



Therefore be it resolved that Coquitlam, while recognizing the need for more multi-purpose helicopters and the requirement to upgrade the CH-113 fleet, calls upon the federal government to cancel the proposed EH-101 purchase in favour of a more appropriate, affordable solution and to divert the savings to other more pressing needs of Canadians.

She stated that Mundy Park represents the last chunk of natural urban forest within Coquitlam and she strongly urged Council to include a referendum in November's election ballot to ask all Coquitlam voter's whether or not they want a rededication of the entire forested portion of Mundy Park to urban forest.

He cited issues of safety of personnel and security of merchandise and efficiency of operations and customer demands for reasons to go to self-serve.

Mr Dave Rizzo of Como Lake Chevron, also appeared before Council to request that this matter be referred to Public Hearing. He explained to Council that if self-serve stations were allowed in Coquitlam, the oil companies would be willing to spend more money upgrading their service stations. If they were allowed to have self-serve operations at night they could offer a better service to the public and provide more employment.



GREEN WAVE EVALUATION REPORT

Mr. Tim Murphy, Supervisor of Transportation and Traffic, with the use of a slide presentation, presented the initial results of the "Green Wave" traffic signal co-ordination system.

He explained to Council that this system was installed in September 1990 and their studies have shown that there has been an average reduction of 20% in traffic accidents in all corridors and there has been a 30% reduction in the more serious accidents in the corridors. They have calculated that the total cost over ten years for this system is \$1.2 million and the total benefit value will be \$7.6 million with a cost benefit ratio of 6 to 1. This system has reduced accidents, required stops and fuel consumption. There has been a \$6.00 benefit for every \$1.00 invested.

MAYOR SEKORA - ANNUAL BUDGET ADDRESS

Your Mayor and Council have worked very hard to keep the City's 1993 budget increase as low as possible.

I'm sure most of us would prefer that there be no increase at all. But this could only be achieved by cutting services which allow our residents to enjoy a quality lifestyle in a safe and clean environment.

In my opinion, the City budget we will approve tonight is a very responsible budget.

It is a budget with a message.

The message is that we recognize there is a limit to the taxpayers' ability to pay. Not all levels of government have recognized that the public is already overtaxed.

In finalizing our budget last week, we were able to further reduce the 1993 tax rate increase to 4.6 per cent on expenditures. Our provisional budget had the increase at 4.9 per cent.

For the average homeowner, the 4.6 per cent budget increase represents a 1993 tax increase of \$31.

Because the City is now billing solid waste collection separately, residential tax notices will be lower this year than in 1992.

Our new rate of residential taxation is 3.2467 per thousand dollars of assessed value.

For the owner of an average Coquitlam home which is valued at \$217,000, the 4.6 per cent increase represents a 1993 tax increase of \$31, excluding the solid waste component.

According to my information, Coquitlam's taxation level is still the lowest among all Greater Vancouver Regional District municipalities.

Your Mayor and Council have done their best to keep taxes down while at the same time making sure Coquitlam is providing effective and efficient services.

I am pleased to report that Coquitlam is in sound financial shape because of strong fiscal management.

I note from the Auditor's report that debt has come down while our capital assets have increased.

Coquitlam's net worth has gone up by \$15 million in the last year while our debt load excluding sewer and water, has come down to about 8 or 9 per cent. The debt load was about 17 per cent in 1985!!

In the area of services, I am pleased to announce that our ditch elimination program is being accelerated.

There are approximately 33,000 meters of open ditches remaining in southwest Coquitlam. I have asked the Public Works Committee to report on how we can complete the program by the end of 1995.

This would be three years ahead of schedule.

I am well aware that open ditches are a real concern to people who right now are facing quite a wait before their turn comes around.

This is why I have asked for a faster completion.

Since 1983, the year after I became Mayor, we have eliminated some 42,000 meters of ditches at a cost of \$9.6 million. Ditch elimination is financed through a heritage-type fund created from proceeds of municipal land sales.

I am very proud to have served as your Mayor when Coquitlam celebrated its Centennial in 1991 and also when Coquitlam became a City last year.

Coquitlam continues to experience a period of rapid growth and development.

Last year, our City had the highest increase - 82 per cent - in the value of building permits issued in this area and this included Vancouver and Surrey.

Growth is the main reason why it is so important that we solve our transportation problems.

It is very clear that our Provincial Government is in no rush to provide any solutions.

Finance Minister Glen Clark wrote me recently - after I had given him a gentle nudge - to say, and I quote him: "The time for waiting is ending and the time for action is approaching."

I wrote back and told him: "The time for waiting is over and the time for action is now."!!!

The Johnson-Mariner overpass and the widening of Broadway connector to Gaglardi Way must go ahead now. We don't need any more studies or lobbying.

If Glen Clark, Art Charbonneau or Mike Harcourt think I will give up on the transportation issue they had better talk to Rita Johnston.

Rita still says I almost drove her crazy by calling her every day until she awarded Coquitlam the B.C. Summer Games!!

One of the very positive things we have done in the last few years has been to undertake needed new projects at no direct cost to taxpayers.

The latest major project to be constructed in this manner is our new aquatics centre at Guildford and Pinetree Way, which will open this Fall. Capital costs for this project are coming out of surplus funds.

And we hope to announce very soon that an agreement has been signed with a private company which will result in the construction of a four rinks-type ice arena on City-owned land in the Mayfair Industrial Park.

There would be a substantial public use component which would help meet our major recreation need for ice.

