#### DELEGATION - MR. JOHN PARKS, MLA

Mr. Parks thanked Council for the opportunity to address the meeting and stated that he wished to clarify and elaborate on several issues which have been the subject of discussion in press stories in the past.

With respect to the Partnership in Enterprise Program, Mr. Parks indicated that Port Moody and Port Coquitlam are about to become signatories to this project and it had been indicated that they were doing so because, not to, could mean that industrial development may be directed away from their communities. Mr. Parks stated that this was not so, however, when the Provincial Government sends out trade delegations, communities which have signed the Agreement are made known whereas other communities do not receive such recognition.

Mr. Parks did indicate that there is no sceptre hanging over the District of Coquitlam if they do not join the project, however the benefits are there and entry into the Partnership in Enterprise is open at all times.

The MLA did indicate that he has not, to date, received any direct feedback on Coquitlam's 1985 Planning Grant reapplication, however, would appreciate being copied with respect to the 1986 Application in order that he may intervene on behalf of the Municipality.

Mr. Parks spoke with respect to Maillardville redevelopment and presented to Council copies of correspondence dating back to May of 1985 which indicated his interest in the matter. He stated that the opportunity is here now for redevelopment, especially in light of the aura surrounding Expo 86 and the development of a Park and Ride Station at King Edward Street and Lougheed Highway. Mr. Parks also urged the Maillardville Redevelopment Committee to seek Provincial assistance under the heritage aspect of Maillardville and it is hopeful that the Committee will take a leading role in this matter.

Mr. Parks also spoke of the "Employment Equity Project" a program of the Federal Government under which the Como Lake United Church has undertaken to retrain unemployed and handicapped persons and was hopeful that the District of Coquitlam would have a Personnel Department identify positions within the organization that could be allocated to the handicapped or disadvantaged persons within the community.

With respect to funding for a central library facility, Mr. Parks stated that he was looking for community support to be made known to him and to others in the government in order that he can be in a better position to make a case for provincial funding. Mr. Parks requested that Council undertake an initiative to make the Coquitlam public aware of the support needed and possibly a notice sent with all employees pay cheques would be one way of gaining public awareness.

He did state that the modules constructed at Expo '86 are to be dismantled following the fair and be made available to G.V.R.D. municipalities and he is hopeful that one of the modules can be obtained to be situated somewhere in Coquitlam.

Mr. Parks also answered questions related to the Partnership in Enterprise program and dealt with some of the successes that had been achieved through this particular program. Mr. Parks indicated that he would be contacting the Ministry of Municipal Affairs in the morning and would be seeking a list of new industries which had been attracted as a result of the Partnership in Enterprise program, which he would provide to the Council of the District of Coquitlam.

DELEGATION - LETTER CARRIERS UNION OF CANADA COMMUNITY MAILBOX PROGRAM

Mr. Ron Kucy, of 1880 Pitt River Road, Port Coquitlam, addressed the Council on behalf of the Letter Carriers' Union of Canada and advised that he was here this evening to seek support from Council for the rejection of the installation of super mailboxes within the boundaries of the District of Coquitlam.

Mr. Kucy stated that his Union has a vested interest in stopping the installation of such a mail delivery service because it will mean a loss of a great number of jobs over the next short period of time as these boxes are gradually introduced into new subdivisions throughout Canada and may even replace door to door delivery in established areas.

Mr. Kucy stated that the vandalism rate of these boxes is very high, with security and litter problems being very evident. It was also pointed out that other problems could exist with the installation of such boxes with respect to site lines, utlities underground, safety, snow and ice removal problems and that these problems could be left to the Municipality to resolve.

Mr. Kucy further stated that the Letter Carriers' Alert Program which services the old and infirm will be lost if there is no more door to door delivery and that placing such boxes within new developments within a community will only be the start to eventually phasing out door to door deliver in areas that now have that service.

