

#### Other matters

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- A. The Municipal Manager advised that with the approval of the Committee, the format of reports to Council would follow that of 1976 reports; without recording of formal resolutions, i.e. who moved or who seconded motions. However, where opposition to the recommendation was voiced, the name of the Committee member so opposed would be recorded.
- B. In reference to the copy letter, dated December 22, 1976, to the Director of the S.P.C.A. from Mrs. Vicki Beck (copy attached), the Municipal Manager informed the Committee that he had attempted, without success, to obtain a copy of the reply, if any, which had been sent by the S.P.C.A. #### REPORT TO COUNCIL

A meeting of the Building and Protection Committee was held on January 26th 1977 at 8:00 p.m. in the Engineering Committee Room at the Municipal Hall. The following were in attendance:

The purpose of the meeting was to consider further changes in arrangements with Emergency Health Services Commission.

Committee members had received beforehand the attached report from the Deputy Fire Chief dated January 21, 1977. Mr. Baxter, Zone Co-ordinator of the Emergency Health Services Commission (E.H.S.C.) had also received a copy of the said report.

The Municipal Manager advised the Committee that at a recent meeting between staff and Mr. Baxter, it became apparent E.H.S.C. would be substantially changing the arrangement, thought by staff to have been made in April of 1976. Since most recorded communications with staff between April 1976 to date, attempting to clarify the arrangements, had been verbal and need for final clarification long outstanding, Mr. Baxter had been invited to the meeting to ensure E.H.S.C's position was fully put to the Committee.

Mr. Baxter stated that the Deputy Chief's report was good indicating that as matters and proposals as to E.H.S.C's position were fairly put forward. Mr. Baxter advised that E.H.S.C. was quite capable of providing ambulance service to Coquitlam without the need to provide two vehicles to Coquitlam's Fire Department; he would be prepared to withdraw these vehicles if that was the Council's wish.

Mr. Baxter went on to advise that E.H.S.C. would be desirous of making arrangements for the continued operation of one of its vehicles by the Fire Department; such vehicle being restricted only to the service traditionally provided by this District's Fire Department. If the District agreed to do so, E.H.S.C. would be provided with highly desirable backup for its ambulance service.

Mr. Baxter held out to the District the proposal set forth in Attachment "C" modified as wording and deletions therein show, with the exception of clause number 2 thereof which was to specify a definite limited period. Following advice that municipal budgets would be finalized on May 15, 1977, Mr. Baxter then said that a four month period from this date would be acceptable to E.H.S.C. Mr. Baxter also noted that any vehicle E.H.S.C. provided on loan to the District by E.H.S.C., would be marked "Ambulance" and painted in colours which E.H.S.C. chose.

Mr. Baxter did advise that according to his information, E.H.S.C. did not pay as much as \$10,800.00 for Unit No. 443 and hence the cost to the District for repurchase could well be somewhat lower; i.e. their cost less allowance provision for depreciation.

Building and Protection Committee Meeting January 26, 1977 at 8:00 p.m.

On departure of Mr. Baxter, the Committee considered the alternatives.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

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- 1. That the District accept the offer of E.H.S.C. as set forth on Attachment "C" attached to the Deputy Fire Chief's report dated January 21, 1977 modified as to wording and deletions as shown, it being specifically understood that the period offered by E.H.S.C. in Clause No. 2 is for an additional four months ending May 26th 1977.
- 2. That the District accept the offer by E.H.S.C. to repurchase Unit No. 443 with auxilliary equipment at the cost to E.H.S.C. less depreciation and make due provision for such repurchase in its budget when the price is obtained from E.H.S.C. such repurchase to be completed by May 26th 1977.
- 3. That these recommendations be communicated to Greater Vancouver Council of Firefighters' Trade Unions on behalf of the District of Coquitlam Firefighters' Union, Local 1782, I.A.F.F. for information.

Mr. Castillou presented to the meeting copies of two draft by-laws related to the discharge of silt into the Coquitlam River and copies of the draft by-laws are attached to these minutes.

Mr. Castillou also made a presentation to the meeting and a copy of the Solicitor's remarks are attached to these minutes as well.

