize the programme. Sol Jackson said he would pursue the matter.

Sol Jackson reported that the property acquisition is proceeding, but some delay was encountered due to the recent death of Mr. Emile Moyen, a mortgager of the property, and that the deed is expected to be conveyed to the District before March 15, 1977. He also showed sketch 8-1303B of the subdivision of the Purdy property which will result in a rectangular shaped lot for the Neighbourhood Centre.

Lloyd Kirk reported that he expected the draft Constitution and By-laws to be retyped and submitted to Glen Gallins, Assistant Municipal Solicitor, for comment and changes.

Leanore Peyton showed members a draft of a newsletter tentatively titled "Association Maillardville Bulletin" and asked for news contributions. The March 22nd meeting was attended by 27 young people in addition to the 5 delegated youths. The effect was that some 52 young people's views have been relayed to the Sub-Committee on space requirements and activities for the Centre.

After considerable discussion on a draft report on potential space requirements for the Neighbourhood Centre, it was:

Doug Sullivan reported that the building at 302 Laval Square was badly vandalized on the weekend of March 12 - 13, 1977 before the transfer of ownership was registered in the Land Registry Office on March 14, 1977; that the District's Engineering Department cut and capped the sewer line and he suggested that we check to see if there is adequate liability insurance on the property. He expressed concern that children may play on the site and hurt themselves on the debris left about. He also noted that the tenants at 1200 Cartier were asked to keep an eye on the site.

One method of getting additional records of Maillardville's past history would be to have monthly gatherings of old-timers, or regular get-togethers to honour pioneer families, where we could record discussions of earlier days. He also suggested that the Committee consider striking off an Aural History Sub-Committee or organizing an Aural History Club, and noted that this could be done before the Neighbourhood Centre is built.

Sol Jackson presented a draft budget for review. After much discussion, it was agreed to alter the 1977 Provisional Budget as follows:

- a) Expenses prior to 1976 was updated to reflect expenses prior to 1977.
- b) Subcode 100 Planning and 200 Communications, were updated.
- c) Subcode 300 Recreation, was changed to provide for an outstanding invoice by Don Vaughan and Associates and to relocate funds for Neighbourhood Centre land acquisition to-700 subcode.
- d) Subcode 400 Social, now shows a cost estimate for the construction of a Neighbourhood Centre.
- e) Subcode 500 Enginæring, was left without funds because, while Council authorized a request to C.M.H.C. for \$135,000 expenditure on storm sewers as part of Laval Square Improvements, with cost sharing based on 25% Municipal, 25% Provincial and 50% Federal, C.M.H.C. has not as yet responded and indications are that funding may well be 62½% Municipal, 12½% Provincial and 25% Federal. Since the budget had to be accepted by the Committee, and in view of the expressed wishes of Old Age Pensioners and Youth in the Community, a decision had to be made on the space requirements for the Centre and therefore, the Committee decided to retain \$75,000 into Subcode 600 Unallocated, for future transmittal to 400 Social, or 800 Street Beautification, as the need arises.





A discussion took place on different potential building types as well as single vs. groups of buildings. The Committee will be meeting representatives from modular unit builders and pre-fab material builders at a special meeting 7:30 p.m. April 14, 1977 in the Committee Room.

Members agreed to accept George Hough's offer to prepare any necessary or desirable public statements on behalf of the Committee, for publicity purposes. A letter from C.M.H.C. undated and received April 12, 1977, regarding its decision to fund Laval Square Storm Sewer improvements as local house-keeping, was read and received for information. The cost-sharing would be  $62\frac{1}{2}$  Municipal,  $12\frac{1}{2}$  Provincial and 25% Federal contributions. Discussion on that decidion was postponed to a later date.

#### MINUTES:

Draft minutes of the May 18, 1977 meeting were read for information.

#### REPORTS:

Sol Jackson reported that the Design Committee reviewed the preliminary plans for the Neighbourhood Centre by Dave Nichols, and generally found them acceptable, but expressed concern that exterior finishes which are critical to the overall appearance, be completed.