In response to a question from Ald. Reid, Mr. Kucy stated that his Union had not made representation at the time this matter was presented to the Canadian Federation of Municipalities at their convention early in 1986 because it had been indicated that the installation of such boxes would be a temporary measure only and that the door to door delivery would be extended into new communities as soon as possible. This, he stated, has proven to be a wrong assumption and that super boxes are no longer intended to be a temporary measure.

In response to a question from Ald. Bewley, Mr. Kucy indicated that it is possible that if the Municipality does not cooperate in the installation of the new super box, that quite possibly the postal service may continue with its placing of the old outdated green boxes throughout the Municipality.

LOCATED AT THE CORNER OF KING EDWARD AND LOUGHEED HIGHWAY, WHICH WAS OPENED LATE IN NOVEMBER, AND MANY OTHER COMMERCIAL FACILITIES.

WITH THE SUPPORT OF COUNCIL, I PLAN TO CONTINUE TO ENCOURAGE COMPANIES CONSIDERING RELOCATION TO MOVE TO COQUITLAM. WE HAVE HAD CONSIDERABLE SUCCESS IN THIS AREA, AS COQUITLAM SEEMS TO BE AN ATTRACTIVE BUSINESS LOCATION.

THE CONTINUED DEVELOPMENT OF COQUITLAM TOWN CENTRE, MAYFAIR INDUSTRIAL PARK AND THE CROWN ZELLERBACK LANDS WILL ALSO BE ENCOURAGED. THE NORTHEAST COQUITLAM COMMUNITY PLAN IS NOW IN PLACE AND SHOULD HELP FACILITATE INCREASED SERVICES AND DEVELOPMENT OF THIS AREA.

I AM WELL AWARE OF THE NEEDS OF NORTHEAST COQUITLAM AND WILL DO EVERYTHING I CAN TO HELP THIS AREA. MAILLARDVILLE IS ANOTHER AREA WHICH NEEDS ATTENTION. I WAS PLEASED WITH THE RECENT REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE MAILLARDVILLE REDEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE AND HOPE TO SEE REAL PROGRESS IN THE AREA IN 1987.

THE INCREASING COMPETITION BETWEEN MUNICIPALITIES FOR NEW BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY MAKES IT NECESSARY TO AGGRESSIVELY PURSUE DEVELOP-MENT OPPORTUNITIES. COQUITLAM WILL CONTINUE TO BE A LEADER IN ATTRACT-ING NEW BUSINESS.

### TRANSPORTATION

DESPITE THE RECENT GOVERNMENT COMMITMENT OF A SKYTRAIN EXTENSION TO COQUITLAM, I PLAN TO CONTINUE TO PRESS VICTORIA FOR AN EARLY START TO THE EXTENSION.

SKYTRAIN IS STILL THE BEST ANSWER TO OUR DISTRICT'S GROWING TRAFFIC PROBLEMS, ALTHOUGH THE NEW JOHNSON-MARINER CONNECTOR, ALSO ANNOUNCED RECENTLY, WILL HELP RELIEVE TRAFFIC CONGESTION IN THE TOWN CENTRE AREA.

### TRAFFIC AND ENFORCEMENT

WITH REGARD TO TRAFFIC, I AM INCREASINGLY CONCERNED WITH THE NUMBER OF SPEEDING VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC BYLAW VIOLATIONS IN OUR MUNICIPALITY. TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT WILL BE STEPPED UP IN 1987 THROUGH THE ADDITION OF UP TO FOUR MORE OFFICERS TO OUR RCMP FORCE AND THE ADDITION OF NINE CIVILIAN PERSONNEL OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS.

A \$1.5 MILLION EXPANSION TO OUR RCMP HEADQUARTERS WILL BE REQUIRED AS WE INCREASE FIRE AND POLICE SERVICES TO MEET THE GROWING NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY.

I MUST ALSO COMMEND THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR OUR VANDAL WATCH PROGRAM FOR THE JOB THEY HAVE DONE IN 1986.