Just last month, we officially opened two new parks on Westwood Plateau. These parks will benefit our residents for years to come.

And they were developed at no cost to the taxpayer.

Wesbild Enterprises developed the parks as part of the Westwood Plateau agreement and turned them over to the City. I commend Wesbild for its community involvement.

A new golf course will come on stream this September, also as part of the Westwood Plateau development. And a driving range and pitch and putt golf course are being built in Southwest Coquitlam by private interests.

As I said at the outset, your Mayor and Council recognize that the taxpayer can only pay for so much. We feel we have accomplished a lot without going to the taxpayer.

This year's tax rate reflects a continuing decline and I forecast this will continue.

This is the last year of a three-year collective agreement. I expect fewer demands and a lower settlement than in previous years.

In closing, I thank our City Manager and Department Heads for their efforts in helping us bring in this budget.



DELEGATION - KHEVIN DEVELOPMENT SERVICE LTD. - FORENSIC PSYCHIATRIC INSTITUTE - REBUILD AT COLONY FARMS

Dr. Derek Eaves, Executive Director of the Forensic Psychiatric Services Commission, and Psychiatrist-in-Chief of the Commission, appeared before Council on behalf of the Forensic Psychiatric Institute. He explained that he had asked for this opportunity to appear before Council to inform of the projected redevelopment of the Forensic Psychiatric Institute. In attendance with Dr. Eaves were Mr. Brian May, Project Manager at B.C.B.C., Mr. Chris Schreiber, Manager, Real Estate of B.C.B.C., Mr. Kabel Atwall, Rezoning Consultant to the Project, and Mr. Jim Barnum of C.J.P. Architects, Architect to the Project.

Dr. Eaves gave a brief history of the Institute, advising it was built in 1948 and presently has 151 beds divided into maximum, medium and minimum security areas. He stated that it was grossly inadequate for the functions it is expected to perform and is primarily used to house persons found Not Criminally Responsible by Reason of Mental Disorder and Unfit to Stand Trial, and also has a remand unit for court ordered psychiatric assessments. The B.C. Royal Commission on Health Care and Costs recently stated that the Institute was an unacceptable facility for anyone or any purpose in its present condition and advised that it was imperative to demolish the old facility and rebuild it.

Dr. Eaves stated they wish to develop a facility with state of the art technology that will allow them to address both therapeutic and security requirements, and which will allow patients to be treated and rehabilitated in an atmosphere that promotes re-integration into society and protects the public. Dr. Eaves further advised Council that even with the present building, their safety record has been exemplary with very few escapes in the last five years and in those few escapes, there have been no serious incidents in the local community. The new facility with its security enhancements should guarantee ongoing protection of persons in this community.

Dr. Eaves explained that FPI intends following demolition to rehabilitate and return the present footprint to the Agricultural Land Reserve. Low security patients would continue to work on the land as part of their rehabilitation programming, and tend to cattle owned by the Burquitlam Lions Club. Further with the FPI remaining on its present site this would contribute to the ongoing maintenance of a wildlife habitat in an agricultural area. Dr. Eaves encouraged Council to take part in the Colony Farm Walkabout organized by the Burke Mountain Naturalist Society on June 6, 1993. He went on to advise that in redeveloping the unit, they will be preserving existing trees, planting more, and establishing an architecturally appealing complex.

The Institute presently contributes to the City of Coquitlam a grant in lieu of taxes of only \$60,000 per annum. Taxes are expected to increase to \$660,000 with the new facility. Rebuilding will require 500 person years of employment, much of it to the benefit of the local community. Dr. Eaves also stated that it is estimated that 50 new staff will be hired to operate the facility in addition to an existing payroll of 266 employees.

Dr. Eaves set out the site criteria for a new Institute. They required a central position referent to the major catchment area and expanding population, proximity to the Courts, the airport, acute hospitals and shared hospital and diagnostic services and a specialized workforce, the need for a large area for rebuilding and for farming, and lastly, a degree of separation from residential communities. Following an exhaustive search by an independent consultant, it was determined that Colony Farm best met the criteria.

B.C.B.C. will be making application to the City of Coquitlam for approval of a request to apply to the ALC for permission to rebuild on the site adjacent to the existing Institute. They will also be applying for rezoning of the new footprint and will be relinquishing the present P-1 zoning on the existing site. Approval of the rezoning will allow patients to live in the present building until the new structures are ready.

In addition to the required Public Hearing, Dr. Eaves advised that they are planning a number of Open Houses to invite comment and support.

Mr. K. Johnson, Council of Canadians, appeared to speak to what he described as the single most threatening piece of legislation to Canadian sovereignty, independence, and constitutional integrity in our lifetime, the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). Mr. Johnson outlined what he believed to be the negative impacts of NAFTA for B.C. and Canada. He said that NAFTA constitutes a new, unelected, powerful level of government that will operate without accountability. Mr. Johnson stated that before implementation of NAFTA, Canadian voters should have a say in the matter. Mr. Johnson presented a resolution for Council's consideration.

That the following resolution presented by the Council of Canadians be approved:

Whereas the Canada-U.S. Free Trade Agreement has had a major social and economic impact on Canada and the citizens of Coquitlam and the lower mainland of B.C., and;

Whereas the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) threatens to further limit the powers of governments, including municipal governments, to set their own economic policies, and;

Whereas the citizens of Greater Vancouver have had little access to informed debate on NAFTA in their mainstream media and need to hear more of its effects on their fellow community members, and;

Whereas the people of B.C. wish to have a say in changes of such magnitude in the way Canada is governed, and;

Whereas the government of the U.S. has announced that it will not implement NAFTA unless and until it has attached labour and environmental standards that would substantially change the Agreement, and;

Whereas the government of Canada cannot implement NAFTA until the governments of Mexico and the U.S. have taken satisfactory steps to implement it.