Doug Sullivan reported that 1200 Cartier Avenue was vacant, and the building has been secured to reduce vandalism; that apparently the tenants will be vacating 306 Laval Square by the coming weekend, June 4, 1977; that it would be advisable to open a Neighbourhood Site Office immediately; that the Planning Department is hiring three high school students for the summer to conduct a survey of commercial establishments, and the Committee has been asked about the possibility of having the students use part of 306 Laval Square as an office.

Fern Bouvier reported that the Department of the Secretary of State has hired a former Social Worker as an "animateur" responsible for community programming in Maillardville; that the Department has committed itself to hiring a community programmer for an unspecified number of years beyond 1977, and that the "animateur" requires space. He suggested that the Committee consider having her use some portion of 306 Laval Square.

George Hough mentioned that the Coquitlam Fine Arts Council was also looking for space.

MOVED BY MR. BOUVIER SECONDED BY MR. PERREAULT

That the Committee recommend to Council:

1. That the building at 306 Laval Square be made available for:

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- 1. (a) a Neighbourhood Site Office for the N.I.P. Committee;
  - (b) the summer students working out of the Planning Department; and
  - (c) the "animateur" hired by the Secretary of State
    Department as a Community Programmer in Maillardville.
- 2. That the occupancies be based on two weeks notice to vacate when necessary; and
- 3. That the student and animateur occupancies should be at no cost to the Neighbourhood Improvement Program for such items as insurance coverage and utility costs.

#### CARRIED

Members discussed the potential for salvaging as much as possible from the buildings on the site. Sol Jackson to look into potential liability involved and also into the feasibility of selling and moving the house at 306 Laval Square.

MOVED BY MR. HOUGH SECONDED BY MRS. PERREAULT

That one month prior to demolition of the buildings on the site, three weeks of salvaging by residents of the area be permitted subject to resolving the problems of liability.

# CARRIED

Dave Nichols, architect, reported on the building design as follows:

- a) The Design Committee recommended cedar siding (shakes or shingles), and that the trellis should be installed since it is an integral part of the design.
- b) The estimated cost of the building is \$280,000.00 and the Committee's proposal to get donations of material are very important goals, if the cost is to be reduced substantially.
- c) A preliminary materials list was prepared and distributed to members, noting that the Structural Engineer said he cannot use cull or used materials for structural elements of the building.
- d) The mature trees, large rhododendrons, cedars, weeping cypress and junipers must be retained and the cost will have to be included in site clearance costs.
- e) The architect needs an early estimate of "occupant loads", noting that the building will probably have high occupant loads which will require a ventilation system. The Committee should consider choosing one of four heating systems. The following installation cost estimates include plumbing and electrical work, and the annual operation cost estimates in brackets are rough but within reason:

- 1) Electrical baseboard heating with electrical ventilation systems \$42,000 (\$6,000/yr.)
- 2) Forced air coil reheat system with zoned duct coils. An electrical heated central system with possibly 12 zones \$46,000 (\$6,000/yr.).
- 3) Hot water baseboard and ventilation system with a separate boiler room about 80 sq. ft., all gas system \$52,000 (\$3,500 \$4,000/yr.) plus cost of extra space.
- 4) Hot water heating system with coil reheat and ducts. Exhaust air and make-up air \$58,000 (\$4,000/yr.).

The cheapest to operate is hot water system, and electric heating is 25% to 35% more in operating costs.

MOVED BY MR. HOUGH SECONDED BY MR. SULLIVAN

That a hot water baseboard heating and ventilation system be considered by the architect for the Neighbourhood Centre, providing that:

- a) It does not increase the cost of the building more than approximately \$12,000;
- b) inclusion of the furnace room does not jeopardize or obstruct the existing plans; and
- c) the architect, after consulting others, finds it to be the best system for the Committee's purposes.

#### **CARRIED**

The Architect mentioned that someone close to the project be given signing authority if the Project Manager's method of managing the project is approved. Sol Jackson noted that staff held a meeting on the question, that he is gathering more information on Construction Management Contracts and that a further meeting of staff will be held following which he will report to the Committee.