Mr. Phillips advised that in his opinion the Municipality is taking action too quickly and should await the results of the water management study presently underway and the results of which are expected to be published in April.

As well, Mr. Phillips advised that should the provisions of a new by-law effectively close down the operations of the pit, the Municipality stands to lose an expected revenue of \$600,000 in 1977.

Mr. Phillips made reference to two letters received recently from the Fish and Wildlife Branch and from the Department of the Environment and copies of these letters are attached to these minutes.

The meeting was advised that there is great difficulty in proving the actual source of pollutants and separating the pollutants which come from old workings to those which come from existing workings.

Ald. Robinson inquired if the siltation problem arose as a result of a washing process and Mr. Phillips stated that this was not the case as no washing of gravel is done in any of the pits in this area.

Ald. Robinson also inquired as to whether or not it was possible to take a reading on water channels above pits and at the point of entry into the river and Mr. Phillips stated that water channels are affected by more than just the actual area being worked and therefore this would not be feasible.

# Recommendations

The members of the Committees present felt in view of the small attendance by members of Council at this meeting and in view of the importance of this matter, they were not prepared at this time to make a recommendation on the course of action to be followed. Further consideration of this matter was therefore tabled for discussion by a Committee of the Whole of Council.

  - reflect projected 1977 volunteer compensation based upon 1976 experience and latest known rates applicable.
- b) The Committee sought clarification as to reference to "Workers' Compensation - Volunteers" and, if as indicated that expense related to "Insurance Cover - Volunteers" the reference in budget might so indicate.

Turnings to "Items worthy of Consideration" report of the Fire Chief, dated February 8 1977, the Committee resolved to partake of a tour of certain Fire Halls on February 24th 1977. Having so resolved, the Committee went on to discuss with the Chief Officers the merits of each item in the said February 8th Fire Chief's report and noted as follows:-

- a) repurchase of Unit No. 443, from E.H.S.C. should be incorporated;
- b) that as presented, the requests shown amounted to \$586,254.00 of expenditures higher than the provisional budget and while there is a great deal of merit in the proposals, significant modification could be expected;



Mr. Cunnings left the meeting at this point - 8:20 p.m.

The meeting adjourned temporarily to meet jointly with the C.U.P.E. Grievance and Bargaining Committee.

At 8:55 p.m. the meeting continued with all Members of Council present earlier still in attendance as were B.H. Falcon and R.A. LeClair.

# Item No. 1 - By-law Provisions; Temporary Building Permits

The Committee noted that -

- a) the recommendations contained in the Municipal Manager's March 11, 1977 report would not have prevented the issuance of a temporary building permit to Jack Cewe Limited and the subsequent objections of the neighbour; and
- b) allowance for successive renewals of a permit for a temporary building as was recommended, which apparently might be achieved as indicated in the Chief Building Inspector's report, was surely to render applying for a normal building permit pointless.

It was therefore concluded that greater direct Council discretion should prevail.

#### Your Committee recommends:

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that the District's by-laws be amended such

that any application for temporary building permits must be referred to Council who will in its discretion either grant or deny the permit applied for after considering the variation proposed by the applicant from any provisions of either the Building By-law or Zoning By-law as same would apply to permanent buildings.

The Municipal Manager advised that the above recommendation would be discussed with the Municipal Solicitor at an early date.

#### Item No. 2 - Review of 1977 Fire Department Budget

The Committee had at its February 17th meeting, been introduced to the proposals for 1977 Annual Budget. Between that date and this, Committee members had an opportunity to make a tour of Fire Halls and thereby acquaint themselves with needs.

It was noted that 1976 actual expenditure figures were not yet at hand and also that no provision for salary and wage adjustments had been made for 1977 within the 1977 Protective Services Budget.

Chief Falcon advised that modification to budget provisions indicated for the new Assistant Chief position, was required for two reasons:-

- 1. the revised rates recommended by the Joint Committee this evening; and
- 2. since the position would likely not be filled for the whole of 1977.

Mayor Tonn observed that Council as a Whole, sitting as Finance Committee, would very shortly be reviewing this budget in light of actual 1976 expenditures as well as in the face of overall municipal requirements. Mayor Tonn therefore made a proposal which became the Committee's recommendation.