Therefore be it resolved that the Corporation of the City of Coquitlam urges the Federal government in Ottawa to postpone implementation of NAFTA legislation until after the citizens of Coquitlam and the rest of Canada have had the opportunity to fully examine and debate the implications of the North American Free Trade Agreement, and to express their views on whether or not they would accept it.

<u>DELEGATION - B.C. TEL TOWER - MR. ANDREW BRIDGES</u>

Mr. Andrew Bridges appeared on behalf of residents living in the area surrounding Como Lake Village Shopping Centre to express their opposition and concerns regarding the proposed installation of the B.C. Tel Mobility Cellular monopole at Como Lake Village. Mr. Bridges cited health concerns, appearance, the negative impact on property values and safety as the primary reasons why the residents were opposed to the installation of the monopole. Mr. Bridges said that after communication with Mr. I. Waddell's office that they believe that the City does have the ability to affect the location of the monopole. In conclusion, Mr. Bridges asked Council to implement the following:

- . Immediate refusal of a building permit for the construction of a monopole communications tower at the Como Lake Village shopping centre.
- . Immediate moratorium on building permits for construction of similar poles and towers in low density residential neighbourhoods.
- . Immediate direction to the Chairman of the Land Use Committee to prioritize the development and implementation of a bylaw calling for public referendums prior to an issuance of a building permit for these types of structures.
- . Further investigation by the City into site safety issues surrounding the potential for increased primary and secondary lightning strikes at the Como Lake Village shopping centre.

City directed investigation into appropriate compensation packages for property value loses in areas where these type of structures are erected.

Mr. Bridges submitted a copy of a petition of 251 persons advising the owners of Como Lake Village shopping centre that if they allow the installation of the monopole that they will no longer patronize any of the businesses located in the centre.

Mr. Waddell advised Council he was in favour of a regional theatre for the Tri-City area and if the Tri-Cities could get together on a regional theatre proposal he would do his best to get federal funding for same.

Mr. Waddell was thanked for his presentation.

DELEGATION - ANDRE MOLNAR - DEVELOPMENT COST CHARGE BYLAWS

Mr. Molnar appeared before Council to express his concerns regarding the implementation of the Development Cost Charge Bylaws. He stated he did not wish to speak against the Bylaws, but was concerned about implementation date and how it will affect their on-going projects in Coquitlam. He advised Council that the implementation of the Development Cost Charge Bylaws at this time would create a tremendous hardship for two of his projects - 300 units at Lakeside and 200 units at Gateway.

He admitted that he had been aware of the Development Cost Charge Bylaws would be implemented, but did not realize it was going to be happening this quickly. As he will be unable to get working drawings completed between now and implementation date of July 5, 1993, he asked that Council consider Lakeside and Gateway as special hardship cases and exempt them from the Bylaw. He asked that Council give more appropriate notice.

He further explained that he had started one of the projects three years ago and the other project two years ago, and the rules of the game have changed midway. If they had noticed two or three months ahead they could at least have adjusted their plans. He asked that Council extend the deadline for large projects such as his.

Mr. Molnar was advised that the Development Cost Charge Bylaw No. 2503, 1992 was given three readings in December and at that time the Council's intent was known and meetings were held with the developers over the last six months and Council's clear intentions to impose Development Cost Charges were known. The implementation date had originally been intended to be March 1, 1993 and Council had postponed it to July 5, 1993.

All applications for subdivision or building permits received before or on the "Effective Date" and still pending final approval by the City will be assessed development cost charges in accordance with the rates prescribed under the previous bylaw, Development Cost Charge Bylaw No. 847, 1978 (the "Old Bylaw"), provided that:
 - (a) in the case of any subdivision application where the development cost charges are collected at the time of final approval of the subdivision, such final approval has been given and the development cost charges paid in full to the City before July 4, 1994;
 - (b) in the case of any building permit application, such application has been processed to the stage of final approval by the Department of Permits & Licences and the applicant has claimed the permit and paid all fees required to be paid before issuance, including the development cost charges, before July 4, 1994.

- 4. With regard to any subdivision or building permit application which would otherwise be grandfathered under the provisions of section 3, no increase in the number of lots, units of multiple-family housing or square footage of commercial or industrial space of a particular application (other than as required by the City as part of its approval process) will be permitted unless the applicant agrees in writing that any increase in the number of lots on a subdivision plan or the number of multiple-family units or square footage of commercial or industrial space on the underlying plans for a building permit application will be subject to the new development cost charges under the Bylaw. A failure to enter into such a written agreement will result in the City refusing to process the amendments unless a new application is submitted, which application would not be entitled to the protection afforded by section 3.
- 5. With regard to any building permit application for a project for which a development permit has been issued and which would otherwise be grandfathered under the provisions of section 3, no amendments may be made if the same requires the issuance of a development variance permit or an amendment to that development permit. Where the desired amendment requires a development variance permit or amendment to the development permit, the applicant must submit a new building permit application which will not be grandfathered under the "Old Bylaw".