MOVED BY MR. HOUGH SECONDED BY MR. BOUVIER

That the meeting be adjourned.

The Committee met to hear from Mrs. Belanger about her assignment as Maillardville "animateur" or community worker; and from representatives of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish Council.

Mrs. Belanger discussed her goals of serving the french-speaking community in all Coquitlam, although most of her efforts may center around Maillardville. She will be involved mainly in programming events where the french language will be used; and she will also help people express themselves in the french language both as individuals and in groups. She will be paid by the Secretary of State's Department but will be accountable to La Socièté Francophone.

Mr. Labossiere presented members of the Committee with a written statement dated June 7, 1977, titled "A Submission to the Maillardville Neighbourhood Improvement Program Committee, by our Lady of Lourdes Parish Committee", attached to and forming part of the minutes.

The Committee discussed with the Parish representatives the request to proceed with minimal improvements to Laval Square. The Committee and Parish representatives agreed to meet again to discuss the matter, after reviewing municipal commitments regarding this work and after the N.I.P. Co-ordinator gets further information on the proposal to have a municipal storm sewer enterprise and on cost sharing arrangements for a wooden curb to retain the hill of earth and flowers on the church land at its South property line.

The meeting was adjourned.

A submission to the Maillardville Neighbourhood Improvement

Programme Committee, by Our Lady of Lourdes Parish Committee.

Mr Chairman,

We are aware and gratified with your committee's decision to build a Neighbourhood Centre to the South West side of Laval Square, facing Our Lady of Lourdes parish church. We are convinced that such an initiative was needed as this part of the Municipaly has suffered much from decay and abandonment during the course of the years.

Conscious of the need for rehabilitation in the area, our own church committees have spent many efforts to restore the Church buildings and rectory, and we can justly be proud of the present appearence of the church and dependencies now being officially considered as a historic sight.

As you are probably aware, the landscaping has also been tremendously improved around the church.

However, it would seem to us that thought should also be given to improving the roadway around Laval Square. In our estimation, some \$25,000 or more should be allocated to curb and sidewalk construction, particularly on the south side of the square, as we are presently unable to envisage proper landscaping.

It is obvious that the future Neighbourhood Centre would count on the church parking lot to take care of overflows. This we have no objection to. We have no doubt that if the Centre is to fulfill its purpose, co-operation should exist between the various community elements in the area

However, we would point out that the cost of building a neighbourhood centre may be a temptation to put as much, if not all, the monies available into the Centre itself while forgetting that the Square area is still at the open ditch stage.

#### Costs

We know, as we refer to PLAN MAILLARDVILLE report, that the costs of Storm sewers were in the neighbourhood of \$18.54 per linear foot. Curbs were \$1.98 per linear foot. Paving was \$21.76 per linear foot for a 36 foot wide road.

more

Costs have probably risen by some 25% since then. and if we have to include the cost of excavation, the whole program would probably run over the tentative figure of \$25,000, which, we think should be immediately set aside for the purpose of the improvements we are refering to.

But, we must remind you, Mr. Chairman, that under the N.I.P. program, the Federal Government would assume almost 50% of the cost, the Provincial Gov't 25%, which would probably mean an investment of \$25,000 by the Municipality for a \$100,000. program.

I hope that your committee will consider our request as a contribution to a better balanced overall improvement project. An we, as a church committee, pledge our own support and, if need be, participation to the successful carrying out of an overall neighbourhood philosophy.

He was also asked to prepare a report for the Council Meeting of July 11, 1977 for direction on alternative methods of proceeding with construction.

The Committee requested the N.I.P. Co-ordinator to ask Dave Nichols, the Project Architect, to proceed with working drawings as soon as it is feasible and also to order a costing of the project, as the Architect suggested, for approximately \$100.00.

The Committee discussed at some length the request of the delegation from the Council of Our Lady of Lourdes Church. Sol Jackson mentioned he has not been contacted by the Church Council people as they agreed to do when they had further information about their understanding of a Municipal commitment to do certain work on Laval Square. The Committee agreed to meet again with the Church Council delegation at a special meeting of the N.I.P. Committee July 6, 1977.