Deemed to be premature for consideration at this time were the following items:-

#### A. No. 6 Fire Hall

- Deferred until firm commitment is received from Province in respect to development of Riverview lands.

#### B. Additions to No. 1 Fire Hall

- Consideration should be given to incorporation within new proposed No. 3 Fire Hall.

#### C. Replacement of Unit 431

- Deferred to 1978.

# D. Equipment Repair Shop at No. 1 Fire Hall

- Consideration should be given for incorporation into new proposed No. 3 Fire Hall.

#### E. Elevating Platform

- A major expenditure in respect to which the Committee instructsy the Chief to obtain relative cost data for greater reach.

#### Item 1 - Penalty for Building without Building Permit

The Committee was informed that the Building Inspector estimated an incidence of two to three starts per month without building permits and that the vast majority of such were by "do-it-yourselfers" in minor construction. Hence, the discretion as to the course to be taken on such infractions; whether imposition of double the fee penalty or proceeding through courts was seen, as a practical matter, being delegated to the Building Inspector.

The Committee noted the Solicitor saw nothing in the Building Code which required Council to exercise the option as to route to penalty.

Your Committee recommends the following Building By-law amendments:

- to delete Sub-section 1.9.8. of Building By-law No. 73, 1972 (which specifies a penalty of double the normal fee) and incorporate it instead under the "Penalty" Section of the By-law (Section 1.17);
- 2. to add a clause under the "Penalty" section of the By-law, specifically stating that the penalty for commencing construction before obtaining a building permit shall be either double the normal permit fee or whatever penalty the Courts shall decide. Further, that the choice of which procedure to select shall be at the option of the authority having jurisdiction;

- 3. to add a clause to the By-law, making it an offence for failing to pay any fine imposed by the Courts for any violations of the Building By-law. (The City of Vancouver, for example, has such a clause); and
- 4. to amend Sub-Section 1.9.8 to increase the maximum penalty from \$250 to \$500. (For the maximum double permit fee to correspond to the maximum fine under the Summary Convictions Act).

#### Item 2(a) - New Home Warranty Program of British Columbia

The Committee recalled that its February 17th 1977 recommendation favouring the display on the Building Department counter had been approved by Council. Committee members then expressed and now express general favour in regard to the availability of protection to new home buyers.

The Committee indicated that the latest suggestion in the attached March 23rd letter; to make membership of - all new home - builders with the New Home Warranty Program mandatory as a condition precedent to obtaining a building permit, required further review.

Accordingly, the Committee requested staff to obtain further information such as

- (a) from the proposers, Pacific New Home Services Inc., full particulars and requirements of the program as to admission and continued membership of builders in the program;
- (b) a review and comments on the proposal by the District's Legal and Building Departments; and
- (c) comments on the proposal by the Chamber of Commerce and the Greater Vancouver Real Estate Board.

# Item 2(b) - No. 3 Fire Hall Site Status and Suitability

The Chief reported verbally as follows:-

- 1. That following consultation with the Planning Director, the location of the existing No. 3 Fire Hall was in a relatively good location to serve the future Coquitlam Town Centre Area; and
- 2. that Mr. R.C. Mann of Thomson Berwick Pratt & Partners had also indicated the present No. 3 Fire Hall location was quite suitable in relation to the future Town Centre;
- 3. that according to By-law No. 14, being District of Coquitlam Parks Dedication By-law, the present site upon which No. 3 Fire Hall was located was indeed dedicated as "parkland" and commonly referred to as Glen Park;
- 4. that No. 3 Fire Hall built years prior to the adoption of said By-law No. 14 and it had always been considered that the 70ft. by 120ft. area of Glen Park shown on rough "Plan A" attached, was allocated to Fire Hall use;
- 5. that he was of the opinion that the entire portion of parkland lyingg south of Lincoln Avenue running through Glen Park (see attached By-law Plan 39359) was adequate to house a major Fire Hall; and
- 6. that he had discussed a proposal to remove the park dedication in favour of Fire Hall use, with the Parks and Recreation Director who voiced no objections to such proposal.