A Regular Meeting of Council of the City of Coquitlam convened in the Council Chambers of the City Hall, 1111 Brunette Avenue, Coquitlam, B.C. on Monday, October 4, 1993 at 7:30 p.m. with all members of Council present save Councillor Reid. REGULAR COUNCIL MINUTES

Mayor Sekora gave a brief verbal report of items dealt with in the Executive Committee Meeting of this date.

MAYOR SEKORA - NEWS RELEASE - MULTI USE GOLF FACILITY IN COOUITLAM

Mayor Sekora announced that a \$3.8 million golf complex consisting of a nine hole, par-three course, a two-tier, 74-stall driving range, two 18-hole minigolf courses, a 5,000 square foot clubhouse with complete food services and a teaching centre is being developed on a currently unused 26.5-acre site in southwest Coquitlam. The Coquitlam Golf Centre Ltd. is being developed by private interests on the former Greater Vancouver Regional District landfill site fronted by Highway 401 and United Boulevard between Brunette Avenue and King Edward Street. Construction began last month and the 9-hole course will be ready for play in 1994 or early 1995.

PRESENTATION - POLYGON - NORM COUTTIE & MICHAEL AUDAIN - CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS ARTS CENTRE

Mr. Michael Audain appeared before Council at this time to present Mayor Sekora with a cheque in the amount of \$50,000 as their first installment of a program in support of the Coquitlam Fine Arts Centre. He advised there would be another \$122,000 to come based on the \$250 contribution per housing unit in the Coquitlam Town Centre development. He advised Council that Polygon supports the arts and they are particularly pleased to make this contribution to Coquitlam. They look forward to a broad community-based program to complete the fundraising necessary for the arts centre.

Mayor Sekora thanked Mr. Audain for this contribution to the arts centre.

PRESENTATION - DEPUTY ENGINEER - AMERICAN PUBLIC WORKS ASSOCIATON ACCREDITATION PROGRAM

With the aid of the overhead projector, the Deputy Engineer gave a brief overview of the American Public Works Association Accreditation Program and advised that the Engineering Dept. are undertaking this self-assessment program. He advised that in 1983, the APWA wanted to develop a series of measurable self-management practices for an accreditation program. The City of Coquitlam will be one of the first to complete this accreditation program.

Coquitlam will review the Department Management practices, collect data, compare with the accepted management practice norms and document proof of compliance and bring all areas into compliance with the APWA standards. He estimates this will take approximately two years to complete.

DELEGATION - POCOMO TEEN CENTRES SOCIETY

Ms. Pat Simpson, 190 Hemlock Dr., Port Coquitlam, appeared before Council to request Council support by way of funding, lands or buildings, to help them develop a teen centre for the youth of Coquitlam. She stated that there is a desperate need for three stand-alone teen centres in the Coquitlam area close to transportation. They further advised they have made application to the federal government as a non-profit society for a tax deductable number. They can apply for a grant from the provincial government as well, however, before they can apply for that grant they need a commitment for other funding. She stated they hope that Council will recognize the need and work with the PoCoMo. Teens Society towards this proposal.

Mr. James Morris, Como Lake High School student, advised Council that there is no place for the kids to go at night. They just hang around the Mac's Milk Store, MacDonald's and Blue Mountain Park. He stated they require some place to go where they can see their friends and not be harassed and threatened.

Ms. L. Leung, a student at Como Lake High School, explained to Council that it was important for the teens to have a place of their own they could go to without feeling harassed or threatened. She stated that self-esteem is important for everyone, but no matter where the teens go they seem to be harassed and told to move on; that they are not wanted in the area.

Ms. Kim Norris, a student at Como Lake High School, stated that she has been an active member of this Society for several months and advised that the teens need a place to meet so they can feel they belong. These centres could also act as resource for teens who need help. The teen centre would be open every day after school and at night. She informed Council that the Maillardville drop-in centre is geared more for the younger children.

Ms. Simpson advised that it was preferable that it was a stand-alone teen centre with no other activities taking place but a teen centre. She stated that they need an endorsement and commitment from Council before they can get more funding from the provincial government.

Ms. Simpson was asked if they had applied for a grant from Coquitlam. She advised that no, she had not. She was then advised that the deadline was the 15th of October. It was also mentioned that probably a member of Council could work along with the Society and the Mayor consider an appointment to that Committee.

Ms. Simpson was thanked for her presentation.

DELEGATION - STEWART COMMUNICATIONS - FIRE LIMITS AREA BYLAW NO. 2422 - SPRINKLERS

Mr. Richard Stewart, 2222 Sorrento Drive, Coquitlam, of Stewart Communications, appeared before Council to speak against passage of Fire Limits Area Bylaw No. 2422.

He urged Council to reject the Bylaw as extremely expensive and not well targeted. A copy of his presentation is on file in the Clerk's Office. He requested that a consultative process take place before any further consideration is given to this Bylaw No. 2422.

Councillor Robinson left the Council Meeting at this time.

DELEGATION - LADNER DOWNS - FIRE LIMITS AREA BYLAW NO. 2422, 1993 - FOR WESBILD HOLDINGS

Ms. D. Satanove of Ladner Downs, Barristers & Solicitors, appeared before Council on behalf of Wesbild Holdings to express their strong opposition to passage of Fire Limits Area Bylaw No. 2422 and to express the concerns of Wesbild Holdings. A copy of Ms. Satanove's presentation is on file in the Clerk's Office.

She requested that a Committee be struck to allow Wesbild and other developers to come forward with further information before the Bylaw is considered for final adoption. She went on to advise that if such a Bylaw is felt necessary by Council, Wesbild is hopeful that the exemptions for Fire Limit Area No. 2 would be also an exemption in Fire Limit Area No. 1 to ensure an even playing field for all developers.