### FIRE PROTECTION

JUST AS IMPORTANTLY, COQUITLAM'S NEW \$2.6 MILLION HEADQUARTERS FIRE STATION ON PINETREE WAY - APPROVED BY REFERENDUM IN 1984 - WILL OPEN IN JANUARY AND WILL INCLUDE THE FIRST FULL TRAINING FACILITY IN THIS AREA.

PROPERTY HAS BEEN SECURED IN THE AUSTIN-NELSON AREA FOR THE SECOND OF THREE CENTRALIZED FIRE STATIONS AND THIS \$1.5 MILLION PROJECT WILL COMMENCE IN THE NEW YEAR.

THE END RESULT WILL PROVIDE RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES WITH THE MOST UP-TO-DATE FIRE PROTECTION SERVICE ON THE LOWER MAINLAND.

OUR FIRE CHIEF, DEREK JACKSON, HAS WORKED TIRELESSLY TO BRING THIS ABOUT AND I COMMEND HIM FOR HIS EFFORTS. OUR COMMUNITY FIRE PROTECTION PROGRAM CONTINUES TO ATTRACT THE ATTENTION OF FIRE DEPARTMENTS FROM ALL OVER B.C.

### ROADS AND DITCHES

IN ADDITION TO THE ONGOING MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF OUR ROADS AND LANES, WE WILL CONTINUE OUR DITCH ELIMINATION AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM. FROM 1983 TO 1986, 5.6 MILES OF DITCHES WERE ELIMINATED. IN 1987, 2.56 MILES OF DITCHES WILL BE ELIMINATED IN MAILLARDVILLE.

# PARKS AND RECREATION

LAST WEEK'S OFFICIAL OPENING OF 10-ACRE RIVERVIEW PARK, WHICH FEATURES AN ALL-WEATHER, ILLUMINATED PLAYING FIELD, REPRESENTS THE MOST RECENT IN A NUMBER OF ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO OUR PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES. THIS FULLY DEVELOPED PARK WAS PURCHASED FROM THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT THROUGH OUR PARK ACQUISITION FUND AT NO EXTRA COST TO TAXPAYERS.

THIS NEW PARK COULD WELL BE THE PROTOTYPE OF THE PARK WE HOPE WILL BE INCLUDED WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF WESTWOOD HEIGHTS - OR WESTWOOD PLATEAU AS IT IS BETTER KNOWN - WHICH IS PROCEEDING FIVE YEARS AHEAD OF SCHEDULE.

NEEDED IMPROVEMENTS TO BURQUITLAM, BLUE MOUNTAIN, MACKIN AND MARINER PARKS AS WELL AS THE COQUITLAM RECREATION CENTRE AND DOGWOOD PAVILION HAVE TAKEN PLACE IN THE LAST YEAR. THESE IMPROVEMENTS WERE PAID FOR FROM OUR RESERVE FUND AND WERE NOT A TAX ITEM.

ADDITIONAL PARK MAINTENANCE AND DEVELOPMENT WILL TAKE PLACE IN 1987.

CONSTRUCTION OF THE TOWN CENTRE SPORTS COMPLEX APPROVED EARLIER BY VOTERS WILL COMMENCE NEXT SPRING WITH COMPLETION EXPECTED IN THE FALL.

MAINTENANCE OF PARKS AND RECREATION WILL INCREASE IN 1987 WITH THE LATE SPRING HIRING OF 11 PART-TIME EMPLOYEES INSTEAD OF SIX AS IN THE PAST. AS OF NOW, WE PLAN TO SPEND A MINIMUM OF \$200,000 ON PARKS AND RECREATION MAINTENANCE.

IN MY INAUGURAL ADDRESS OF LAST YEAR, I STATED MY INTENTION TO APPOINT A CITIZENS' COMMITTEE TO STUDY AND REPORT ON THE STATE OF OUR PLAYING FIELDS.

I CONGRATULATE THE COMMITTEE, CHAIRED BY DAVE WHITE, ON ITS TIRELESS EFFORTS IN INTRODUCING A DETAILED REPORT CONTAINING RECOMMENDATIONS TO OUR PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO FUTURE NEEDS.