#### Item No. 1: Memorandum of Agreement dated April 27, 1977

The noted memorandum and transmitting memorandum of the Personnel Director dated April 28, 1977 (copy attached) had been pre circulated.

# Your Committee recommends

Council approves the Memorandum of Agreement dated April 27, 1977 containing the terms and conditions of the 1976 Collective Agreement between the District of Coquitlam and the Greater Vancouver Council of Firefighters Trade Unions acting on behalf of the District of Coquitlam Firefighters Union, Local 1782 and authorizes the Mayor and the Municipal Clerk to sign and affix the Corporate Seal to the 1976 Collective Agreement.

Item No. 2: Mandate for District's Negotiators for Collective Bargaining with Firefighters

It was explained that guidelines should be provided the negotiators; Mr. Bob Moffat of the G.V.R.D. Labour Relations Department; Mr. F. Klewchuk, Personnel Director and Mr. R. Gidlof, Deputy Fire Chief, in order that 1977 negotiations be kept within expectations of the Committee and Council.

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# Your Committee Recommends

That the mandate of the District's representatives in 1977 Firefighters Collective Agreement negotiators be to negotiate a settlement provided that

- it is patterned after the relative cost of the 1977 Vancouver settlement, and
- b) it is within the 6% Anti-Inflation Board guideline for 1977.

# Item No. 3(a): Industrial First Aid Certificate Pay Premiums for Firefighters

The Personnel Director drew attention to a demand by the Firefighters for an updating of the amount paid as a premium to Firefighters possessing Industrial First Aid Certificates, claiming that the present rate of \$2,000 no longer represented the equivalent of 4 shifts off given the Varouver Firefighters and certain other Firefighters as a compensation and claimed to be the basis for setting up the \$2,000 rate initially.

Associated with the matter of premium pay, Mr. Klewchuk requested that the Committee give consideration to whether or not the present limit of 32 (minimum number of Firefighters to receive the premium in Article 5.3) should be raised.

The Committee was advised that the minimum of 32 comprised approximately 50% of all Firefighters in Coquitlam, somewhat higher than most other G.V.R.D. jurisdictions. Additionally, it was pointed out that the Department was at liberty to assign certificate holders to the fire stations housing inhalator and emergency transportation vehicles.

The Committee then generally agreed that there was no requirement to change the present minimum of 32 to receive the Industrial First Aid pay premium.

Item No. 3(b): Provision of Fire Dispatcher Service for Unorganized (Ioco) Area

Ald. Gregory reported having been approached by Mrs. V. Barrett, Electoral Area Representative, enquiring of the possibility of obtaining Fire Dispatcher Service out of the District's #1 Fire Hall in a way similar to that supplied to Port Coquitlam by the District.

The Chief advised the Committee that although he had not been given details of likely fire call incidence, he did not anticipate that the volume would be significant. The Committee authorized the Chief to discuss with Mrs. Barrett assistance which could be provided by the District and, if practical, work out an arrangement to be presented by the Chief, in writing, to this Committee for consideration.

# Item 1 - Client/Architect Agreement - No. 5 Fire Hall

At its June 8th meeting, the Committee had considered a form of Client/Architect Agreement, appended to its said report, inIlighthofof comments contained in a memorandum dated June 8th received from the Legal Department which point out significant differences between the Standard form of Agreement between Client/Architect, of the No. 4 Fire Hall and that now proposed for the No. 5 Fire Hall.

As a result of those deliberations, the Committee directed that a meeting be arranged with Mr. G.D. Wylie, Architect, hence the object of this meeting.

Mr. Wylie was in attendance.

The Committee reviewed the differences between the two above noted forms of agreement with Mr. Wylie and after discussion to the satisfaction of the Committee thereon, requested to be advised by the Architect of a maximum fee for basic professional services and all additional services all expressed as one percentage only of the cost of the new work, rather than the several percentages indicated in the contract for the No. 5 Fire Hall.

Mr. Wylie indicated that he would be prepared to enter into a Client/Architect Agreement with the municipality on the basis of a maximum fee for basic professional services and all additional services all expressed as têm percent (10%) of the cost of the new work.