Ms. Satanove was thanked for her presentation.

DELEGATION - G. SANTINI, PARKLANE HOMES - FIRE LIMITS AREA BYLAW NO. 2422

DELEGATION - MR. RICK MCKELVEY - CANADIAN WILDLIFE SERVICE - "REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE OF FRASER RIVER WETLANDS IN COOUITLAM"

Mr. R. McKelvey of the Canadian Wildlife Service appeared before Council to request Council assistance in the preservation of Fraser Delta Wetland Areas in the Coquitlam area. With the use of a slide presentation, Mr. McKelvey illustrated for Council the rapidly disappearing wetland areas along the Fraser River in the Lower Mainland.

He explained that the property of concern to them this evening was 20 acres bordering the Fraser River in the Intrawest lands area. He advised they have spoken to Intrawest on several occasions about the preservation of this 20 acre portion of their development. The Wildlife Service is willing to help offset costs of obtaining these lands. He further stated they are looking for assistance from Planning Department to identify other sensitive areas and come up with a map of the sensitive lands in Coquitlam. It will require the assistance of all levels of government to get involved in order to salvage these valuable Delta wetlands in the Lower Mainland. He advised that what he was seeking was some support from Council to approach Intrawest to work on a proposal to salvage these valuable Delta lands.

DELEGATION - MILLER PARK PARENTS GROUP

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR WHITE SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR PARKER

That representative of the Miller Park Parents Group be allowed to speak to Council at this time.

Ms. Marie DeLaRonde of 740 Covina Court appeared before Council on behalf of the Miller Park Parents Group. She advised that they were concerned about the safety of the children walking to and from Miller Park School by way of Egmont Avenue. She explained that the Montessori program was moved over from Rochester School to Miller Park School and this has added over 100 more students to their school. These children do not live in the neighbourhood and must be driven to and from school. This, along with the regular enrollment in Miller Park School plus the students in Banting School, means a large number of children use these roads. She advised that the open ditching and lack of sidewalks has created a very hazardous situation in the area and the students have to navigate this daily in competition with the traffic on Egmont Street.

The City Engineer with the aid of the overhead projector gave a brief presentation on what they propose to do as a temporary solution. These proposals are:

- 1. Install 'No Parking' signs on Egmont after consulting with the residents of the area.
- 2. Install 'No Parking' signs on Raynor after consulting with the residents of the area.
- 3. Install an asphalt sidewalk on Egmont at a cost of approximately \$8,000.00.

Marie DeLaRonde emphasized that they needed a concrete curb. If there is an asphalt curb and sidewalk people will park over the curb.

Linda Hanley of 909 Robinson St. advised Council that an asphalt sidewalk was definitely not the answer. The ditches need to be filled in and some type of alternative parking for the parents was required. The safety of the children is at risk and this solution cannot be put off.

It was explained to Ms. Hanley and Ms. DeLaRonde that an immediate solution is the asphalt sidewalk, painted crosswalks and ditch elimination will follow next year. They agreed to this proposal as an immediate but interim solution.

MAYOR SEKORA - PRESS RELEASE - ICE ARENA AGREEMENT

Mayor Sekora announced that the City of Coquitlam had negotiated an agreement with Burnaby-based Twin Projects Ltd. for the development of a Four Rinks-type ice facility on city-owned land at 2300 Tappen Avenue. Twin Projects Ltd. will purchase the vacant site for \$1 with Coquitlam having a registered option to repurchase the site and any improvements for \$1 after 30 years. The facility will contain four regulation size ice surfaces, a restaurant, lounge and viewing area, a pro shop and separate change rooms. The facility will have a concrete floor, allowing for year-round use. Twin Projects Ltd. expect the facility to be operational by 1995.

Over the length of the 30-year agreement, Twin Projects will each year provide Coquitlam with 80 hours of prime ice time per week for 25 weeks - a total of 2,000 hours per year - at no cost to Coquitlam. Coquitlam will also be able to purchase up to 20 additional hours of ice time per week at 75% of Twin Projects Ltd.'s posted rates and will have an option on any additional amount of ice time at the current posted hourly rate. At today's dollar value, the unpaid ice time allocated to Coquitlam under the agreement is worth up to \$13 million over 30 years. The ice facility will become another in a growing list of facilities constructed or developed by private interests at no direct cost to Coquitlam taxpayers.



The Inaugural Council Meeting of Council of the City of Coquitlam convened in the Council Chambers of the City Hall, 1111 Brunette Avenue, Coquitlam, B.C. on Monday, December 6, 1993 at 8:00 p.m. with the Honourable Susan C. Antifaev, Provincial Court Judge, officiating at the swearing in ceremony of Council members elect. Present at the Inaugural Meeting were all members of Council save Councillor-elect D. White. Also present were the City Manager, Director of Administrative Services, Planning Director, City Engineer, Director of Leisure and Parks Services, Deputy Director of Permits & Licences, Finance Director, Personnel Director, Fire Chief, Deputy City Clerk and City Clerk.

INAUGURAL MEETING

The prayer was given by Reverend John Davies.

Mayor Sekora called upon the Honourable Susan C. Antifaev to administer the Oath of Office to the Mayor and Councillors-elect as follows:

Mayor Sekora announced that Councillor-elect D. White was unable to be here this evening to participate in the Inaugural Meeting of Council due to a death in the family and that he had already taken his Oath of Office before the City Clerk.