IN THE SAME VEIN, I INTEND TO APPOINT A COMMITTEE OF COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVES TO STUDY OUR INDOOR FACILITIES AND PRESENT RECOMMENDATIONS ON FUTURE NEEDS.

# HERITAGE FUND

LAST YEAR I STATED MY INTENTION TO SEE COQUITLAM ESTABLISH ITS OWN HERITAGE FUND. TO THAT END I HAVE REQUESTED OUR MUNICIPAL MANAGER TO DRAW UP A BYLAW TO PROVIDE \$6 MILLION DOLLARS FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO ROADS AND LANE PAVING AND A FURTHER \$1 MILLION DOLLARS TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR DITCH ELIMINATION FROM \$4 MILLION DOLLARS TO \$5 MILLION DOLLARS. WE WILL ADD MONEY TO BOTH FUNDS AS IT BECOMES AVAILABLE IN EARLY MAY AND EARLY DECEMBER EACH YEAR.

### COMMUNITY INFORMATION

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE KEEP OUR RESIDENTS INFORMED ON DISTRICT MATTERS. IT IS MY INTENTION TO CONTACT RATEPAYER GROUPS IN VARIOUS AREAS OF THE COMMUNITY NEXT YEAR TO GIVE THEM AN OPPORTUNITY TO MEET COUNCIL AND DEPARTMENT HEADS TO DISCUSS LOCAL ISSUES.

TO KEEP OUR RESIDENTS INFORMED, WE WILL PUBLISH OUR DISTRICT NEWSLETTER ON A MORE REGULAR BASIS IN 1987. MY OFFICE HAS ALWAYS BEEN OPEN TO RESIDENTS AND WILL CONTINUE TO BE SO IN THE FUTURE.

# ARTS CENTRE - LIBRARY

ALTHOUGH THE FACILITY IS NOT YET IN PLACE, COUNCIL HAS EARMARKED \$250,000 FOR AN ARTS AND CULTURE CENTRE AND WILL LIKELY INCREASE THIS AMOUNT IN 1987. WE LOOK FORWARD TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF THIS NEEDED FACILITY.

GROUND BREAKING FOR A NEW PUBLIC LIBRARY ON POIRIER STREET WILL TAKE PLACE IN 1987 WITH COMPLETION EXPECTED IN 1988.

### GENERAL

DESPITE EVER INCREASING COSTS IN MANY AREAS (THE DISTRICT'S INSURANCE NOW EXCEEDS \$500,000 YEARLY, WHERE PREVIOUSLY IT WAS \$58,000), COUNCIL WILL MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO MAINTAIN COQUITLAM'S POSITION AS ONE OF THE LOWER MAINLAND'S MOST AFFORDABLE PLACES IN WHICH TO LIVE.

WHILE INCREASED SERVICING COSTS MAY HAVE A SLIGHT IMPACT ON TAXATION, I CAN TELL YOU COQUITLAM IS IN A VERY HEALTHY FINANCIAL POSITION.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT THE NEW #2 FIRE STATION, THE NEW LIBRARY AND THE R.C.M.P. BUILDING EXPANSION WILL ALL BE PAID THROUGH OUR LAND RESERVE FUND AND WILL NOT RESULT IN TAX INCREASES.

IN CLOSING, I WISH TO EXTEND MY SINCERE THANKS TO MY HARD WORKING COUNCIL COLLEAGUES AND OUR DEDICATED STAFF FOR THEIR CONTINUED FINE EFFORTS ON BEHALF OF OUR RESIDENTS. TO OUR MANY VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE AND BOARD MEMBERS, I THANK YOU ON BEHALF OF THE DISTRICT.

TO OUR RETIRING ALDERMAN, LEN BEWLEY, I THANK HIM SINCERELY ON BEHALF OF OUR CITIZENS FOR 18 YEARS OF DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVICE.

HE HAS ALWAYS BEEN A GENTLEMAN AND HAS MADE AN OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO HIS COMMUNITY.