INAUGURAL ADDRESS OF MAYOR SEKORA

THE HONOURABLE JUDGE SUSAN ANTIFAEV, REVEREND DAVIES, COUNCILLORS, SPECIAL GUESTS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

IT IS INDEED AN HONOUR TO ADDRESS YOU TONIGHT AS I COMMENCE MY FIFTH TERM AS MAYOR OF THE CITY OF COQUITLAM. I TRULY APPRECIATE THE CONTINUED SUPPORT OF COQUITLAM'S ELECTORATE.

I GIVE YOU MY COMMITMENT THAT I WILL CONTINUE TO PUT THE INTERESTS OF COQUITLAM RESIDENTS FIRST - AS I HAVE SINCE FIRST BEING ELECTED.

AS I BEGIN MY REMARKS, I WANT TO EXTEND MY PERSONAL CONGRATULATIONS TO BILL MELVILLE AND LOUELLA HOLLINGTON ON THEIR ELECTION TO CITY COUNCIL.

BOTH HAVE SERVED THE COMMUNITY FOR MANY YEARS AND ARE WELL KNOWN FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS.

PLEASE JOIN ME IN A WARM WELCOME FOR OUR NEW MEMBERS OF COUNCIL.

AND TO RETIRING COUNCILLORS EUNICE PARKER AND MAE REID, I SAY THANKS TO EACH OF YOU FOR A JOB WELL DONE. AS THOSE OF US SITTING HERE TONIGHT KNOW FULL WELL, BEING A MEMBER OF COUNCIL MEANS MAKING MANY PERSONAL SACRIFICES.

BOTH EUNICE AND MAE GIVE WILLINGLY OF THEIR TIME AT THE EXPENSE OF THEIR FAMILY LIFE. THEY CAN BE PROUD OF THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS.

I WISH THEM WELL IN THEIR FUTURE ENDEAVOURS.

BEFORE I ANNOUNCE MY 1994 COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS, I WANT TO COMMENT ABOUT SOME IMPORTANT ISSUES CURRENTLY FACING COQUITLAM.

COQUITLAM HAS EXPERIENCED RECORD GROWTH IN RECENT YEARS. THERE IS NO QUESTION THAT THIS GROWTH WILL CONTINUE OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS.

IN FACT, WHILE OUR 1993 BUILDING FIGURES WON'T MATCH THE \$259 MILLION RECORDED LAST YEAR, I PREDICT AN UPSWING IN BUSINESS AND COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION IN 1994.

I BELIEVE COUNCIL HAS MANAGED OUR GROWTH IN A RESPONSIBLE MANNER. A BROADER TAX BASE RESULTING FROM THIS GROWTH HAS CONTRIBUTED TO COQUITLAM'S FINANCIAL WELL BEING.

HAVING AN EXPANDED TAX BASE HAS ALLOWED THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL TO KEEP RESIDENTIAL TAXES LOWER THAN THOSE IN MOST LOWER MAINLAND MUNICIPALITIES.

NEW BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY HAS CREATED MANY LOCAL JOBS AND SPURRED CONSTRUCTION. THE PACIFIC REACH BUSINESS PARK DEVELOPMENT IN SOUTHWEST COQUITLAM WILL PROVIDE UP TO 7,000 NEW JOBS.

COUNCIL AND I HAVE WORKED HARD TO ENSURE SERVICES AND FACILITIES KEEP PACE WITH GROWTH.

THE OPENING OF OUR NEW AQUATIC CENTRE IN THE TOWN CENTRE AREA EARLY NEXT YEAR AND CONSTRUCTION OF A FOUR RINKS-TYPE ICE FACILITY IN THE MAYFAIR INDUSTRIAL PARK WILL HELP MEET OUR NEED FOR MORE SWIMMING AND SKATING FACILITIES.

THE FIRST GOLF COURSE IN COQUITLAM WITH ACCESS TO THE PUBLIC WILL OPEN ON WESTWOOD PLATEAU NEXT SPRING. THIS WILL BE A NINE-HOLE COURSE, WITH GREEN FEES TO BE NO MORE THAN THOSE AT LOWER MAINLAND PUBLIC COURSES.

AN 18-HOLE CHAMPIONSHIP COURSE, A THREE-HOLE TEACHING ACADEMY AND A 66-STALL DRIVING RANGE WILL ALSO OPEN ON WESTWOOD PLATEAU NEXT YEAR.

THERE'S ALSO A NINE-HOLE, PAR THREE COURSE AND DRIVING RANGE BEING DEVELOPED ON THE FORMER GREATER VANCOUVER REGIONAL DISTRICT LANDFILL SITE BETWEEN BRUNETTE AVENUE AND KING EDWARD.

WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE AQUATIC CENTRE, ALL OF THESE PROJECTS ARE BEING DEVELOPED AT LITTLE OR NO COST TO OUR TAXPAYERS BECAUSE WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO CONVINCE PRIVATE INTERESTS TO BUILD THEM IN OUR COMMUNITY.

BUT WE CANNOT BE ALL THINGS TO ALL PEOPLE. IT WOULD BE IMPOSSIBLE FOR US TO MEET ALL THE COMMUNITY NEEDS AT ONCE.

WE HAVE A DUTY TO DEMONSTRATE FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY. THROUGH GOOD MANAGEMENT, OUR DEBT LOAD IS DOWN TO \$8 MILLION FROM OVER \$17 MILLION IN 1984.

BUT THIS DOESN'T MEAN WE CAN GO ON A SPENDING SPREE. WE RECOGNIZE THE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL SENIORS AND TEEN FACILITIES AND WE WILL ADDRESS THEM IN OUR UPCOMING 1994 BUDGET DELIBERATIONS.

IN MY OPINION, THE OBJECTIVE OF OUR BUDGET DELIBERATIONS WILL BE TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE GOOD SERVICES AT THE LOWEST POSSIBLE COST TO OUR TAXPAYERS. LAST YEAR, WE WERE ABLE TO HOLD THE TAX INCREASE TO JUST 4.6 PER CENT.

THE NEED FOR AN ARTS AND CULTURAL CENTRE MUST BE ADDRESSED. BUT WE SIMPLY CANNOT BUILD THE PROPOSED \$16 MILLION ARTS CENTRE ON OUR OWN AS A SINGLE PROJECT. AT LEAST NOT FOR SOME TIME.

WITH THIS IN MIND, ONE OF THE FIRST THINGS I DID ON BEING RE-ELECTED WAS TO WRITE TO PORT COQUITLAM MAYOR LEN TRABOULAY AND PORT MOODY'S MAYOR-ELECT, JOHN NORTHEY, ASKING THEM TO MEET WITH ME TO DISCUSS THE NEED FOR A REGIONAL ARTS CENTRE.

I AGREE WITH THOSE WHO SAY WE NEED MORE REGIONAL COOPERATION.

AND I FULLY SUPPORT THE CONCEPT OF THE CITY OF COQUITLAM, DOUGLAS COLLEGE AND SCHOOL DISTRICT 43 SHARING NEW FACILITIES IN THE TOWN CENTRE.

SHARED FACILITIES MAKES A LOT OF SENSE IN THIS REGARD BECAUSE

- DOUGLAS COLLEGE IS PLANNING A NEW CAMPUS ON PINETREE WAY TO INITIALLY SERVE 2,000 FULL-TIME STUDENTS;
- SCHOOL DISTRICT 43 NEEDS TO BUILD A 1,200-STUDENT HIGH SCHOOL IN THE TOWN CENTRE AREA;
- AND THE CITY IS PLANNING MORE RECREATIONAL FACILITIES FOR OUR COMMUNITY.

WE CAN REALIZE SUBSTANTIAL SAVINGS BY SHARING EXISTING FACILITIES SUCH AS PLAYING FIELDS, AND BY SHARING THE COSTS OF BUILDING AND OPERATING NEW FACILITIES.

THE CITY, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE COLLEGE HAVE AGREED UPON A STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES WHICH PROVIDES THE FRAMEWORK FOR THE NEGOTIATION OF SUBSEQUENT FACILITY SHARING AGREEMENTS.

REDUCING COSTLY DUPLICATIONS MAKES SENSE. I BELIEVE WE WILL SOON SEE A MOVE TOWARD EVEN MORE SHARING OF SERVICES AND FACILITIES.

THIS BRINGS ME TO THE NUMBER ONE ISSUE IN THE ENTIRE NORTHEAST SECTOR: TRANSPORTATION.

DURING MY ELECTION CAMPAIGN, I INDICATED I INTEND TO TAKE A HARD LINE WITH THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT WITH REGARD TO TRANSPORTATION.

OURS IS THE WORST TRANSPORTATION MESS IN THE ENTIRE PROVINCE

THEREFORE, I WILL BE ASKING COUNCIL TO REQUIRE THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT TO SIGN A PERFORMANCE BOND GUARANTEEING PROFITS FROM CROWN LAND SALES WILL BE SPENT ON AREA TRANSPORTATION.

WE DON'T WANT A REPEAT OF THE WESTWOOD PLATEAU LANDS SALE WHEN THE GOVERNMENT PUT THE PROFITS INTO GENERAL REVENUE AND THEN BACKED OUT OF A PROMISE TO PROVIDE ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION TO OUR AREA.

SINCE THE PROVINCE OWNS MORE THAN ONE BILLION DOLLARS WORTH OF DEVELOPABLE LAND IN COQUITLAM, A FREEZE ON GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT OF THESE LANDS WOULD ALSO BE EFFECTIVE.

I AM PREPARED TO TABLE SUCH A MOTION AND TO ENFORCE THE FREEZE FOR AS LONG AS IT TAKES.

THE REASON I AM PREPARED TO DO SO IS BECAUSE THIS GOVERNMENT HAS NO CONSCIENCE WHEN IT COMES TO HONOURING COMMITMENTS.

AND I INVITE OUR SURROUNDING MUNICIPALITIES TO JOIN US IN GETTING OUR MESSAGE THROUGH.

COMMUTER RAIL IS NO SOLUTION TO OUR PROBLEMS. WE NEED MUCH MORE THAN COMMUTER RAIL. WE NEED RAPID TRANSIT, MUCH BETTER BUS SERVICE AND BETTER ROADS, HIGHWAYS AND BRIDGES.

IT'S TIME WE BANDED TOGETHER AND LET THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT KNOW IT CANNOT CONTINUE TO IGNORE OUR TRANSPORTATION NEEDS.

I SUGGEST THAT WE HAVE A BETTER CHANCE TO RECEIVE TRANSPORTATION FUNDING ASSISTANCE FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

WE COULD BE AMONG THE FIRST MUNICIPALITIES IN LINE FOR ASSISTANCE THROUGH THE NEW FEDERAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM. I AM GOING TO RECOMMEND COUNCIL CONSIDER A ROAD REBUILDING AND UPGRADING PROGRAM WHICH WOULD QUALIFY FOR FEDERAL FUNDING.

WE COULD REPAIR OUR WORN OUT ROADS AND IMPROVE THE TRANSPORTATION CAPABILITY OF OTHERS, WITH OUR DEVELOPMENT COST CHARGES AND FEDERAL FUNDING HELPING PAY.

WE MUST ALSO LOOK AHEAD TO ENSURING COQUITLAM REMAINS A SAFE PLACE IN WHICH TO LIVE AND WORK OUR POLICE AND FIRE SERVICES MUST BE MAINTAINED AT THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE LEVELS.

I ALSO BELIEVE WE NEED TO TAKE A VERY SERIOUS LOOK AT OUR NEED FOR A NEW PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING.

COMMUNITY POLICING HAS PROVED VERY EFFECTIVE IN AREAS SUCH AS NEW WESTMINSTER. I INTEND TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITY OF INTRODUCING THIS TYPE OF HANDS ON POLICING TO COQUITLAM.

ON ANOTHER TOPIC, WE HAVE ELIMINATED ANOTHER 8,000 METRES OF DITCHES FRONTING CLOSE TO 600 PROPERTIES IN 1993 AT A COST OF \$2.6 MILLION.

THIS BRINGS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF DITCHES ELIMINATED TO DATE TO ABOUT 45,000 METRES.

MUCH OF THE RECENT WORK HAS BEEN DONE IN SOUTHWEST COQUITLAM, WHERE MANY OPEN DITCHES ARE TO BE FOUND.

OUR DITCH ELIMINATION PROGRAM, FINANCED THROUGH A HERITAGE-TYPE FUND CREATED FROM THE PROCEEDS OF MUNICIPAL LAND SALES, BEGAN IN 1983 AND WILL BE COMPLETED BY THE END OF 1995.

AT THE SAME TIME, WE HAVE MUCH MORE TO DO IN PROVIDING RESIDENTS OF NORTHEAST COQUITLAM WITH IMPROVED SERVICES AND FACILITIES, INCLUDING A TWO ACRE PARK AT OXFORD AND DAVID AVENUES.

IN LINE WITH OUR COMMITMENT TO OPEN GOVERNMENT, WE WILL CONTINUE TO HOLD ROUND TABLE DISCUSSIONS REGARDING PARKS AND OTHER COMMUNITY PROJECTS.

I ALSO INTEND TO CONTINUE THE PRACTICE OF TAKING COUNCIL MEMBERS AND DEPARTMENT HEADS TO VARIOUS AREAS OF THE COMMUNITY. THIS CONCEPT HAS BEEN WELL RECEIVED AND GIVES RESIDENTS AN OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE THEIR VIEWS KNOWN OUTSIDE CITY HALL.

IF AN AREA DOES NOT HAVE A RATEPAYERS GROUP WE WILL SCHEDULE A MEETING IN AN AREA SCHOOL.

COUNCIL HEARS DELEGATIONS AT OUR REGULAR TWICE MONTHLY MEETINGS AND RECEIVES ADDITIONAL INPUT BY HOLDING PUBLIC HEARINGS. THESE HEARINGS ON REZONING APPLICATIONS AND OTHER MATTERS ARE ADVERTISED IN ADVANCE IN OUR COMMUNITY NEWSPAPERS.

MOST OF OUR COMMITTEE MEETINGS ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

YOU CAN OBTAIN THE DATES AND TIMES OF THESE MEETINGS BY CONTACTING CITY HALL AT 664-1410.

AS LONG AS I AM IN OFFICE I WILL ENSURE THAT CITY HALL CONTINUES TO BE ACCESSIBLE TO ALL COQUITLAM RESIDENTS.

TO THIS END, I CAN BE REACHED DAILY AT CITY HALL ON MY DIRECT LINE - 664-1401.

JUST BEFORE I ANNOUNCE MY COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS, I WANT TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO THANK CITY MANAGER NORM COOK, DEPARTMENT HEADS AND THEIR STAFFS FOR A JOB WELL DONE THIS PAST YEAR.

DELEGATION - EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS - BOB LEE

Mr. Bob Lee, Assistant City Engineer and Emergency Preparedness Co-ordinator for the City of Coquitlam, gave a brief slide presentation to Council on Earthquake Preparedness. He showed Council examples of what can happen in earthquakes with pictures from the San Francisco earthquake and various other earthquakes. He briefly went over the recent Exercise Thunderbird Operation that was a provincial governmnt exercise and Coquitlam participated in same. He advised Council that this was a very useful exercise and pointed out very glaring deficiencies in the provincial plan as well as in our own preparations.

He stated that it showed that the communication system was totally inadequate and because of the volume of traffic, Coquitlam was unable to communicate with the neighbouring municipalities. As well, the various PFRC substations did not seem to understand their particular roles and didn't communicate with one another. The Coquitlam reports and requests were never acted on nor was Coquitlam mentioned in any of their province's reports. Thirdly, the Water and Sewer Districts were not invited to participate in the exercise and the province did not seem to understand the relationship between the municipalities and GVRD in regard to water and sewer problems if there was a real disaster. Fourthly, the traffic problems reported by Coquitlam were never dealt with effectively by the provincial authorities.

In conclusion, Mr. Lee stated that he thought this Exercise Thunderbird was a very successful exercise provided the lessons learned are acted on.
